Outlet Duct Tip...

From the November '07 Corsa Communiqué article by Craig Nicol on details concerning 1961-69 outlet damper door optimization:

One final hint. The sheet metal in the damper door area must be properly installed for the damper doors to open without friction or binding. Check and straighten damaged sheet metal components. Note that the lower cover over the motor mount bracket slides over the sides of the rear outlet ducts. This seemingly trivial installation detail pulls the duct's sheet metal side toward the center of the vehicle and keeps it away from the moving damper doors. Simple? Yes, but these are the little tricks that really make the damper doors work well.



LM Turbo ID Tips

Authenticating a turbocharged Corsa: Larry Claypool, Technical Editor of the Corvair Society of America, offers the following tips on how to make sure a 1965-66 Corsa turbo came from the factory that way. "Numbers matching doesn't currently mean a lot to most Corvair owners, as their cars don't bring the big money that some other 1960s Chevrolets do," Larry says. "But if a prospective buyer is going to spend more money for a turbo, he should check to make sure he's getting the real thing."

Serial number: The third digit in the serial number should be a 7, which indicates that it's a Corsa. A 5 will indicate that the car is a Monza.

Fisher Body tag: The Fisher Body tag, located on the rear frame rail of the engine compartment, will have its lower line labeled "ACC." The letter after the number 4 should be O, which indicates the car was built with a turbo.

Turbocharger serial number: Because some folks have retrofitted early 150hp Spyder turbochargers to later 180hp cars, it pays to check the turbo's numbers. The last three digits will read 709.

Engine serial number: If the turbocharged engine is correct for a 1965 or '66 Corsa, the serial number will end with the letters RL.

Statistics on the Introduction of Chevy's 'Small' Cars

In this day of subcompact, compact, midsize, and fullsize passenger car offerings from Chevrolet, it's easy to forget that prior to the 1960 model year, postwar Chevrolet passenger cars (except Corvette) were based on a single platform using the same basic underskin architecture regardless of cost, model, or trim level. This one-size-fits-all situation changed with the introduction of the '60 Corvair, '62 Chevy II, and '64 Chevelle. With these additions, Chevrolet was poised to compete in the then-new compact and midsize markets.

Even though these new, smaller Chevys were popular, fullsize models continued to attract the most buyers. For example, in 1960, fullsize models accounted for 84.2% of all Chevrolet passenger car sales. The rest were Corvairs (15.1%) and Corvettes (0.6%). By 1966, fullsize Chevy's still accounted for a healthy 69.1% of all division sales. The Chevelle (15.1%), Corvair (9.9%), Chevy II (4.9%) and Corvette (1.0%) were popular, but they represented mere drops in the big bucket made possible by the 1.6 million-plus fullsize Biscaynes, Bel Airs, and Impalas that sold that same year.

Never leave the top down with a cat around...

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Tech Topic: That Pesky Rear Oil Leak...

Ever really looked at the rear skid plate on your Corvair? Yes, the stamped metal plate under the rear balancer/pulley with the big bolt through the middle... behind the rear motor mount and seals the rear housing from road grime and such? Yes, the one that Corvair 'professionals' recommend that you drill several holes in it so that the inevitable oil that accumulates can drip out? That's the one. According to my personal Corvair guru now located in Coral Gables, EVERY Corvair will have oil in the skid plate. The source? Well, GM pressed a shaft into the rear housing for the oil pump idler gear to ride on - and oil, as is its nature, finds a way to seep out through the bore. Had GM not drilled all the way through and just recessed the dummy shaft bore, there would be no leak. I guess the bean counters caused this. Anyhoo, there are several ways to 'fix' this. The most effective and permanent way is to 'weld over' the shaft where it meets the housing surface. However, for us cheapo and low miles drivers, there is a nice temporary fix that can be done easily. It involves one of my favorite friends, Mr. J.B. Weld. Here goes.

Remove the rear grill. Support the engine and remove rear motor mount and skid plate. Lower engine carefully a few inches to access rear housing easily. Clean housing area where the pump shaft is bored with acetone or brake cleaner. Clean again. Mix ole' JB and slather nicely. Let cure 24 hours and reassemble. Voilá! A nice dry engine. WARNING: My consultant warns this will not hold on a high miles vehicle.

