

# **NOTICE OF ELECTION**

## **TOWN OF ST. GEORGE**

Notice is hereby given that The Board of Voter Registration and Elections of Dorchester County, will conduct the Town of St. George Special Election on Tuesday, June 1, 2021.

Any person wishing to register to vote in this election must do so no later than 30 days prior to the election; Sunday May 2, 2021. For more information about registering to vote, please visit <http://dorchestervotes.org> or call 843-832-0132.

The following office shall be included in this election:

- Town Council Districts 6

Candidates for office who wish their names to appear on the election ballot must be qualified electors, residing within their respective Districts, and file a Statement of Candidacy at St. George Town Hall. There are no filing fees for offices in this election. The filing period begins at noon on Monday, April 5, 2021 and closes at noon on Friday, April 16, 2021. The hours of operation are Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

Voters who are blind, physically handicapped, or unable to read or write are entitled to assistance in casting their ballot. This assistance may be provided by anyone the voter chooses except his employer, an agent of his employer, or an officer or agent of his union. The managers must be notified if assistance is needed.

Voters who are unable to enter their polling place due to physical handicap or age may vote in the vehicle which they drove, or were driven in, to the polls. When notified, the Managers will help voters using this curbside voting provision.

Registered voters who cannot vote in person may be eligible to vote by absentee ballot. Absentee ballots will be available on May 3rd. Absentee ballots may be obtained from the Board of Elections and Voter Registration of Dorchester County, 201 Johnston Street, St. George. You may call 843-832-0132 or send an email to [vote@dorchestercountysc.gov](mailto:vote@dorchestercountysc.gov) to inquire about the availability of absentee ballots.

At 9:00 a.m. on Election Day the County Election Commission will begin its examination of the absentee ballot return envelopes at the Waggoner Building, 201 Johnston Street, St. George.

On Thursday, June 3, at 10:00 a.m. a hearing to determine the validity of ballots challenged in this election will be held. This hearing will be held at the St. George Civic Center, 303 Ridge Street, St. George.

The polls will be open from 7 a.m. until 7 p.m. at the St. George Civic Center, 303 Ridge Street, St. George.
