## Discussion Items

- STCU Updates (Dave Gilbert): We move to add Dave Gilbert (Treasurer) and Kendra Chapman (President), registering either together or separately, to the Wilson PTG bank account at STCU. As soon as the first of these two people is added to the account, anyone from past years that is still remaining on the account should be removed. We grant full banking privileges, together or separately, to Dave Gilbert and/or Kendra Chapman effective immediately. Motioned by Treasurer, Dave Gilbert. Alexis Padgham seconds. All are in favor.
- 2023-24 Directory (Ana Erhler): We'd like more sponsors. Watch for a digital form. Sponsorships due by end of September with the aim to publish in October.
- Carnival (Josie Dix): Thanks to her dedicated committee! Next year will have security and a single point of entry.
- Classroom Funds (Tonja Brown): After much discussion, it was motioned by Erika Maxwell to approve $\$ 400 /$ full time teacher for 2023-24 classroom funds. Funds will be prorated based on FTE. Carly Howarth motions that if we have a blowout Wildcat Walk, we grant the teachers additional funding. Dave Gilbert, treasurer, agreed and motioned that we budget $\$ 12,000$ for classroom supply funds next year. Alex Brajcich seconds. All in favor. Dave Gilbert notes that this makes teacher supplies the largest line item in our yearly budget and that we should be really proud of supporting teachers in this way.


## Treasurer's Report (Dave Gilbert, Treasurer)

- Carnival lost a bit of money. Receipts are still coming in but it appears to have cost us about $\$ 1,000$ this year. We aim to break even but still consider this a success.
- We have about $\$ 18,000$ remaining


## Community Notes

- Gretchen Cleveland suggests that when we visit STCU to update the bank account, we ask about their Merchant Services and whether they offer services that could be used rather than Stripe and save us money. Great idea!
- Katie Glazier reports that we presented 3 LC graduates with $\$ 500$ scholarships for higher education. We will announce those winners when the LC graduates visit Wilson after Peter Pan Friday morning.
