

representative of the high quality Corvairs making the trip. In all, 15 cars arrived for the show providing a good mix of earlies and lates.



Dues are Due

Jeff Brekke's Buick-powered '65 (taken from Gary Aube's web site)

Jeff's excellent craftsmanship is evident in the engine bay. The iron-block, .030 over 231 cubic inch displacement, reverserotation, mid '80s Buick V-6 fits perfectly under the stock hood, with fresh air for the Holley carburetor supplied through the standard Corvair inlets and plenum behind the rear window. The Holley is a 390 cfm model with #52 jets. The intake manifold is an aluminum Edelbrock dual plane. Ignition is provided by an MSD billet V-6 Buick distributor with distributor gears cut to allow for correct oil pump rotation, and an MSD 6A box (upper right in photo). At the lower left is an Airtique AC compressor, and at the extreme left, an aluminum panel with quick release fasteners gives access to the battery in its stock location. A coolant recovery tank is seen in the upper left hand corner of the picture, is the highest point in the cooling



system and is used for filling and to purge air. At the right in the photo, a compact spare tire replaces the stock full size spare. The engine uses

forged pistons and the stock compression ratio, and the

connecting rods were rotated for proper power stroke geometry. The new firing order is 1-2-3-4-5-6. The engine's cam rotation is in reverse and driven using a Milodon gear drive with an idler gear. The cam is a Howard's billet roller cam (.488 intake and exhaust w/112 degree centerline) made for reverse valve timing. The valves are motivated by Isky full skirt roller lifters (solid; .026 lash) and the valve train uses a T&D Machine aluminum roller rocker shaft system. All rotating assemblies were balanced. A water pump pulley was fabricated with the belt drive on the back side, similar to an idler pulley. The crank shaft oil seal surface was filled and polished to prevent oil from being directed out past the seal, and the starter internals were reversed. The front-mounted radiator is a Modine unit intended for Chevy Caprice and Cadillac replacements. It is mounted in a vertical configuration between the headlights. Coolant lines are routed to the rear of the car inside the floor pan tunnel. Jeff made the engine-to-transaxle adapter out of 6061-T6 aluminum .25 inch sheet. He cut out the two bolt patterns and rolled the center. The center was welded to the engine plate first. He left about .5 inches in extra length to be later removed in a lathe for truing. The transaxle pattern was then welded in while the engine and transaxle were mocked up together. After all the welding, the whole thing was put back in the lathe for any necessary truing or facing on both ends. The transaxle is a '66-69 Corvair 4-speed Saginaw unit with a 3.27:1 final drive ratio. A new hydraulic clutch arrangement makes use of a slave



cylinder intended for older Ford trucks.

The stance of the Corsa is excellent! Jeff lowered the front of the car by cutting one coil out of front springs. Springs are stock at the back of the car with the Corvair independent rear suspension retained and set to slight negative camber. A set of Weiand headers feed the dual exhaust pipes which exit through the blacked out inserts of the three piece stock Corsa air exhaust grill. The rear was further modified by discarding the back-

up lights in favor of a second set of brake lights. This was done by changing out the lenses and rewiring the inner units. While the Corvair purist might not be able to live without a genuine Corvair engine under the deck lid, many would find it difficult to find fault with Brekke's setup. The Buick V-6 makes approximately 205 hp and 269 lb-ft of torque @ 4000 rpm and 274 hp and 261 lb-ft of torque @ 5500 rpm. Jeff's had the car to 105 mph (under controlled conditions, of course) and says it feels great at that speed, and under normal highway conditions, seems to have plenty of safe passing power. 

Corvairs in the News

Joe Doughty of VCE called me a couple of weeks ago and told me about an article in the Sunday Birmingham News concerning Corvairs. Here it is below in case you missed it. These guys obviously don't like Corvairs and I'm not sure they know what they are talking about. I have never had a Corvair that 'dieseled'.



Mechanic blames dead battery on humid climate

Definition of mine visiting New Orleans had his battery go bad. He was told by the service technician that in the humid and warm climate of Louisiana, an electrical connection could establish itself across the battery terminals and cause a short. This has an air of plausibility about it. Moisture-saturated air, near enough to the ocean to have salt ions floating around in it, might be considered a weak electrolyte fluid. Does this explanation have potential? — Joe

TOM: Clearly, it has potential, Joe. You bought it!

