



CHEESE STRAWS

1 block of (8oz) Cracker Barrel extra sharp cheddar cheese 1 stick real butter (I use salted)

1 - ½ cups self rising flour

 $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp salt

1 tsp cayenne pepper (I use heaping...adjust for taste)

1-2 tsp water (this sounds ridiculous, but it helps it flow out of the cookie press)

Put cheese and butter on counter for at LEAST 4 hours. Add first 5 ingredients to mixer (KitchenAid with dough hook attachment), cutting cheese and butter into small chunks. If you grate the cheese, that is better but it means you have too much time on your hands! Mix on low until it looks pretty homogeneous – about 2-3 minutes. Shift to the next gear if you need to – briefly. Add the water about halfway. Load into cookie press and squeeze out long rows on ungreased cookie sheet. Bake 13-14 minutes at 350F. Let cool a couple of minutes, then use a dull knife to 'chop' the straws into 3" or so sections. Store in non-airtight container like a tin.

Bon Appetite!

Hints:

Do NOT use an 'air bake' cookie sheet. Use a flat, darker type, old fashioned sheet.

A kitchenAid is a Must! While one sheet is cooking, press the next batch of rows onto a second sheet.

Beware of overcooking!

VCE Tech Tip

Sure it is February and 'Old Man Winter' is in full force, and yes we will be going to Pensacola Beach for the Corvair Lovers Holiday. But just around the corner, I for one, will be looking for some A/C in my '66 coupe. **Corsa chapter 004** is a 'Virtual' club that is solely dedicated to Air Conditioning the Chevrolet Corvair. Hence the name of the club; "AIR VAIR GROUP". They can be found on the web at: http://www.corvair.org/chapters/airvair

For those who receive only the printed Oil Drop, following is for your reading pleasure: Ed.

Chevrolet took another big gamble when they developed and offered the Air Conditioning system for the Corvair. Unusual design was required by the need for sufficient air movement thru the condenser and the result was a very strange looking installation, to say the least.

When the Corvair was first made available with A/C in the Spring of 1961 the base price of a Monza Club Coupe was \$2201.00 So the Air Conditioning added around 16% to the cost of the car!! About 1% of the buyers stepped up - about 3000 Air 'Vairs in 1961. The percentage increased in 1962 to a whopping 2.5%! This was the Corvair's best sales year with 306,000 cars sold, so around 7,650 Air 'Vairs were created. 1963 was also a great year for the Corvair with over 254,000 made and again about 2.5% or 6641 had cool drivers and passengers.

1964 saw some major mechanical changes to the Corvair with the engine displacement stroked to 164 cu. in. with the result of about a 20% power gain and the rear suspension revised to improve ride and handling. But Americans were used to a *New Look* every year, and Corvairs were in there fourth year with only minor trim variations to tell the cars apart - Why buy a new car when your neighbors can't tell?? As a result, another 50,000 drop in sales to under 200,000 but the increased power brought out more A/C buyers at 3.2% produced, 6401 more cool ones added to the pool.

The Nova, the boring compact introduced to take over the 'econo market' for Chevrolet after they realized they were making a sports sedan, not a economy car, * was re-skinned in much the same fashion a Falcon was de-feathered and made into a Mustang. The result was of course the ever popular Camaro. This meant that the Corvair was on the way OUT!! on April of 1965, GM management declared "no more development of the Corvair model, except to meet safety and emissions regulations." Fortunately lead time was in our favor, for the engineers had already been at work improving an already great thing, For 1966 several changes in the mechanics took place, and Lo and Behold the 140 sprouted A/C!!! The even bigger news to A/C fans is - they finally got the darn condenser off of the engine!!! It was moved to its final resting place in the front of the engine compartment, where it received all of the incoming air. Finally - you could actually change a belt without a mechanical degree.

*In 1963 the Corvair Monza beat the Chevy II and all others in the class for best mileage!!

As an additional benefit, the C-64 option became available on the top of the line Corsa model in its final year.

