
NEXT ACTIVITY IS OCTOBER 28th



BIRMINGHAM TO HOST '75 CONVENTION

You heard right! The Vulcan Corvair Enthusiasts of Birmingham, Alabama will host a convention for the Corvair Society of America on May 2nd, 3rd, and 4th at the Admiral Benbow Inn. Plans are underway by both our club and national to make this one of the best conventions yet. We have been advised to expect from 250 to 400 members. The national convention will be in July in Seattle and so this may help us draw more from the East. The real bonus for the convention may be our guest speaker. At the present time Mark Corbin, President of CORSA, is inviting Don Yenko of the Corvair Yenko Stinger fame to be our guest for the weekend. This will be his first appearance at a CORSA event.

Although not all things are firm yet, this is how our schedule of events is shaping up: Friday May 2nd, there will be registration and a hospitality party from 5pm until 2am. Saturday, registration will continue from 8am until 12noon. We will have a parts swap meet, NASCAR movies, and manufactures display from 8am to 3pm. At 12 noon a lime run will begin thru the city of Birmingham stopping at Vulcan and Arlington. From 6pm to 7pm we will have a poolside cocktail party. From 7pm to 9pm we will have a buffet dinner during which time we will present the rally trophies and guest speaker. From 9pm until ?? we

will have a party with a live band.

Sunday, May 4th, we will proceed at 9am to the Alabama International Motor Speedway via a police escort. At about 12 noon we will be announced as the guests of NASCAR and take a tour lap around the track in our Corvairs. Then we will go back to our specially roped off area and watch the running of the Winston 500 During this time we will hold a concours. All in all it should be a very good convention. A press release has been sent to the Communique and in that it says that the two main items that we are striving to perfect is the convention itself and the lowest possible prices.

There should not be a whole lot of work involved for us IF we all participate and work now on what we have to do. Each of you will be assigned a certain committee to work on. During the actual convention we will work on all aspects of the event together. CHECK YOUR HEATER HOSE

At our last rally, Butch Baldone suffered damage to his Corvair when it caught fire. Although it could not be determined definitely, it appeared that the fire was caused by his heater hose touching the starter wires. It has been brought to our attention that many Corvair owners have had problems of either shorted out starters, discharged batteries, or worse yet, fires: all caused by the heater hose occaisionally hitting the wires. For a fool proof way of staying away from this problem, not only check your hose but coat the starter wire connections with a plastic sealant. This will also prevent them from vibrating loose.

Scrap Futures