RAY: Unfortunately, it's complete battery wash.

TOM: It does have that "air of plausibility" about it, like all good, bogus theories do. There's just enough science in there to make you think, "Hmm, sounds good..." But if that theory were true, every coastal community in the United States would have an army of dead batteries every time it rains (which makes the relative humidity 100 percent, right?).

RAY: The truth is, it takes more than salty, humid air to make a meaningful electrical connection between the battery terminals. I'd say it's more likely that your friend left a door ajar after spending a late night on Bourbon Street. And then the dome light ran down the battery overnight while he was sleeping off all those Lucky Dogs. That has a greater air of plausibility, wouldn't you say?

Di own a 1965 Chevy Corvair Monza. It has a 110-horsepower pancake sixcylinder engine. The problem is with the exhaust system, I think. The car has around 70,000 miles

n it, and after I turn off the Oengine, about five seconds later, the muffler emits a loud backfire that sounds exactly like a gunshot. I'm not thrilled about that, but the bigger problem is that the mufflers keep burning out (I get the cheap ones). I tried replacing both carburetors, and that didn't help.

Can these mufflers just not take the heat of an air-cooled engine? I can get a better muffler (it's around \$100), but I want to know if that will solve the problem. Supposedly, it's a muffler that was designed for the Corvair and can take the heat of the exhaust. Should I get the expensive muffler? — Kevin

RAY: No, you shouldn't, Kevin. I wouldn't get an expensive anything for this car, to tell you the truth. Except maybe an expensive football helmet.

TOM: I don't think the muffler is your problem. I think the problem is "dieseling," or "run-on." These cars are famous for it. They run so hot that even after the ignition is turned off, it's possible for the combustion process to continue — sometimes for many seconds!

RAY: A friend of mine had a '65 Corvair, and we kept turning

the idle speed down ... and down ... and down in an effort to get it to stop dieseling. We turned it down to half of what it should be and still, every time he shut off the car, it would keep sputtering for about 15 or 20 seconds — "budup bu bup bup bup, budup bup bup." Of course, we were living in Texas, where it was 108 degrees in the shade, so that didn't help.

TOM: When the engine sputters like that, gasoline continues to get sucked into the cylinders. Some of it burns, but most of it does not. And when the unburned gas finds its way into the exhaust system and reaches a critical mass in the hot muffler — kaboom!

RAY: Run-on is usually caused by an idle speed that's too high, engine operating temperature that's too high, timing that's too advanced or any combination of the three. So fix that first, Kevin, or you'll keep going through mufflers like my brother goes through ... uh, name something you go through quickly, Tommy ... TOM: Spouses.



The World According to Murphy

Murphy's Law in General

If there is a possibility of several things going wrong, the one that will cause the most damage will be the one to go wrong.

When any mechanical contrivance fails, it will do so at the most inconvenient time. This is the "Principal of Maximum Difficulty."

Interchangeable parts won't.

Parts for Corvair engine that positively cannot be assembled in improper order will be.

Any part requiring service or adjustment will be least accessible.

If the restoration requires "X" components, Clark's will have "X" minus one in stock.

A failure will not appear in a Clark's reproduction until it has passed final inspection.

Firmness of Clark's delivery dates in inversely proportional to the tightness of the restoration schedule. After adding two weeks to the delivery schedule for unexpected delays, add two more for the unexpected, unexpected delays.

Murphy's Law as Applied to the Workshop Manual:

When all else fails, read the instructions.

If you do not understand a particular word or phrase in the workshop manual, ignore it. The manual will make perfect sense without it.

The most vital instruction in the workshop manual stands the greatest chance of: being obliterated by grease.

Murphy's Law as Applied to Workshops and Workbenches:

After the transmission has been assembled, extra components will be found on the bench.

An object will fall from the bench so as to do the most damage.

The most delicate component will be the one to fall.

Parts, when dropped, will roll into the least accessible corner of the workshop.

The accessibility during recovery of parts which fall from the work bench varies directly with the size of the part and inversely with its importance to the completion of work underway.