In closing, I did this fix before (credit to Frank Ranelli) and it lasted about 6 years of 1,000 miles per year driving. These were short trips...my esteemed consultant says this won't last on prolonged trips. - Editor



The Preventative Maintenance Series by Mike Dawson

The following list of items to check before taking a trip are suggestions for all Corvairs in general. Remember that even long trips are usually less than the mileage between a single oil change. Serviced properly, your Corvair will cruise to all of this summer's events and back - and be happier for it!

- 1. Check or clean & pack all four wheel bearing assemblies, and check & lube the 2 or 4 U-joints. Check front end parts and lube the fittings.
- 2. Have tires balanced and aligned if necessary. Before trips, check all five tire pressures and tighten lug nuts with the tool you use to change a tire.
- 3. Check or change all fluids: oil, transmission, differential, brake fluid, washer fluid and battery level if possible. Synthetic Powerglide fluid is a very good idea.
 - 4. Check the oil pressure sending unit and change this inexpensive item if you do not know its history.
- 5. Check the engine tune, and include cleaning the crankcase vents. Check the breaker plate in the distributor, lube the distributor cam and inspect the electrical connections such as the primary coil wires, alternator wires (no generators allowed) and multi-connectors. Check carburetor inlet nuts for leaks.
- 6. Check the battery date, cable ends, ground cable mount and check the overall charging system with the lights and accessories on maximum.
- 7. REMOVE the belt and check the condition of the entire length. Spin all three pulleys and lube anything questionable. Tools are available to grease the fan and idler bearing.
- 8. Check all running lights, check the fuse block for rust, check the large connector in early model engine compartments, check warning light operation.
- 9. If air conditioned, blow out the condenser, check the mounts and belt, check the evaporator drain, and re move the lower shrouds for better cooling.
- 10. Check the harmonic balancer, and if it is original, replace it! Be sure to check the fuel pump mount, they do work loose. To be safe with the increasing ethanol additions, you should have a new Airtex pump with the green paint spot.
- 11. Lube your late clutch cable ball and look for frayed cable between the two pulleys under the dash on early models also check parking cables in the same area..
- 12. Check brakes; wheel cylinders, shoes, master cylinder (push rod leak), and most important, the steel and rubber lines. Give your car the "stomp test" in the driveway. Steel lines above the gas tank and next to the transaxle are the most prone to rust, with tunnel lines next.

Be aware of any speedometer error you may have and know your oil consumption rate. Test drive 15 minutes on the highway on a hot day, pack up and head out!

If you have questions about the above items, call me. I have tech sheets, tools and encouragement free for the asking.

Spares and tools? My favorites would be a belt, a new fuel pump, one rocker arm with pushrod and valve cover gasket, one 30 amp fuse, a set of points and condenser, oil as required, tools for these items, and a CORSA Travel Roster.

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

ITINERARY AND DRIVING INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE NATCHEZ TRACE DRIVE

The Natchez Trace drive begins in Franklin, TN. Friday night we have reservations at the Best Western just off I-65. For those of you who can come early Nashville has a host of attractions to occupy your day. A prime example is the Lane Motor Museum. Lane has a first class display of foreign autos from around the globe. Dinner Friday night is on your own. There are several major chain restaurants near the interstate and a host of local eateries in downtown Franklin.

The tour begins in the Best Western parking lot at 8:00 a.m. Saturday morning. Please be fueled, fed, loaded, and ready to go at 8:00 a.m. Beware there is no gas on the Trace. You must leave the Trace and travel to the nearest town to gas up. Plan accordingly.

Once we are on the Trace the policy is to travel at your own pace and stop where you want. It is about 200 miles from Franklin to Tupelo. If you drive straight through you'll be there in about four hours. If you stop to look at most of the sites and roadside exhibits it will take seven to nine hours. There are NPS restroom facilities at many of the pull offs along the trace. My own experience leads me to suggest that you have your own supply of toilet paper on hand; several places along the way were out.

Saturday lunch is a picnic at the Colbert Ferry site. If you elect not to bring your own lunch it is a forty-five mile round trip into Florence, Alabama, for grub.

The last stop on the Trace for the day is the Tupelo Visitors Center. There is a small museum and gift shop there. The guides are most helpful and knowledgeable about the area. Our host hotel for the evening is the Comfort Inn. We have dinner reservations at Vanelli's Greek & Italian Restaurant at 7:00 p.m. It is within walking distance of the hotel.

