While I missed getting a majority by eleven votes, I remain encouraged that CORSA members want a better way forward for our hobby.

Over the last several months I have continued networking to share my vision with members and learn from members what they expect from CORSA and its board of directors.

Here are my qualifications: Within the Corvair community, I have just over thirty Corvairs, many of which I drive and show regularly. I share my expertise with cars and my facilities with other Corvair owners. I've been a member of CORSA since 2017. On a local level, my Corvair club experience includes officer positions with the Vulcan Corvair Enthusiast - CORSA Chapter 352 (vice president, treasurer, webmaster), Corvair Springfest - Helen Georgia Planning Committee, 2022 Corvair Society of America International Convention Planning Committee and National Convention.

Outside the Corvair community, I have 30-years of executive-level non-profit experience; multi-million-dollar financial experience with for-profit and non-profit organizations; information systems management and systems integration; county government finance and administration; resource development; volunteer development; and customer service development.

One standout attribute I have that is important is my working knowledge of IRS 501c regulations – highly important to CORSA– and a new understanding of non-profit law and regulations for Illinois, where CORSA is organized.