But time was working against our wonder car - no amount of glowing reports in the motoring press would turn the tide. Just 103,743 Corvairs were built in what many believe to be Corvairs finest year, but again, A/C percentage was up - this time to 4.61% - adding another 4,780 air 'Vairs.

This brings up the subject of Rare Corvairs - The Air 'Vair fan has one of the rarest - only about 150 were Corsas!

1967 was the beginning of the end. The Corsa was no more - The Camaro needed no competition from inside! A few more safety modifications were about it, and to start the year, the 140 was dropped from the options list. Corvair fans clamored and GM listened. So the RPO L63 140 hp engine was again available - until the end. A mere 27,253 Corvair tokens were produced - just using up the tooling and sticking it to Ralph, no doubt. The cool ones stepped up at 5.12% to add another 1,396 to close the list.

In all there were 36,555 Corvairs produced with RPO C64 Air Conditioning. A mere 2% of the total production of around 1.7 million Corvair cars. A few more were installed by venturesome mechanics at Chevy dealerships and those wild and crazy Corvair enthusiasts have added their talents to the pool. Bottom Line is, however, it is rare to see air conditioning in a Corvair


Especially when they had to retool the body metal for the side marker lights and add a bunch on engineering changes to deal with tightening emissions and safety standards!

Just for comparison - Chevrolet built about 6000 full size Chevys a DAY in 1969!

Blast From The Past:

The story of "Rescue #921"

(a reprint from the San Diego Corvair website)

On Jan 29, 1992, a group of individuals called the OF's (known by some as the "Old Fellows") from the San Diego Corvair Club (SDCC) met for breakfast as they always did on Tuesday mornings at the Country Comfort Restaurant in Spring Valley, CA. This was an activity that was started sometime ago by some of the SDCC members whereby some of the old timers would get together and talk about Corvairs and how the SDCC could improve itself with various types of activities for the members of the SDCC. Those present were: Harold Hilton (deceased), Ray Moore (deceased), Larry Scrivener, Marsh



Hesler, Will DeMastes, Clarence Halvorson, John Evans, Mickey Chiara and Jim Stansbury (who was president of the SDCC at the time). The subject of activities came up and they felt that they had to have an activity that would bind the club together and let the younger members learn about the Corvairs. There were quite a few young Club members at that time. They discussed getting a convertible and restoring it for the 1994 Great Western Fan Belt Toss & Swap Meet, which is held in Palm Springs every year in November. Someone at the meeting threw out the subject of using a specially converted Corvair Van for road trips that would have parts, tools and information to help anyone with a Corvair that was having trouble on our Club trips. That idea sounded good and imaginations starting going wild and the birth of Resq921 (which had not been named yet) was born. There were three vans donated: a blue one from Larry's Corvairs in Gardena, Ca; a black and white one from Marsh Hesler and an orange one (donor unknown). The Van from Larry's Corvairs was selected as the one to restore and outfit with various tools and parts. The Van from Larry's was parked in the back lot of his establishment in Gardena, CA and was use for shelter for a homeless man. Larry indicated that he had other vehicles the man could be moved into. On April 7th, 1992 the OF's headed for Larry's Corvair Parts, trailer in tow, to pick up the 1964 Corvair van. Those in attendance moved the homeless man to another vehicle and the Van was loaded and transported back to San Diego, CA. The van was taken to Larry Scrivener's house in El Cajon, CA, and put on jack stands to start the renovation process. A name had to be decided on for the van and after much discussion, the van was named "Rescue 921". The "921" in the name was used because the SDCC is Chapter 921 of CORSA (Corvair Society of America) of Lemont, IL. By May 1992, most of the bodywork and preparation for paint was completed. During this same period, the interior was gutted and the under carriage was stripped of various parts to be overhauled. In addition, an engine was rebuilt to replace the original engine that was in the van. The Van was moved to Jim Stansbury's house in Chula Vista, CA, until such time it could be taken to the paint shop. The van was taken to "All American Paint & Body Inc in San Diego, CA the end of Jun 92. It was decided to paint the Van white with blue trim at the bottom and red and blue pin stripping. The Van looked superb. After getting the van back from the paint shop, all of the exterior items that were removed for restoration had to be re-installed. That was completed in Sep 92 and the next chore was to install the interior that had been impeccably restored to like new condition. The interior cabinets were make by Trent White and donated to the club. By Oct 92, the interior of the van was complete. In Nov 1992, Rescue 921 was ready for the road. A successful road test was completed and Rescue 921 went into service. There were so many people to thank for their efforts, money and sweat that the only way to show our appreciation was to get the Van on the road and show it off. Rescue 921 was first shown at the 1994 Great Western Fan Belt Toss & Swap Meet in Palm Springs, CA. Strange as it may seem, the first car that was rescued by Resq921 was a Corvette no less. At least it was a General Motors Vehicle. The names of all the businesses, members, and persons that donated parts and money are on a placard located inside the Resq921. The Van carries a variety of parts, new and used, and a variety of tools. The van is used at all functions of the SDCC and other functions such as local area conventions and other local club activities. The van has rescued many disabled Corvairs that have broken down in one way or another. Rescue 921 is admired wherever it goes by all car enthusiasts and even the public. The OF's are to be applauded for completing such a task, knowing that the van would be a "one-ofkind". The OF's still meet on Tuesday morning to have breakfast and then go to work on a Corvair that needs some loving care. They still do the required maintenance on Resg921 and repair any problems that may be necessary to keep Rescue 921 in top performance and ready to go at any given time.