Sunday morning is the same as Saturday, 8:00 a.m., and ready to go. The drive is only 80 miles to French Camp. There are not as many turnouts on this stretch. I estimate about three hours to this terminus.

Sunday lunch is tentatively planned to be in Starkville. Scheduling for lunch will be fluid to allow for traffic and crowds (home football game at Mississippi State). From Starkville you can take U.S. 82 to I-20 in Tuscaloosa.

egardless of what Ralph Nader has to say, the Chevy Corvair stands as one of General Motors' boldest engineering achievements. Think about it. When it was introduced for the '60 model year, it was an absolutely revolutionary package. With its aluminum flat-six tucked beneath the trunk lid, there simply was nothing else like it available from Detroit, nor had there been, with the exception of the postwar Tucker, Sure, the first-generation '60 to '64 cars are a little on the

So when the restyled '65 models hit the scene, the taut lines should have spelled huge sales figures. The only problem was a thing called Mustang. Not only that, but Chevy was rapidly adding new models like the compact Nova in '62, the midsize Chevelle in '64, and the Camaro in '67, all of which took the wind out of Corvair sales. Ponycars and musclecars were hot, so the poor little Corvair was quickly swept aside to make way. Yeah, Chevy continued marketing the Corvair into the '69 model year, but after 1966, all performance options were dropped and the car slowly withered on the vine.



Giving new meaning to the term truncated, Corvair convertibles were offered in every model year except '60 and '61. Convertible production totals were '62: 16,569; '63: 44,165; '64: 35,806; '65: 34,819; '66: 13,487; '67: 2,109; '68: 1,386; and '69: 521. Notice how output dips sharply after 1965. We can thank the Camaro for that. There isn't enough left of this '65 to '69 ragtop to nail down an exact model year.

Polar opposites, the red second-generation Monza convertible is the sexiest Corvair, while the stodgy first-generation four-door sedan is strictly for granny patrol. All Corvair passenger cars share the same 108-inch wheelbase. Chevrolet designated the '60 to '64 models as A-bodies; the '65 to '69 models were Z-bodies.



The body-colored taillight cove tells us it's not a '65 to '66 Corsa. The Corsa, Corvairs muscle model, had an argent silver cove and a standard 140hp four-carb engine. The 180hp turbo engine was optional. Another non-Corsa giveaway is the standard three-pod instrument cluster. Corsas featured a six-gauge cluster.



The 110 badge on the decklid of this convertible identifies the base dual-carb powerplant. Did we say dual carb and base model in the same sentence? Remember, the Corvair's cylinder banks were horizontally opposed 180 degrees. The long distance between each cylinder head would have placed a single, centrally located carburetor too far away from engine heat to prevent icing in cold weather, not to mention the fuel distribution headaches. The solution was to mount a carburetor atop each head. The corporate bean coun ters must have gone nuts. Ironically, the only Corvair engine with a single carburetor was the '62 to '65 L87 turbocharged engine. It fed its Thompson-Ramo Woodridge turbocharger with a solitary Carter YH sidedraft single-throat carb. The turbo cars were also equipped with a single exhaust pipe.



Reference: Section 32-8-87 Code of Alabama 1975, Senate Bill SB45-2008

I am writing to you about an Alabama law that directly affects all car owners in the state but most notably car owners who are most likely to repair and restore their own cars or to contract portions of that work to professionals.

In Alabama, if your vehicle is damaged so that the repairs are more than 75% of the book value your insurance company is legally required to total the car.

They are not going to ask you what you think about it. Once the car is totaled you can buy the salvage title. However that is where the problem starts. You cannot do the work yourself on a vehicle with a salvage title and get the car retitled so you can operate it on public streets unless you hold an Alabama Rebuilder's License. You can obtain a license from the state for a fee of only \$10. However it requires proof of garage liability insurance and a \$10,000 surety bond. Some insurance companies won't even write such a policy for an individual who doesn't own a garage but others will. The best price I was quoted was over \$1,000. The bond would cost another \$100.

The other option you have to is to have the repair work done by a garage that has an Alabama Rebuilder's License. The reason you need to have the work done by a licensed entity is that only someone with that license can apply for the inspection required before the salvage title can be converted into a rebuilt title.

You dare not drive the car while it is under the salvage title. If you are caught it is a class C misdemeanor and carries a \$500 fine.

