- Celebrations (Christina Admire): Celebrated and mentioned all of the new position hires; promoted Wildcat Walk as well as presented a September 2023 Data Sheet Snapshot of Wilson (She said she would also sent it out).
- Highlights—As of October 2022, 73\% of Wilson incoming Kindergartners have the pre-requisite skills to be successful in Kindergarten. SPS average is $30 \%$ and Wilson is the highest rate of kindergarten readiness in the district by 18 percentage points (out of 34 elementary schools).
- As of June 2023 intermediate students (3-5) self-ranked overall elementary life skills at 4 of 5 on the Likert scale. Tied with one other elementary school for the highest ranking in the district. Self-assessment of grit, growth mindset, learning strategies, self-efficacy, self-management and social awareness.
- As of June 2023, 65\% of Wilsons student population had engaged in extracurricular activities. Wilson has the highest percentage of student participation in extracurricular activities in the district. SPS average is $30 \%$.