Murphy's Law as Applied to General Repairs:

When an adjustment error has been detected and corrected, it will be found to have been correct in the first place.

After the adjustment correction has been found in error, it will be impossible to adjust back to the original setting.

After the last of 16 mounting screws has been removed from an access cover, it will be discovered that the wrong access cover has been removed.

After an access cover has been secured by the last of 16 screws, it will be discovered that the gasket has been omitted.

Anything can be made to work if you fiddle with it long enough.

If it jams - force it. If it breaks, it needed replacing anyway.





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

Corvair Love Affair

This article sounds really familiar....

Dick Hull bought his first Corvair in '63 - and today he has at least 90 By Bart Ripp of *The News Tribune 10/6/99*

Happens all the time.

Dick Hull will be driving to work in Bremerton. He'll be at a red light in his white 1964 Corvair and somebody will pull up, smile, roll down the window and holler, "I used to have one of those."

Hull answers that he's got a few more in the back yard.

He's not sure how many Corvairs lurk in the woods behind his house in the Mason County city of Allyn, in adjacent garages and sheds, under trees and out yonder. His best guess is 90 Chevrolet Corvairs, ranging from running to rotting.

Doug Titus, president of CORSA Northwest, the area Corvair club, thinks Hull has more Chevrolet Corvairs than anybody around here.

"Dick's collection is legend," said Titus, a lawyer for the state who works in Olympia and lives in Seattle with 6 1/2 Corvairs.

The lore of this odd tub of a car, with an air-cooled engine in the rear and the trunk in the front, began 40 years ago this month. The first of nearly 1.8 million Corvairs rolled out of Detroit in October 1959.

The Corvair's endurance as an American icon can be traced to simple design and sturdy engineering that went unappreciated during the car's 10-year run.

"The Corvair is an incredibly people-friendly car," Titus said. "It's easy to operate and comfortable to drive. Basically, if you can repair one, you can fix them all. They just go and go and go."

Dick Hull went for the economy. Hull, 55, was living in Chicago, had just graduated from high school, had a wife and one son, and needed a car that he calls "ec-o-nom-i-cal."

On Dec. 13, 1963, a date Hull prefaces by noting it was Friday the 13th, he spotted a used 1962 Corvair Monza at the Nickey Chevrolet lot. The car was maroon, a hue called "artesian red" by Chevrolet.

"I got rid of my 409 Impala for a car with no power and noise that came from the back," Hull said. "But the Monza had Pos-I-Traction (a grabber of a differential), four-speed on the floor, bucket seats, dual carbs (carburetors) and everybody thought it was a big, hot car."

Hull was hooked. He began buying and selling Corvairs as casually as changing his socks. When he moved to Mason County in 1975, he had eight Corvairs. Then he got serious. Hull, an auto body estimator at Parr Ford in Bremerton, began finding Corvairs all over Western Washington. "I'm not trying to get the most," Hull said. "I'm trying to drive 'em."

Monzas were the sporty models. Spyders were turbocharged. Greenbriers were little vans. Lakewood was the station wagon. Rampside was a van with a ramp that popped out the side door.

The Corvair champion of Washington was a wheat farmer in Connell, Franklin County. Norm Welch owned 150 Corvairs. Welch died a few years back, and many of his Corvairs were sold at auction.

Hull's 90-car collection is remarkable in that he drove most of them. Among Harold LeMay's 2,464 cars in Pierce County are 42 Corvairs, but he doesn't drive them.

Hull's seven kids drive Corvairs. A fleet of Corvairs awaits the 10 grandchildren of Hull and his patient wife, Annette.

A '62 Greenbrier is parked in the woods. It squired three Hull boys -ÊDick Jr., Waynn and Todd - and their North Mason High School wrestling teammates to matches all over the state.

A '63 Monza with nothing but a good story molders in salal. Hull heard the car was for sale at a wrecking yard in the Sunnyslope area west of Port Orchard. All the car needed was a starter.

Hull went to the yard, struck a deal for \$125, went home for a starter and came back at 4:30 in the afternoon.

"The owner was an old black guy and he said I had half an hour to get the starter going, because he left the place promptly at 5," Hull said. "A starter is routine. No big deal. The car started at 5 to 5. The guy said I could have the car. Scot-free."

