- · Piloted in 2024 with Wilson, Grant, and Roosevelt
- · 3- fold purpose objective 1) provide positive experience for 5th graders in the Middle school building prior to starting 6th grade 2) build relationships between elementary schools in the LC feeder pattern 3) provide teaching artists and art space for working with ceramics
- · Jeff Klein looking for planning volunteers
- · Motion to use \$500 of the Scott-Grant partnership fund
- · Propose to add agenda item to November meeting to discuss the history and ongoing mission of Scott-Grant partnership
- · Gretchen proposes to table the motion until commitment from other schools is confirmed Kendra motions that we take \$500 to support the program; Linsday Pursley seconds, all in favor. Motion passes.

- 3rd Grade Lego Robotics Funds Request- Jeff Klein- 4 min
 - Explore Robotics for younger grades; only 6 weeks. District cut funding so PTG volunteered to fund future programming. New sets need to be purchased each year but sets could be reused for younger grades' Lego club. Sets are \$150 each and we need 4 sets -- \$600 total
 - Ana Ehrler asks if this will be a yearly request and if so, should we add it to annual budget?
- Active4Youth Donation Funds Request- Jeff Klein- 4 min
 - \$30/kid estimated cost; Wilson has about 100 kids participating. A4Y asking for donation of
 \$5/kid-\$500 total from unallocated funds not from cross country budget
 - Kate Makinson suggests sharing Active4Youth donation information and letting families make their own donations.
 - o Gretchen notes that fundraising for another non-profit can be problematic.
- Welcome Gifts- Kendra Chapman
 - o 2025/26 & 2026/27 Wilson Pennants
 - o 5"x12" pennants
 - o Proposing to buy enough for 2 school years and buy enough to gift to any staff that would like them. Approximately 140 pennants; \$3.17/pennant. Cost decreases to \$2.70 each if we order 250 and also offer pennants for sale in PTG store.
 - Sarah Rodgers asks about possibility of doing yard signs (\$5.80/sign for 200) instead. Bre
 Orcasitas mentioned t-shirts as an option. Kendra noted that each student will receive a t-shirt at next year's Wildcat Walk.
- Gretchen Cleveland moves to fund the \$600 for Lego robotics; Lindsay Pursley seconds. All in favor. Motion passes.
- Any donation to Active4Youth to come from extracurricular budget to be determined by committee
- Kendra Chapman moves to use unallocated funds to purchase pennant welcome gifts. Gretchen Cleveland seconds; all in favor; motion passes.