Editors NOTE: As Russ and I were returning from the Corvair Performance Workshop, we were discussing FCs and their various configurations. While out west, he remembered the Rescue 921 story. We agreed it would be good to "retell" it in this month's Oil Drop.

CORVAIR WAS A BIT RUSTY

1960 CHEVROLET CORVAIR FEROZ KHAN • TROY, MICHIGAN

n 1966, I saw a 1960 Chevrolet Corvair in the classifieds at a bargain price, so I called the seller and arranged to see it the next day. After I took the car for a ride, we agreed on a price of \$450.

For the first month or so, my Corvair was great. I drove it to work every day and loved listening to pop songs on the radio. Then one day it rained. When I got home, I noticed that one of my pant legs was wet, which puzzled me.

The next day I looked down and saw a small hole next to my right foot, near the accelerator pedal. My buddy Joe said, "Man! You're in trouble. Your car has rusted through!" That shocked me at first, but as far as I was concerned, the car just had a little rust problem.

Then one day the windshield wiper on the driver's side quit working. My friend Vakar went to work with me, and since the wiper on the passenger side still worked, he would guide me if it rained hard, giving me hints like "Move over to the left—you're not in your lane."

Not long after that, the engine began revving even when I took my foot off the gas. The hinges on the accelerator pedal had rusted and it wouldn't come up. So I started driving with both feet. To slow down, I put my right foot underneath the accelerator to lift it up and used the other to brake.

A friend offered another brilliant suggestion: Drill a hole in the gas pedal, slip a string through it, tie a handle to the other end of the string and hang it near my window. That way I could use my left hand to lift the gas pedal and my right hand to steer as I applied the brakes. Using all my limbs to drive felt like something out of a Three Stooges routine.

When I quit my job, I no longer needed a car and tried to give the Corvair to friends, but no one wanted it. In 1968, the car was towed away after a snowstorm. I still have fond memories of that Chevy, though. Who can ever forget their first car?



Blast From The Past:

DAY CAME TOO SOON, TIME POOR, BABY 'BEAUTIFUL'

(a reprint from the April 1976 Vulcan Corvair Enthusiasts Newsletter article, 37 years ago this month.)

The pickup truck was barreling down I-59 Tuesday night, but Mrs. Sandra Stolzmann knew she and her husband would never make it to the hospital. —There was no way we could make it in time," she recalled. —The pains got so frequent and severe by the time we got to the Trussville exit I knew it was time."