Hull drove the Corvair home. He owns the white '64 that he drives every day, a convoy of 10 licensed and ready to roll for anybody in the family, a few in the throes of repair, and about six dozen in the woods.

Some cars are sunk in mud. One convertible has an alder growing through the roof. One is a customized stretch '61 Corvair with seven doors - three on each side and a hatchback over the motor.

"I took that stretch (Corvair) with Annette and the kids to the national (Corvair Society of America) convention in San Diego in 1978," Hull said.

The woods behind Dick Hull's house are a dream gallery of Corvairs. Corvairs that are parts cars, Corvairs that are long gone, Corvairs that are future projects, Corvairs that Hull drove until they wouldn't run anymore.

"Actually," Hull said, "Corvairs are totally opposite my style. They're economical and dependable and drivable.

"But they're a killer car. I got hooked on 'em because they're good buddies. They're always there for me."

Corvair Love Affair

This article sounds really familiar....

Dick Hull bought his first Corvair in '63 - and today he has at least 90 By Bart Ripp of *The News Tribune 10/6/99*

Happens all the time.

Dick Hull will be driving to work in Bremerton. He'll be at a red light in his white 1964 Corvair and somebody will pull up, smile, roll down the window and holler, "I used to have one of those."

Hull answers that he's got a few more in the back yard.

He's not sure how many Corvairs lurk in the woods behind his house in the Mason County city of Allyn, in adjacent garages and sheds, under trees and out yonder. His best guess is 90 Chevrolet Corvairs, ranging from running to rotting.

Doug Titus, president of CORSA Northwest, the area Corvair club, thinks Hull has more Chevrolet Corvairs than anybody around here.

"Dick's collection is legend," said Titus, a lawyer for the state who works in Olympia and lives in Seattle with 6 1/2 Corvairs.

The lore of this odd tub of a car, with an air-cooled engine in the rear and the trunk in the front, began 40 years ago this month. The first of nearly 1.8 million Corvairs rolled out of Detroit in October 1959.

The Corvair's endurance as an American icon can be traced to simple design and sturdy engineering that went unappreciated during the car's 10-year run.

"The Corvair is an incredibly people-friendly car," Titus said. "It's easy to operate and comfortable to drive. Basically, if you can repair one, you can fix them all. They just go and go and go."

Dick Hull went for the economy. Hull, 55, was living in Chicago, had just graduated from high school, had a wife and one son, and needed a car that he calls "ec-o-nom-i-cal."

On Dec. 13, 1963, a date Hull prefaces by noting it was Friday the 13th, he spotted a used 1962 Corvair Monza at the Nickey Chevrolet lot. The car was maroon, a hue called "artesian red" by Chevrolet.

"I got rid of my 409 Impala for a car with no power and noise that came from the back," Hull said. "But the Monza had Pos-I-Traction (a grabber of a differential), four-speed on the floor, bucket seats, dual carbs (carburetors) and everybody thought it was a big, hot car."

Hull was hooked. He began buying and selling Corvairs as casually as changing his socks. When he moved to Mason County in 1975, he had eight Corvairs. Then he got serious. Hull, an auto body estimator at Parr Ford in Bremerton, began finding Corvairs all over Western Washington. "I'm not trying to get the most," Hull said. "I'm trying to drive 'em."

Monzas were the sporty models. Spyders were turbocharged. Greenbriers were little vans. Lakewood was the station wagon. Rampside was a van with a ramp that popped out the side door.

The Corvair champion of Washington was a wheat farmer in Connell, Franklin County. Norm Welch owned 150 Corvairs. Welch died a few years back, and many of his Corvairs were sold at auction.

Hull's 90-car collection is remarkable in that he drove most of them. Among Harold LeMay's 2,464 cars in Pierce County are 42 Corvairs, but he doesn't drive them.

Hull's seven kids drive Corvairs. A fleet of Corvairs awaits the 10 grandchildren of Hull and his patient wife, Annette.

A '62 Greenbrier is parked in the woods. It squired three Hull boys -ÊDick Jr., Waynn and Todd - and their North Mason High School wrestling teammates to matches all over the state.

