TECH TIPS

Editor: This caught my eye from the December West Florida 'Chronic Corvair' Newsletter. I'm just getting ready to attempt this very thing!

Re-Keying Lock Cylinders By Les Huckins, CORSA West

This is very well covered in shop manuals, but very few seem to try it, feeling it requires greater expertise than the average mechanic possesses. It doesn't. It is easy. I offer here only a few hints should you decide to take on the task from a cold start.


I've had several cars wherein the luggage compartment cylinder was either missing, or had been mangled somewhere along the line, and was now keyed to a non-original key. Where you have several cars (who doesn't?) and carry a lot of keys, the extras are not welcome. It is also nice to have the stock configuration of one key fitting all lock cylinders (for early models).

The first thing to do is to place your key against the key diagram in the shop manual to see what tumblers you need, using the YBNC coding. The next thing is to dig up some old lock cylinders and extract the tumblers. Per the book, you will note that there are four different tumblers (YBNC), the difference being in the height of the notch in the side. If you can pick them by eye, great, but I get one of each size by comparing notches. I turn one over and compare it to another I think is the same size. If it is, it makes a prefect little square. If it isn't, it's the next size up or down, and becomes the comparator for that size. When I have all four sizes separated into groups, I pick out those I need for my key and insert them in the cylinder. Put the springs and retainer in place and insert key to make sure that the locking bar retracts properly just below the surface of the cylinder. If all is well, stake lightly per the book.

Since you probably have a couple of spare cylinders by now, do one of two things: set up a practice cylinder to make sure of your keying, or better yet, set up the complete cylinder, so that you can slip it in your car when you get ready, that way you can save the old cylinder and keys for when you might need them in another situation.

Editor: I've seen this article in several newsletters as well as the Communiqué.

We are always learning new things about Corvairs – this concerns the fuel pump retaining bolt, which you tighten when installing the pump (and then tighten the lock nut). There were apparently two different designs of these bolts used, I have yet to determine why or when the change was made. This is the problem: one design (no marking on the head) has a longer,




slimmer taper and a sharper point. This design allows the point to contact the bottom of the hole in the pump before the sides touch the tapered hole, resulting in all the pressure being exerted against the thin bottom of the pump casting hole. Two problems are possible with this design bolt, the pump will loosen up and the steel bolt will wallow out the hole or the original attempt to tighten the bolt or follow up attempts to tighten it will punch through the casting and lock up the fuel pump push rod. The second design bolt has an "L" stamped on the head and appears to work perfectly. Check your bolt

head with a mirror; if the "L" is present, you are fine with normal tightening of the bolt. If you have the bolt with no marking, either find the other design bolt or remove your current bolt and cut about 1/8" off of the end. Dress up the edges and reinstall.



The Preventative Maintenance Series

The following list of items to check before taking a trip are suggestions for all Corvairs in general. Remember that even long trips are usually less than the mileage between a single oil change. Serviced properly, your Corvair will cruise to all of this summer's events and back - and be happier for it!

- 1. Check or clean & pack all four wheel bearing assemblies, and check & lube the 2 or 4 U-joints. Check front end parts and lube the fittings.
- 2. Have tires balanced and aligned if necessary. Before trips, check all five tire pressures and tighten lug nuts with the tool you use to change a tire.
- 3. Check or change all fluids: oil, transmission, differential, brake fluid, washer fluid and battery level if possible. Synthetic Powerglide fluid is a very good idea.
- 4. Check the oil pressure sending unit and change this inexpensive item if you do not know its history.
- 5. Check the engine tune, and include cleaning the crankcase vents. Check the breaker plate in the distributor, lube the distributor cam and inspect the electrical connections such as the primary coil wires, alternator wires (no generators allowed) and multi-connectors. Check carburetor inlet nuts for leaks.
- 6. Check the battery date, cable ends, ground cable mount and check the overall charging system with the lights and accessories on maximum.
- 7. REMOVE the belt and check the condition of the entire length. Spin all three pulleys and lube anything questionable. Tools are available to grease the fan and idler bearing.
- 8. Check all running lights, check the fuse block for rust, check the large connector in early model engine compartments, check warning light operation.
- 9. If air conditioned, blow out the condenser, check the mounts and belt, check the evaporator drain, and re move the lower shrouds for better cooling.
- 10. Check the harmonic balancer, and if it is original, replace it! Be sure to check the fuel pump mount, they do work loose. To be safe with the increasing ethanol additions, you should have a new Airtex pump with the green paint spot.
- 11. Lube your late clutch cable ball and look for frayed cable between the two pulleys under the dash on early models also check parking cables in the same area..
- 12. Check brakes; wheel cylinders, shoes, master cylinder (push rod leak), and most important, the steel and rubber lines. Give your car the "stomp test" in the driveway. Steel lines above the gas tank and next to the transaxle are the most prone to rust, with tunnel lines next.

Be aware of any speedometer error you may have and know your oil consumption rate. Test drive 15 minutes on the highway on a hot day, pack up and head out!

