Position Summary

Key Responsibilities

- Review and monitor financial statements, budget reports, cash flow information, and other financial materials presented to the Board.
- Help board members understand MISN’s financial position, financial performance, and key fiscal considerations.
- Support the annual budgeting process and longer-term financial planning.
- Chair or actively participate in the Finance Committee, as determined by the Board.
- Promote appropriate financial controls, policies, and oversight practices.
- Review annual audit materials and related financial documentation with organizational leadership and the Board.
- Present clear and concise financial updates at regular Board meetings.
- Support resource development, fundraising, and strategies that strengthen MISN’s sustainability.
- Fulfill the fiduciary and governance responsibilities expected by all members of the MISN Board of Directors.

Preferred Qualifications

- Professional experience in accounting, finance, banking, auditing, nonprofit management, or related fields.
- Ability to read and interpret financial statements, budgets, and audit information.
- Commitment to nonprofit governance, ethical stewardship, and community service.
- Strategic thinking, sound judgment, and a collaborative leadership style.
- Strong communication skills and the ability to explain financial information clearly to non-financial audiences.
- Prior board or committee experience is helpful but not required.

Time Commitment

- Attend Board of Directors meetings held every two months, approximately six meetings per year.
- Participate in Finance Committee meetings as needed.

- Review financial statements, budgets, and board materials in advance of meetings.
- Provide financial leadership and guidance in support of MISN's mission and long-term sustainability.
- Serve as an advocate and ambassador for MISN in the community.