A '63 Monza with nothing but a good story molders in salal. Hull heard the car was for sale at a wrecking yard in the Sunnyslope area west of Port Orchard. All the car needed was a starter.

Hull went to the yard, struck a deal for \$125, went home for a starter and came back at 4:30 in the afternoon.

"The owner was an old black guy and he said I had half an hour to get the starter going, because he left the place promptly at 5," Hull said. "A starter is routine. No big deal. The car started at 5 to 5. The guy said I could have the car. Scot-free."

Hull drove the Corvair home. He owns the white '64 that he drives every day, a convoy of 10 licensed and ready to roll for anybody in the family, a few in the throes of repair, and about six dozen in the woods.

Some cars are sunk in mud. One convertible has an alder growing through the roof. One is a customized stretch '61 Corvair with seven doors - three on each side and a hatchback over the motor.

"I took that stretch (Corvair) with Annette and the kids to the national (Corvair Society of America) convention in San Diego in 1978," Hull said.

The woods behind Dick Hull's house are a dream gallery of Corvairs. Corvairs that are parts cars, Corvairs that are long gone, Corvairs that are future projects, Corvairs that Hull drove until they wouldn't run anymore.

"Actually," Hull said, "Corvairs are totally opposite my style. They're economical and dependable and drivable.

"But they're a killer car. I got hooked on 'em because they're good buddies. They're always there for me."

LOTUS SERVICE TIPS

Many of you know that I recently did a frame change on my Lotus Elan +2. Yes, it was as much work as you might think. No, I'm still happily married. Lotus restoration is chock full of all the wonderful, zen-inducing experiences common to all English car work that are not often seen when working on German cars. French and Italian cars are about as much fun, but you have to smoke unfiltered cigarettes and shrug a lot more.

Following is an excerpt from the Lotus technical manual that I thought you all might enjoy. Thanks to Club Lotus England.

REMOVING, OVERHAULING, AND RESETTING THE THRAMP, Part No. 24728198 left.

NOTE: This refers to later model Thramps as fitted to Lotus cars from 1966 until the present day. The work should only be carried out in conjunction with a full workshop manual (out of print) so this is an outline instruction.

TOOLS: You will need a Thramp gasket set, Thramp repair kit or a new Thramp assembly complete with diode and tensioner springs. The latter components are common to a JCB Mini Digger or Ransome Major Motor Mower or national Coal Board Type 262 conveyor belt Thramp.

REMOVAL: Jack up the car and secure it on piles of soft bricks, tree stumps, or Taiwanese self-bending pressed tin DIY ramps. Remove the body from the chassis following the workshop manual instructions. Approach the Thramp with the Thramp remover held behind your back until the last minute so as to take it by surprise. Thrust the remover strongly to the left rounding off the machined edges of the Thramp and allowing the Thramp remover to fly off into the darkest dirtiest, and least accessible corner of the garage. One may wish to rent a specially trained Thramp remover retriever dog from your local dealership to speed the process. If you have trouble surprising your Thramp, attempt the work at night in total darkness.

With the Thramp on the bench in a good vise, with an eight-ton hydraulic ram and a twelve-foot length of pipe you will be able to remove the thrust base, the tension rocker arm, and then the pre-loaded, spline-shanked coupling, being careful to retain the seventy-two small springs and detante ball bearings in their channels. Next remove the Thramp bearing retainer with a plasma cutter or two grams of plastic explosive. Finally, with the body of the Thramp casing in your left hand insert the replacement plunger (wide end of the seal first), grommet, and tensioner springs while screwing the Thramp retainer caps on both ends with your toes.

RESETTING THE THRAMP - Assembly is the reverse of disassembly.

NOTE - A temporary Thramp repair can be affected by straining STP oil additive through a sock and dripping it into the Thramp via the interior ashtray. Winding bailing wire and duct tape around the Thramp housing in the area above the exhaust and below the transmission will quiet the Thramp adequately to sell the car.




Strange Motor

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


Strange Motor

Interesting Article on Reformulated Gasoline by Brent Covey via The Corvair Center's "Forum" 10/9/00

Hi everyone-

The posting below about the gas tank sealants got me thinking I should remind people abot the other aspects related to reformulated fuels-

I understand the entire US is currently using reformlated gasoline now, theres a few different blends and proportions of oxygenates used in different areas, from very little in most places to 14% MTBE content in California. The refiners have a coupe different chemicals they can use for oxygenates but MTBE is the most common. In Canada MTBE is never used however most of the MTBE used in the western US is made by a Canadian company, its manufacturered from natural gas.

