2020-2021

Wyoming Children's Trust Fund (WYCTF) was established in 1994, W.S. 14-8-101 through 108, to provide funding for the prevention of child abuse and neglect. Wyoming Department of Family Services (DFS) serves as the fiscal agent for the Governor appointed board. There are five Governor appointed members, one designee from DFS, one designee from Wyoming Department of Education, and one designee from Wyoming Department of Health. In 2020, WYCTF hired two state employees to perform the operations of the board.

Sara Serelson, Executive Director Nicole Neider, Business Office Coordinator WYCTF has made significant progress in stability during 2020-2021 with the addition of two full time employees. An Executive Director, Sara Serelson, began with WYCTF on September 1, 2020, and a Business Office Coordinator, Nicole Neider, began with WYCTF on November 12, 2020. WYCTF has transitioned to offices in the Hathaway Building, a significant cost savings from rent in a previous location; has gained capacity to process payments through WOLFS, and is an approved site location for both Bachelor of Social Work internship students and AmeriCorps Vista Volunteers.

Wyoming Children's Trust Fund Child Abuse and Neglect Prevention:

WYCTF supports primary and secondary child abuse prevention efforts across the state. Primary prevention are strategies that prevent a problem from occurring. Secondary prevention are strategies that target at-risk populations. WYCTF's targeted populations include: parents (all, new, teens, etc.), parents and/or children with disabilities, racial and ethnic minorities, fathers, homeless families and those at risk of homelessness, unaccompanied homeless youth, members of underserved or underrepresented groups, and adult former victims of domestic violence or child abuse.

Wyoming Children's Trust Fund Operations:

WYCTF manages several internal initiatives, coordinates with Wyoming Department of Health (WDH) to provide the *My* 307 Wellness App which assists families in managing their healthcare needs, coordinates with training initiatives to provide education to professionals throughout the state working with families and children at risk, and offers grant funding to local communities for prevention efforts based on local needs.

Additionally, WYCTF offers trainings and outreach opportunities related to identifying child abuse and early trauma, building Protective Factors in families, and preventing and identifying domestic violence. WYCTF also co-sponsors and facilitates several statewide conferences including the Wyoming Joint Symposium for Youth and Families and the Wyoming Prevention and Response Conference.

WYCTF became the Prevent Child Abuse Wyoming (PCAWY) Affiliate in July of 2018, and is scheduled for a site visit from Prevent Child Abuse America October 19-21, 2021.

Grant opportunities for fiscal year 2020-2021 include;

- Local Child Protection Team (CPT) Prevention Grants
 - o This is a multi-year funding cycle. Local CPTs receive funding for individualized community prevention planning. Prevention plans must address at least one category from the comprehensive statewide Needs Assessment conducted by the Wyoming Children's Trust Fund.
 - o Twelve counties applied and received CPT Prevention Funds.
 - Sweetwater County, Uinta County, Crook County, Weston County, Laramie County, Hot Springs County, Teton County, Campbell County, Park County, Natrona County, Carbon County, and Washakie County
 - o Funding includes additional Technical Assistance and Training support around Primary Prevention, ACES, and Protective Factors for any community wanting to engage in prevention planning.
- Child Development Centers and Home Visiting Prevention Grants
 - o This is a multi-year funding cycle. Local programs receive funding for individualized community prevention planning. Prevention plans must address at least one category from the comprehensive statewide Needs Assessment conducted by the Wyoming Children's Trust Fund.
 - o Two Child Development Centers (CDC) applied and received Prevention Funds.
 - Fremont County CDC, and Natrona County CDC
 - o Five Parents as Teachers home visiting sites applied and received Prevention Funds.
 - Laramie County, Sweetwater County, Albany County, Natrona County, Fremont County