If you have questions about the above items, call me. I have tech sheets, tools and encouragement free for the asking. Spares and tools? My favorites would be a belt, a new fuel pump, one rocker arm with pushrod and valve cover gasket, one 30 amp fuse, a set of points and condenser, oil as required, tools for these items, and a CORSA Travel Roster.

Is it ever going to warm up? Your editor spent the last two weeks commuting between Savannah, GA. and Anderson, SC. Mud and snow in Anderson, and mud and nice weather in Savannah. No wonder I have this cold! I had a nice rental car though, a Pontiac G6. It's a little 2 door sports car, so it made all that driving fun.

The '66 got a rest from her daily grind. She spent one week at the airport under her cover, then two weeks in the driveway while I was in the G6. Still haven't fixed the last of the leaks in the top, but it's supposed to be nice this weekend, so that job will get done.

I got my new seat covers in, and have moved the Sebring seats into the basement to start recovering them. I need to clean the tan seat belts I got and then get them installed in the seats first. I also have a Sebring back seat, and need to figure out how to get that to mate with the Corvair seat frames. Look for a tech article soon.

Here's a fuel pump tip for you. A fuel pump I purchased last July began to leak about a month ago. I had a hard time pinpointing what the problems was because it seemed to happen when it was dark, pouring rain or driving snow (or all three). It seemed to stop as quickly as it began. When it happened in the driveway the other morning I found the problem. The screws that hold the pump together had loosened. Looking back on the problem it happened when the car was cold. When cold, the pump would leak. When the car warmed up the metal expanded enough the leak stopped. The screws finally loosened up enough it leaked all the time. It might be a good winter/summer maintenance item to go around and tighten screws and bolts around the engine. Aluminum and steel have different expansion and contraction rates when affected by temperature. This

contraction rates when affected by temperature. This is a practice I've done for years at work with in instrumentation wiring, I just never thought about it happening on a car.

<u>From the Editor:</u>

Has Spring finally arrived? The last few days have been perfect spring weather. I've been catching up on the honey do list since I got back from my travels last Friday. Will soon get back to work on the car interior.

There comes a time in every vintage car owner's life where the vehicle they spend so much time fixing up and working on lets them down. It happened to me a few weeks ago when the '66 left me stranded in a parking lot I was lucky enough to be able to coast in to. I had noticed a problem with the accelerator, but didn't have the time to jack up the car and take a look during the week. Before the weekend came, the nut that is welded to the floor under the back seat came loose. It totally rusted out. This nut holds the bolt that holds the linkage that transfers the motion of the accelerator pedal to the next linkage on the side of the transmission.

The wife tried her hand at towing me home, about a mile, but when the rope broke, she was done. Thanks to Russ for coming in to Hoover and steering the car while I pulled it to the house.

That's about all the work on the car that I've done since the last newsletter, and the new seats are still waiting to be recovered. I put the top down when taking the back seat out to start cleaning up the frame. When I put the top back up, the back window split clear across. Looks like a new top is in my future also.

The club has obtained permission to use the facilities at Fullness Christian Fellowship church for their meetings after our rent at the library has run out, probably starting in July. The cost to the club will be the same as what we currently pay the library.

The church is located at 2575 Columbiana Rd. From I-65 take the Hwy 31 exit in Hoover. If coming from I-65 south, just cross Hwy 31 from the exit ramp and you are on Columbiana. If coming from the north on I-65 turn left on Hwy 31, go under the freeway and turn left at the light.

REPAIRING THAT RUSTED OUT NUT UNDER THE BACK SEAT (Accelerator bracket)




Here's the nut, and the bolt that screws into it. The weld on the nut is still intact. It had rusted around the outside of the weld. This nut is in a recess on the floor board; a natural place for water to collect. (Think convertible)

As you can see in the photo above, the bolt is 'special'. It has a 7/16" shank and a 5/16x 18 threads. It is 1 7/16" long.

My replacement is a grade 5, 7/16" bolt that is 2" long. I filed around the shank, just below the head so a washer would fit snug against the head of the bolt. The shank on the 7/16 x 2 bolt is the same length as the shank on the original bolt. This gives the linkage the same amount of space to ride on when installed.



Underside of Floor board




I used a 'threaded' washer to lock the linkage in place on the shank of the bolt. Use a washer a size smaller than the bolt, file it out a little so it will just start on the threads, then screw it down on the bolt to thread it. A half thickness nut would probably work better, and I'll do that to mine next time I'm under the car. (I didn't have another nut in my nuts and bolts can!)

The other washers are for spacers, and the large washer against the floor board is to give support around the rusted area.

The bolt was a little long, and I'll cut it off after I get the washer and bottom nut welded to the floor. I might leave the double nut on, just for that warm fuzzy feeling.

All the stuff can be purchased at any hardware store, so if you are stranded on the road by this, if you can get under the car, you can fix it and get on your way with only a couple of wrenches and a couple of bucks.



Finally we headed in to town to look for some lunch and found a pizza place that looked OK. I figured a couple slices and a couple of beers and the rain would be gone.