What this means is that you might have, say, a 1980 El Camino or Mustang that you have restored from the ground up. You hit a deer and call your insurance agent. He comes out and looks at the repair estimate and then checks his "blue book" which only has values for the average car of that make and model. Obviously your vehicle is worth much more than that, but that is not what he is going to use in his decision. A 1980 vehicle is going to have a ridiculously low book value. He is required by law to total your vehicle.

You may be personally more qualified to work on your car than the licensed rebuilder in your area, but the law is the law. If you do the work yourself, all you can do is trailer your car from that time only.

This law is obviously flawed. Perhaps it was meant to keep rebuilt vehicles that were salvaged from the Katrina disaster or that don't have working air bags or have other serious defects from reaching the sales lots, but it also places an unreasonable burden on citizens in cases where the decision to total the vehicle was made on book value alone and not on the nature of the damage.

An attempt was made to amend this law in 2008. It passed the house and the appropriate committees in the senate. But then Senator Preuitt who was instrumental in passing the law to begin with was in a position to effectively kill the amendment by not allowing it to come to a vote this past year, and he did so. That amendment would have allowed someone who was the owner of the vehicle when it was damaged to manage the repairs and apply for the state inspection without having to have garage liability insurance and the required bond.

Attached is a copy of a letter (not attached - Editor) that I composed and sent to Lt. Gov. Jim Folsom. Please read it and then investigate this matter. If you agree that the law should be amended to waive the garage liability insurance and bond requirements for the individual who owned the vehicle when it was damaged then please print and sign the petition or compose a letter of your own and send to Lt. Gov. Folsom.

From the 11/08 'Car Craft' Rag...

ere's an amazing—and tragic—pair of '62 Oldsmobile Jetfires we recently spotted at Desert Valley Auto Parts in Phoenix (DVAP). In case you're not up on your factory turbo car history, know that these amazing little critters share the stage

ofth Chevy's '62 Corvair Monza Spyder turbe as America's first mass-produced turbocharged passenger cars.

Unlike previous beltdriven supercharger packages from Ford, Kaiser, Packard, and Studebaker, GM's employed exhaust-driven turbochargers to boost intake tract efficiency—and power. While the Corvair relied on a blown 145-cube flat-six powerplant to get 150 hp and 210 lb-ft, Olds employed a 215ci die-cast aluminum V-8 that delivered 215 hp and an impressive 300 lb-ft. This so-called Turbo-Rocket mill was the only Oldsmobile production V-8 engine to hit the magic 1-horse-per-cubic-inch mark until the 1995 arrival of the 250hp Aurora 4.0L (244ci) V-8. Let's all whine over the sad state of this rare pair of first-year Olds turbo cars.



Though based on the F-85/Cutlass compact model line, Jetfires only came one way: turbocharged. A total of 3,765 Jetfires were built in 1962, plus another 5,842 in 1963 before the model was canceled. These clean examples still wear their original paint and are rust-free. The turbo mill was not offered in base F-85 or Cutlass models. Pity, we'd dig a turbo F-85 two-door post-sleeper with radio and heater delete.



Talk about a rare emblem—this thing would fetch a small fortune on eBay. Jetfire owners had to keep an underhood reservoir bottle filled with Olds Turbo-Rocket fluid (distilled water spiked with alcohol to prevent freezing). Olds engineers fitted the turbocharged 215 with 10.25:1 pistons to enhance low-rpm cylinder pressure and crutch turbo lag. The water-injection system helped control detonation at the 5-psi maximum boost level.



Though the turbo system is missing, the rare passenger-side turbo feed exhaust manifold is still present. The arrow points to a homemade metal block-off plate bolted over the feed hole. It was not uncommon for Jetfire owners to replace the turbo equipment with naturally aspirated two- or four-barrel carburetion induction at the first sign of trouble.



The Turbo-Rocket 215 was only available in the Jetfire two-door hardtop model and is verified by the exclusive use of style code 3147 on the cowl tag. This unlucky pair of real-deal 3147s both have the optional (\$189.00) Hydramatic slushbox. A three-speed stick was standard until a four-speed became optional in 1963. Want to save 'em? GROOVY FACTOIDS

- In 1963, Olds redesigned the compact F-85 lineup with 4 inches of extra body length and a squared-off look, but the 112-inch wheelbase remained unchanged.
- After its discontinuation in 1963, GM sold the manufacturing rights and tooling for the 215-inch aluminum V-8 to British Leyland, which used it in Range Rover SUVs until only a few years ago.