Mrs. Stolzmann groaned as she slumped in the seat. Her husband glancing one moment at the road, the next at his wife telling her —You can do it honey, I know you can.

She was having a baby – her fourth. Earlier that day, Mrs. Stolzmann's doctor had told here it would be at least two weeks before the baby would come.

But Tuesday night I began having pains as if something was going to happen and it did happen – just as he was calling the doctor," recalled Mrs. Stolzmann. — told him something like _his is it' and we jumped into the pickup and headed for the hospital.

The Stolzmanns lime in Springville in St. Clair County and were headed for St. Vincent's in Birmingham.

Mrs. Stolzmann, telling herself, —can do this" turning around in the narrow seat of the pickup as it sped down the highway through the night. She leaned back against her husband and put her feet up on the door.


I pressed down about three times real hard, and it was over in probably less than a minute," she said. —Richard started to stop and help, but I told him to keep driving — keep heading for the hospital.

Mrs. Stolzmann laid the baby, a little girl – the doctor had predicted a boy – on her stomack. But the baby lay very still. —It was so quiet it scared us," said Mrs. Stolzmann. Richard Stolzmann touched her head and gently ran his fingers up and down her back and suddenly, she began crying and she didn't stop until we got to the hospital.

Antoinette weighed six pounds and 14 ounces. Baby and mother are doing great. Father probably still is a little shaky.

PORK & BLACK BEAN CHILI VERDE

This month's recipe submitted by John Cleavland

(6 to 8 servings)

The recipe uses habanero chile. You can substitute one Scotch Bonnet or three Serrano chiles for the habanero, or omit it altogether. (I don't use any of them)

1 ½ cups dried black beans (about 10 ozs.), picked over and rinsed.

4 medium pablano chiles

4 medium cubanelle chiles (I have never been able to find these chiles. I substitute dried chiles, which I will list below)

3 medium green bell peppers

1 medium habanero chile (Caution: If you use any of the very hot varieties of chile, use rubber gloves to handle them. Rubbing your eyes or skin with juice from these chiles can put you in the emergency room. Be Careful!!)

1 pound fresh spinach, stemmed

10 medium tomatillos – husked, rinsed and quartered. (If you don't like the tomatillo taste, only use 8. They will influence the final chile)

5 scallions, coarsely chopped

1 meaty ham hock

2 bay leaves

3 tablespoons cooking oil (vegetable, olive)

2 pounds trimmed boneless pork shoulder or butt, cut into 1 inch cubes. (I use boneless pork cutlets. You will get a better quality of meat and it cuts down on the prep time tremendously)

Salt and fresh ground black pepper

1 medium onion, finely chopped

6 garlic cloves, minced

1 tablespoon sugar (I don't use this)

1 tablespoon ground cumin (I use two or three)

1 cup finely chopped fresh coriander leaves (cilantro)

- 1. Place black beans in a medium sauce pan and add 6 cups of water. Bring to a boil over moderately high heat and boil for 3 minutes. Remove from the heat and let stand for 1 hour.
- 2. Meanwhile, roast the pablanos, cubanelles, bell peppers and habanero under the broiler as close to the heat as possible or over a gas flame, turning frequently, until blackened all over. Transfer them to a paper bag and let steam for 10 minutes. Peel the chiles and peppers under running water and remove the cores, seeds and ribs. Drain and pat dry. Place them all in a food processor or blender with the spinach, tomatillos and scallions and puree until smooth. (NOTE: If you are using dried chiles, soak them in boiling water in a covered pot, off the heat, for 10 or 15 minutes until soft. Remove the stems and seeds and add to the blender)
- 3. Drain the black beans and return them to the saucepan. Add the ham hock, bay leaves and 6 more cups of water. Bring to a boil over moderately high heat. Cover and simmer over low heat until the beans are tender, about 1 ½ hours. Drain the beans, reserving 1 cup of the liquid; discard the bay leaves. Remover the meat from the ham hock, cut it into ¾ inch pieces and set aside.
- 4. Heat 2 tablespoons of the oil in a large enameled cast iron casserole (or whatever you make your big batches of stew or soup in). Season the pork cubes with salt and pepper. Add some of the meat to the casserole in a single layer and cook over high heat until well browned all over, about 5 minutes. Transfer the cooked pork to a plate and brown the remaining meat in batches.
- 5. Heat the remaining 1 tablespoon of oil in the casserole. Add the onion and garlic and cook over moderate heat, stirring occasionally, until translucent, about 3 minutes.
- 6. Return the browned pork to the casserole with the chile and spinach puree, sugar, cumin and 1 teaspoon alt. Bring to a boil over moderately high heat. Lower the heat and simmer gently until the meat is very tender, about 2 hours. Stir in the black beans and cubed ham with the reserved cooking liquid.

