INTRODUCTION TO PUBLIC SAFETY SERVICES (10 MIN)

- How police, fire, and EMS services work together to keep residents safe.

 Key Message: Emergency services are more than just crisis response – they are essential to our community's well-being and safety.

RINDGE POLICE DEPARTMENT OVERVIEW (20 MIN)

- Mission & Responsibilities: Law enforcement, crime prevention, and community policing.
- Staffing Structure: Chief of Police, patrol officers, detectives, and support staff.
- Funding & Budgeting: Overview of expenses (staffing, equipment, training)
- Emergency Response: How officers respond to urgent situations and maintain public order.
- Community Programs: Initiatives such as the Crime Watch, Youth Outreach (etc) and public safety events.

RINDGE FIRE DEPARTMENT OVERVIEW (20 MIN)

- Mission & Responsibilities: Fire suppression, rescue services, and fire prevention education.
- Staffing Structure: Fire Chief, firefighters (full-time and volunteer), and administrative support.
- Funding & Budget: Major cost factors (vehicles, protective equipment, and station upkeep).
- Emergency Response Protocols: How the fire department coordinates during house fires, hazardous spills, and rescue operations.
- Fire Safety Programs: Smoke detector installations, home safety checks, and fire prevention workshops.

EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES OVERVIEW (20 MIN)

- Mission & Responsibilities: Responding to medical emergencies, providing prehospital care, and patient transportation.
- Staffing Structure: Paramedics, EMTs, and support personnel.
- Funding & Budget: Equipment costs, ambulance maintenance, and training.
- Emergency Medical Protocols: How EMS responds to medical calls, accidents, and life-threatening situations.
- Community Health Programs: CPR training, first aid workshops, and wellness checks for seniors.

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS AND RESIDENT INVOLVEMENT (15 MIN)

- How residents can prepare for natural disasters, power outages, or medical emergencies.
- Overview of the Emergency Management Plan and coordination with neighboring towns.
