I am pleased to be able to greet you in this message. You all have been very much in my mind. The benefits of IT magic have been invaluable during this time of pandemic.

I have spent some time in lockdown remembering with fondness the many trips to your Provinces, Districts and Chapters, Lodges and Councils and Cryptic Councils that I have made since my Installation - it was a privilege to be with you all.

Keep working at our Royal Arch links as they help us and they help others through the practice of Companionship and Kindness. They will enable us to display the key elements of *respect, relevance and renewal* that is key to the health of our Order.

As we come out of the pandemic lockdown – we need to focus on *our* renewal. This needs to be done as a Royal Arch Community and not left for either the Leaders or others to promote alone. Do not automatically go back to doing things the same way as we did before the pandemic – we have an opportunity to embrace the rebuilding of the Second Temple which is so central to our history and is essential for our work in the future.

As our founding Companions were dedicated to the rebuilding of the second Temple in Jerusalem and the renewal of the commitment to God and to others, let us now embrace the building of the Order of Royal Arch Freemason in our own age.