My modifications:

Since I can't find cubanelle peppers anywhere, I substitute a variety of dried peppers from the market. If you have access to a market that specializes in Mexican products, they usually have a better selection of both fresh and dried varieties. I use dried chipotle for heat instead of the habenero. They provide more flavor to the finished chile, besides adding heat. Dried pablanos are called anchos, and I use them in my chile also. They are common in most markets, and they provide a smoky flavor to the chile without adding much heat. You can also find other dried peppers to try in the chile. Test them for heat first by tasting, and after a while you'll come up with a mixture of fresh and dried chile to suit your taste. I don't use Anaheim chiles, though you can. They will add heat, so adjust accordingly. I also add a dried spice mixture called Menudo Mix. It is available in most grocery stores in the Mexican food section in the dried spices. It will add some heat, but its mixture of spices provides added flavor. It is also good in soups, stews, taco meat, eggs and just about everything else that needs a punch. I use between a teaspoon and a tablespoon, depending on how many wimps will be eating my chile. Enjoy.




Fan Belt Removal Tool. On page 4 of Clark's Tool catalog you can purchase the special tool. Pictured is a way to make your own.

Other suggestions are:

Use a "shorty" 9/16's / 1/2 inch offset combo wrench.

- 1) Use a 3/8" fine-thread coupling nut instead of the standard nut. A coupling nut is about 2" long so it's easy to access with normal wrenches.
- 2) Use a rocker arm stud in place of the standard nut. Most who do this cut off the upper part of the stud.
- 3) If you can only find 3/8" coarse-thread coupling nuts, you can change the stud to coarse threads using a common exhaust manifold stud.






From The Editor:

Blast From The Past:

The Vulcan Corvair Enthusiasts (VCE) Story

(Transcribed from cassette tape enclosed with 35mm slides, some of which are included below.)

At first the only reason the club was formed was so that a mini convention could be held in Birmingham. This is how the story goes:



In 1972, Lee Miller bought his 1st Corvair and like many enthusiasts, he also joined CORSA. At that time there was a National Convention every year, but only a few mini conventions. In fact, it is believed that the recent boom in mini events, was a result of the success-



ful meet that was held in Birmingham. Anyway, Lee also had connections with NASCAR and the governing body at the Alabama Motor Speedway at Talladega. He believed how great it would be for CORSA members and their cars down to do a parade lap of the speedway at one of the Winston 500 races at Talladega. In August of 1972 he made a request to NASCAR with no reply. Again during the summer of 1973 another request was sent and this time it was approved by the Talladega staff. Next, Lee wrote to Dave