All of these chemicals have common characteristics, to be an oxygenate, they have to create a chemical reaction during combustion that helps oxidize the fuel molecules and help them burn completely. This means they contain oxygen compounds that are liberated when they burn.

The downside of this is fuels containing oxygenates will oxidize everything they touch or come in contact with- rust is iron oxide for example- and things like rubber fuel line hoses and most materials will be effected from this oxydization. This is a problem, fuel line hoses are only considered safe for 3 years max by the current SAE spec. People have to be very careful to inspect and routinely replace rubber gas line and filler pipe hoses and watch out on the big tank sender O-ring etc for premature deterioration. This kind of stuff used to quite reliably last 10-20 years on older fuels but those days are gone. We will not be getting the same service out of fuel pumps and carb seals we once did either. Usually most seal materials will swell and soften on the new gasolines, but very old straight neoprene hoses just shrink and crack.

Another attribute of oxygenated fuels is that the compounds used as oxygenates all attract water very strongly. MTBE is rapidly becoming famous on this score, as it likes to permeate drinking water supplies and isnt broken down in the environment well, which gasoline and alcohols are. In your car, this means gas tanks are more apt to pick up water, whether in the car or at the filling station- and as the fuel evaporates, you'll be left with more water than the gasoline can hold and have water contamination problems. Water in the carbs will be more common than ever, so watch for it if your car starts running poorly for no real reason.

You'll also find the new fuels leave a very persistent deposit if allowed to dry out. I'd make a point of running a car right out of fuel before long term storage, to minimize problems in this department.

The good news id the new gas has so much detergent that carbs get cleaner as you drive now; -) Oxygenates are also very good octane enhancing compounds and will boost octane in even small amounts.

Oxygenates do contain significantly less thermal energy than gasoline, and especially less than compounds like benzine and touline that used to be in gasolines in large amounts. What this means is depending on the content used in your fuel, the gas is 'weaker'. A gallon of California gasoline is only 85% gas now, most of the remainder is MTBE. Because MTBE doesnt have the explosive energy of gasoline, you'll need to burn more fuel for the same performance. You wont need 15% more, but you will need somewhat more than the car is jetted to provide. Cars with carburetors and fixed metering systems like early FI with no oxygen sensors will need mixture strengths strengthened to work like they're designed to on the reformulated fuels. In general terms most older GM cars need a main jet about 3 sizes richer to retain the original performance levels. In places like Californa that are largely low altitude and very hot and have very weak fuels, even greater changes may be needed.

I've been seeing a lot of older GM cars with QuadraJets in CA flunking emissions inspections because they've leaned out so far the carbs need significant changes to have clean exhaust. If you have a car that has persistent high HC emissions on inspections (anything over 100ppm is pretty high) you might explore a richer main jet and or opening up idle limiter provisions in your carb. Corvair engines, particularily 1965-'67 95 and 110 HP are extraordinarily clean on smog tests if everythings working well. Most 1965-'69 Corvair engines could pass a 1981 new car standard if tuned to a fare thee well.

Anyhow, the message is- you can expect fuel system leaks to be a regular problem now, and you'll need to spend a lot more effort on maintaining perishable fuel system components than you are used to. You also may have to recalibrate the carbs a little to make the car run well and efficiently, and to pass smog testing you may have to make further changes.

One last thing- it is worthwhile if you are parking cars to park on a surface that a fuel leak can be absorbed into. Unpainted concrete or gravel is much safer than a shiny or blacktop surface if a leak develops. You want to gas to soak away where it cant ignite hopefully. When working on fuel system parts make sure you park with the cars nose pointed downhill too, so gravity doesnt allow it to leak from disconnected parts. And last of all, NEVER use a electric light when working on a gas tank or in areas where fuel could even have a remote chance of splashing. Use a mirror or piece of cardboard covered in tinfoil etc to reflect light where you need it. Hope this is interesting, *Brent*
