Mandatory Reporting Child Abuse & Neglect in Wyoming

Every adult in Wyoming is a mandatory reporter. (W.S. 14-3-205)

Physical Abuse

Possible signs and symptoms include:

- Numerous significant bruises;
- Minor and major burns;
- Single and multiple fracture(s);
- Use of an instrument to strike a child and causing significant bruising and/or major injuries;
- Severely shaking a child;
- Choking, gagging or interfering with a child's breathing.

Sexual child abuse is any sexual activity with a child.

Signs include:

- Sexual behavior or knowledge that's inappropriate for the child's age;
- Inappropriate sexual contact with other children;
- The child saying he or she was sexually abused.

Neglect is the most common form of reported abuse in Wyoming.

Signs include:

- Lack of food, clothing, medication, supervision;
- Malnutrition, dehydration;
- Lack of emergency medical care;
- Left home alone for long periods of time as a young child;
- Excessive school absences.