Nuell who was then president of CORSA, for help in setting up the

event. Dave's reply was, to attract members, a mini convention needed to be held in Birmingham with the main activity of course being the racing event. To have a convention of this type, one of two things had to be done. Either solicit help from nearby clubs, or form a club in Birmingham. Since there was no club in Birmingham. Lee began writing to the various organizations in Tennessee, Georgia, Florida and South Carolina. All answers were the same; "Sounds like a fantastic idea, and we will surely attend, but we just don't have the time, and/or manpower to help put on the event. Not to give up easily, Lee took the only route available. He ran a seven dollar ad in the Birmingham News. The result was over 20 Corvair Lovers meeting at Lane Park on a Sunday afternoon in June of 1974. This was the beginning of the VCE. In August of 1974 the members approved the idea of setting May of 1975 as the date. As with any new club there was business to be transacted. There were dues to be agreed upon. Meeting dates. Places and times to decide upon and officers to be elected. One main thing agreed on was that the dues should not be overly excessive. The club was to be for people who owned or loved Corvairs and not for people that were rich and owned Corvairs. On August 25th 1974 the 1st event sponsored by the club took place. The "Rally of the 'Vairs" was in Lime Run laid out in some scenic countryside in and around Birmingham. The event was lots of fun and a great success, even though it is rumored to this day that there are some members still out there trying to spot the elusive 'X' marks on the road. On April 10th 1975, the VCE car club was officially incorporated. The articles of incorporation listed 15 charter members. They were:

Lee Miller, Cathy Miller, David and Linda Muelle, James and Louise Ray, Don Godfrey, Alice Godfrey, Frank Ranelli, Sheila Ranelli, Jim Bibby, James Parker, WB Ennis, Dave Holder and Pat Runey. From these officers were chosen to serve the club. They were Lee Miller (Pres.) James Ray (Vice), David Bibby (2nd Vice), Alice Godfrey (Sec), Kathy Miller (Treas). From this 1st slate of officers and hard work of charter members, the club grew and prospered. In May of 1975, the culmination of a lot of hard work and dedication paid off. The 'Heart of Dixie' mini convention was held in Birmingham with some 200 cars and their owners in attendance. Some from as far away as California. (continued next page)

A parade lap was held at Talladega before the race and the Concourse was held in the infield during the race. The mini convention was such a success that today it serves as a measuring stick in judging other mini conventions. The VCE had succeeded in doing what no other club had been able to accomplish. Put on a successful mini convention and make money. With this very large feather in it's cap, the club members set to work again to make certain that the convention was not to be an end, but rather the beginning from which to build an even better club. A club design was developed and decals made of this design for members to proudly



display on their cars. Later a new design was approved and jacket patches were made using the new design. This has now become a proud sybol for a dedicated group of Corvair Enthusiasts. As it states in the constitution of the club: "The purpose of the club will be to encourage the preservation, ownership, operation, and enjoyment of all Corvair cars, trucks, and related vehicles. And to act as a source of technical information to establish rules and regulations covering all activities of the club. To provide and regulate events and exhibits of Corvairs and their owners. And to encourage careful and skillful driving on public thorough-




fares. With these purposes in mind, the club has been very active from the very beginning. With untiring efforts and dedication the members have conducted many events through the years. The club is family oriented with all members of each family encouraged and allowed to enjoy the activities. From the original 15 members the club has grown to over 50 members in just 4 short years. From the continued good efforts of our members, our club will continue to grow and prosper for many years to come. The mini convention is long over now, but the memories have stayed as well as one of the better organizations for Corvair owners. We salute The VCE!

Corvairs were so dominate at the show that the organizers created our own class which Russ won with his black '66 'vert.













Blast From The Past:

The "Claymobile" Story

Pictured on the right is the "Claymobile" in all it's purple glory, displayed at the Eastwood Mall, Birmingham Al. circa 1975. The Vulcan Corvair association with this car is that it was once owned (twice) by now deceased VCE member, Norman Rogers.

The Claymobile was the subject of some controversy over its origins, but also apparently of a theft that, to our knowledge, remains unsolved.

Jody Potter of The Birmingham

Jody Potter of The Birmingham News published this story and pictures, Sunday, June 28, 2009 and then updated the story after additional information on Thursday, May 13, 2010.