While we didn't measure the height before the job, afterwards the car was 24 ½ inches floor to top of wheel well at the back. Here's before and after shots, note how level the car sits

Carburetor Cross Shaft Rebuild - Richard Stolzmann

As you can see by the pictures, the carburetor cross shaft was terribly worn. The groove in the shaft holds a clip.





I heated the end arms, the ones at each end that are brazed on and removed them one at a time; they are 180 degrees from each other. I did one at a time so I would not lose the reference position.

I then slid the bracket off that bolts to the carburetor. Its hole was oval shaped. I brazed the hole about closed, then drilled it to the cross linkage shaft diameter.







I built up the worn shaft by brazing it; then sanded it with my inch belt sander till the bracket that bolts to the carburetor slid freely on the built up brass.

I then brazed the fixed end arm, making sure it was 180 degrees out from the other end. I then did the other end the same way. Needless to say 99 percent of the slop was gone. Also the bearing surface area of the bracket that the shaft turns in was greatly increased.



cam was in time. I then suspected that when I had adjusted the valves, which I did with the engine stopped, I had adjusted them too tight and they weren't closing. Well I adjusted with the engine running and it didn't help.

As I was wondering what to do next I saw what was wrong. The rubber hose from the carburetor balance tube was open to outside air. As soon as I plugged it up the engine settled down and idled perfect at the recommended timing. I have had vacuum leaks before, but never a large one that caused such a bad idling problem!!



THE PRESIDENT'S COLUMN:

OK, the end of the month kind of snuck up on me. I attended my first meeting at our new location, Fullness Christian Fellowship church, where our editor John Cleveland attends. It is a nice facility and of course we did the most important thing first which was to eat, and the food was excellent.

Russ gave a tech session on all years of carburetors and explained the physical differences and how to tell one year from another. I did a tech session on dissembling the 66 - 69back up switch. I went beyond the new board with the new contacts and showed how to take the switch apart and take the plunger and springs out. I found out on the rebuilt switches that they might work a few times when reinstalled, but then again fail. It's because of the phenolic insert which is supposed to slide on the shaft after the plunger is depressed by the transmission being in reverse and takes up any over travel. Well years of accumulation of a varnish like substance on the shaft will cause it to stick in the retracted position and thereafter will not work. I found if I soak the inside of the switch with WD40 over night it will allow it to work OK most of the time. If it doesn't, it means the switch must be completely dissembled and the varnish taken off the shaft. In one case I had to enlarge the hole in the sliding part as it was still too tight on the shaft.



Shift Stabilizer Rod/Bracket Alignment '66 4 Speed

Note the slots in the bracket for adjustment.

This bracket must be at a 90 degree angle to the shift stabilizer rod in both the horizontal and vertical planes. Shims may be needed if the bracket is bent from the 90 degree vertical.

This keeps the stabilizer rod aligned which prevents downward pressure on the coupler/transmission shaft. This downward pressure will prematurely wear out the seal in the transmission, as well as the pin that holds the coupler to the transmission shaft.



Thanks to Heart of Georgia Corvair for a great time!





Chevrolet exploded the Corvair product line for 1961 with the addition of two pick-up trucks, the Loadside and the Rampside. The Corvair 95 trucks' name came from their 95-inch wheelbase and featured a two-door cab. Because the load floor of the truck had to be raised to accommodate the rear-mounted engine, Chevrolet offered an alternative to the traditionally tail-gated Loadside with the

which offered a
hinged ramp
that opened off

side of the truck
bed. Rubber
trim kept the
paint from
scratching, and
the Rampside
was favored by
anyone who hauled rolling

cargo.

Model A Restoration by Loren Cleveland

Back in the late 1940s I saw this 1931 Model A Sport Coupe running around town. It belonged to Lile Hugaboom, a long time citizen of Buffalo (OK). He was a house painter and used it for a paint vehicle. The paint was faded as was the rag top, the fenders had big splits in them.

It disappeared for several years. Mr. Hugaboom's son, Bob, who lived if Ft Supply had it and he was driving it.

In the late sixties Bob Hugaboom moved three doors north of us and the Model A was in the back yard covered with a tarp. (Editor's note: It wasn't under that tarp much. I remember when I was little, playing in the car, and I know the neighborhood kids younger than I all used to play in it after I got too 'grown up'.)

It set there for about fifteen years and I started thinking about buying it and restoring it. Bob was not interested in selling it. About 1979 Mom and I were driving down the alley and I told her that I would sure like to have that car. We went by again in a few weeks and the car was gone. I said,"Well it looks like Bob had sold the car to someone else". I had missed the boat.

December first came along, my birthday, and lo and behold the care was dragged down to our house. Mom had talked to Bob and he had finally decided to sell it to her.

I put it in the garage and went through it making a list of parts it needed. It was a basket case. At that time there were several companies selling parts for it. There was not enough room in my garage to work so I bought an old building that had been a Ford dealership.

Twenty one years later, in my spare time I had it restored with a little help from my neighbor. I enjoyed restoring it. I could go down there and work on it for an hour or two, or several hours and there were times I did not work on it for weeks. I really enjoyed rebuilding it more than I do driving it. It is hard for me to drive with my bad feet and there is not much room in the cab.




