Treasurer's Update, Gretchen Cleveland, Treasurer -7 min

Budget Update—

- O Request for any receipts/reimbursement requests are submitted no later than June 20th. This allows us to close the year and file the taxes.
- o Revenue:
 - Profit from yearbook sales is just under \$600
 - Down about \$750 in flower basket sales this year
 - Skate Night and Dine Out revenue came in
 - Made about \$800 more in interest from Umpqua than we did from STCU
- o Expenses:
 - Extracurricular: LEGO Robotics, Art After School, and Drama Club
- o Biggest generator and expense, CARNIVAL is coming up this month
- Running a little under with expected revenue but have also been very conservative with our expenses
- Ana Ehrler:
 - Bylaws require budget approval at June meeting in order to start of school activities
 - o Proposed budget will include DEI expenses
 - o Wildcat Walk will determine a clearer budget
 - Wildcat Walk Survey results indicated about 65% for every other year, 35% for every year
 - O Proposed budget will be posted to website and will go out before the next meeting
 - o Emily Allen asks about "administrative" line item: includes things like Zoom membership, website fees, etc.

Information Items

• **DEI Subcommittee**- Jeff Klein (5 min)

- Teacher Community Connection Committee conclusion meeting was great.
- Created a calendar based on character traits paired with a learning focus based on parts of the community that not everyone is always aware of.
- Budget request for next year to provide supplies for various projects and activities: \$2000
- \$500 not used from this year could potentially be rolled over into next year
- Travelling library to go between classes
- Spring Extracurriculars—Jeff Klein (10 min)
 - Just had a great planning meeting before this meeting.
 - Diana Costa will be co-chair for the 2025-26 school year
 - Still searching for a second co-chair
 - Jeff stepping down from chair but will still be involved
 - Thanks to everyone who stepped up to be on the committee this year
 - Great partnerships with the teachers
 - Still needing activity leaders and strong volunteer support
 - Ana asks about parent support and Jeff says overall there's been ok turnout, but spring has tapered a bit.
 - School Engagement Coordinator Crystal Medina adds that as a school we have about 75% engagement and reaching out to those who are not involved could bring in more volunteers. Notes that a large number of those who are not involved are kinder students. Survey only counts a child once rather than per activity.
 - Kelli Wright asks about a Kindergarten Roundup for 2025-26
- CAC Report—Stephanee N. and Kelli W. (5 min)
 - April: School board discussed possibility of a trade high school; new high school American history curriculum is Time Immemorial, state looking to make budget cuts, bulk of meeting about state testing; hoping to put out student climate and attribute survey this spring; emphasized that students should not be anxious about state testing

- May: budget update looking at 15 million (2.5% of the budget) in cuts for next academic year; trying to protect elementary class sizes; speaker shared about a senior success (life skills/prep) course that has been piloted and will be expanded next year to have all 9th and 12th graders take the course
- Volunteer Coordinator Needs—Ana Ehrler (6 min)
 - Volunteers **must** sign in with the office and must have district clearance
 - There is now a volunteer handbook that's been passed to Mr. Syron.
 - Hoping to have a volunteer orientation this fall
 - David Allen worries the volunteer orientation could create another barrier that could deter people from volunteering. Ana notes that it would not be a mandatory event but that registering with the district is required.
 - Bre Orcasitas suggests having volunteer sign ups based on grade level to make things more balanced.

• Green Club Updates- Bre Orcasitas (5 min)

- 4 parents and Amanda Helms now leading the club
- Earth Day events were great
- Bluff Trail Walk went well (about 10 families)
 - · Included plant identification info and wildfire information
- Pollinator Garden was planted by 3rd and 4th grade classes and was planted in ground last week along the west side of the school property
- Flower Planter extracurricular coming up May 20th and 22nd
- Hoping to have an after school Green Club meeting to discuss ways to make the school greener. Goal is to give the kids ownership and connect with leadership.
- Hoping to make our big events greener by tying in a Green Club member with event planners. Ana volunteers as a contact to help connect with city for some help with that.
- Kelli Wright asks for all committee chairs to pass along info so she can add them to our Wilson PTG social media