"The Claymobile has been stolen from its hiding place in Cullman County, Alabama! The customized 1965 Corvair convertible was rumored to have originally belonged to Cassius Clay. Clay, the boxing legend, changed his name to Muhammad Ali in 1964 so speculation arose as to why he would own the 'Claymobile' if his name had been changed. That being said, this one-of-a-kind car was taken from owner, Eric Lippert, off his property in Cullman, Alabama during the past week. Eric's father, Orville Lippert, collected Corvairs and left him the car when he died. Eric had plans to restore the car and eventually sell it, using the proceeds to fund his daughter's education and his retirement. He is desperately seeking help finding his car."

As mentioned in the article, "Claymobile" was a 1965 Chevrolet Corvair Corsa, that had been extremely customized and personalized. Even the tires had the words "Claymobile Corvair 1965".etched into the rubber .

Because of its name, and the legendary Cassius Clay (Muhammed Ali) the ad says it was built for the boxer and that surely was the sales pitch used by the "handyman" that advertised and offered the car for sale in the local press in Greenville, South Carolina for \$ 6,500. Note that it was then located in South Carolina, not Alabama, where it was rediscovered. Eric Lippert says that originally the "Claymobile" was canary yellow, and changed color after being acquired by his father, who painted it purple. He goes on to say that his father's car came to appear in the Playboy magazine, in a booklet of paintings and a TV Special on classic car collectors. (A cursory internet search for evidence of the claim was non productive. (*Ed.*)

Special Corvair Tool (\$2.00 Investment)

I have found the need for the use of a special tool. I have been cleaning Corvair oil coolers as I have built a couple of Corvair motors. The problem I have been trying to solve is cleaning the outside of the cooler – which can be pretty contaminated. It lives in the airflow of the motor and has many small areas that can be clogged

with various different types of crud. Any kind of bath or spray cleaner, if applied to the bare oil cooler, might contaminate the inside of the cooler, where (usually) clean oil has kept a clear path. What I needed was a tool that would cover the inlet and outlet on the cooler, allowing the outside to be cleaned off. As I removed the cooler, I noticed the standard Corvair part that the cooler bolts

onto. A pair of small, square seals are trapped in between. The adapter, in turn, bolts onto the driver's side of the Corvair case. It is casting # GM6255876 (I believe, hard to read). If you have had Corvair engines around your garage for a while, you will likely have one of these sitting around. If not, someone in your club will have one! In order to make the tool, I modi-

fied the casting by plugging up the casting on the side that bolts to the block. It is pretty simple. What you need is a pair of 1/4" NPT pipe plugs. (That is the \$2). The drilled holes on the back side of the adapter are about 7/16", perfect lead holes for the 1/4"NPT tap. I tapped both holes and screwed in the pipe plugs. That's it, but clean it out well before using it. Just bolt the oil filter on using the original seals and the original bolt (The bolt length depends on the size of the cooler – how many plates, etc.) Then you can spray or immerse the cooler in a cleaner without worrying about the inside of the cooler. Another use, this tool seals up the inside of the cooler as well. You could insert some kind of clean solvent into the cooler, shake it up and clean out the inside. - Seth Emerson

1960 Corvair Super Monza or 'Its Nice To Be The Boss's Daughter'

Chevrolet Enthusiast and the writer would like to thank Dave Newell for providing the research and first hand information about the Super Monza. Mr. Newell is considered the ultimate expert on this particular vehicle as well as Corvairs in general.

It was the fall of 1959 and Chevrolet was getting ready to produce the new Corvair. Chevrolet's designers had worked tirelessly to create a genuine small car and not just a shrunken big car. Not only was the Corvair a true compact car, it was Chevrolet's first rear engine air-cooled compact car. Initially a 500 and 700 series two-door and four-door sedan were to launch on October 2, 1959, however due to delays in design and development, the two-door was put on hold, leaving the four-door sedan as the only model available to the public. While working on the coupe design, three two-door prototype bodies were built at GM's Fisher Body division. The bodies were then sent to the Willow Run, Michigan plant for completion. One was to stay with Fisher in Warren for testing and hardware tryout. Another was sent to the GM Proving Grounds and the third was delivered to Chevrolet Engineering for a variety of testing. One of the prototype vehicles was later used to build a show car scheduled to be sent to Turin, Italy for the Turin Auto Show. The exterior was similar to the upcoming production car but was painted a beautiful pearlescent fawn and included a set of Dayton wire wheels. The interior was the focal point of the car. Tan custom-made leather bucket seats were made by cutting ten inches out of a center of a bench seat. Door panels were stitched leather and included integral courtesy lamps. Plush carpeting not only covered the floor but also made its way into the trunk area. It was now ready for Turin but for unknown reasons, never made it to Italy. While it had no formal name, the car became known as the Turin Monza. After doing cost analysis on the car, GM needed to dramatically lower production costs. The custom

