Did you know that the fashion industry is the second largest polluter behind the oil and gas industry? Making textiles is a dirty business and it keeps on growing due to fast fashion trends. The fast fashion industry currently produces twice as much as in the year 2000, and is projected to increase from today's level another 63% by 2030. The fashion industry is already responsible for 20% of the world's waste water. Beyond that, it takes 2,700 liters of water to make just one t-shirt. To make matters worse, approximately 85% of used textiles are thrown in the garbage rather than being donated, reused, or recycled. Let's try to avoid contributing to throw-away culture.

Here are some solutions:

- 1. Donate clothes to thrift stores, or create hand-me-down clothing groups for kids' clothes.
- 2. Turn stained clothing into rags, or repurpose the fabric.
- 3. Focus on quality, not quantity. Look for companies that offer guarantees.
- 4. Buy what suits your style rather than trying to keep up with fast fashion.

5. Remember, new doesn't always mean better. <u>Patagonia Worn Wear</u>, <u>The North Face Renewed</u>, and Hanna Anderson's <u>Hanna-me-downs</u> have "like-new" options and local resale shops like Once Upon a Child have a huge selection to choose from. It's a great way to spend less while wasting less.