interior was removed and replaced with low cost material similar to the production Corvair.


The lower cost Turin Monza was sent to

the Chicago Auto Show along with a similar Monza in the same color but with the luxurious interior of the early Turin car. The pair were dubbed the "Masculine" and "Feminine" or "Mr. And Mrs." Monzas and were an amazing success. Bill Mitchell loved the look of the pair and decided to design a custom coupe for his daughter.

Mitchell's daughter Lynne was turning 16 years old on March 23, 1960. Being a good dad and in a position of doing almost whatever he wanted to at GM, he procured an early production (built during the second week of February) series 700 coupe to customize and give to his daughter for her birthday. With little time to spare, the car was delivered to Flint for updates. The reason for sending it to Flint was because development costs could stay under the radar of the accounting department.

When completed, the coupe known as the Super Monza, named by *Motor Trend Magazine*, was an example of Mitchell's vision. Dad knew his daughter's favorite color was blue, and a special pearlescent blue paint was applied to the body. The quarter panels included twin functional air scoops designed to cool the rear brakes. The scoops were accented with bright trim. A special Corvair script was applied to each quarter panel and each door included a hand cast chrome ring with the letters "NLM", for Nancy Lynne Mitchell, inside the ring. Custom-made rocker moldings and a special rear grille added to the sporty look. Special hubcaps were designed with her initials "LM" in the center. The interior received massive revisions based on the "Feminine" Monza. A power driver seat was added and the seats were covered in custom leather and deep pile carpeting gave the







On March 23rd, while Bill's wife took Lynne for her driver's license, Ned Nickle, head of Advance One Studio and Bill delivered the car to the house. Unfortunately, because of bad weather, it was dirty from the trip. Bill and Ned grabbed the hose and rags and gave the car a quick car wash just before Lynne came home. She immediately fell in love with it.

Unfortunately Lynn was able to use the car for only a few weeks because it was set to appear at the New York Auto Show. After the show, the car was returned to Lynne, However unknown to Mitchell, Ed Cole, General Manager of Chevrolet, had other plans for the car. He wanted to give it

to Richard Reynolds, President of Reynolds Metal, and a good friend and fishing partner. Reynolds Metals was to supply a large amount of aluminum to the Chevrolet division and had invested many millions of dollars in building a new plant.

The car stayed within the Reynolds family for many years and was later given to the Central Virginia Chapter of CORSA. They later donated it to the Corvair Preservation Foundation (CPF). After restoration by Cecil Miller and Jeff Barrett the car was put on display at CPF's Corvair Museum at the Ypsilanti Automotive Museum in Ypsilanti, Michigan and was featured at the 2014 Convention in Kalamazoo, Michigan.







Blast From The Past

The Ernie Kovacs Corvair

."Nothing in moderation – We all loved him." Thus, the death of Ernie Kovacs some 50 years ago still rocks those in American film and television who view Kovacs as one of the greatest American comedians of all time. It was in the early morning hours of Jan. 13, 1962, that Kovacs, 42, was killed in a car accident while driving home from a baby shower given by Billy Wilder for Milton Berle and his wife, who had recently adopted a three-year-old boy. Kovacs and his wife, the singer Edie Adams, were driving home separately from the baby shower at about 2 a.m. when "a light southern California rainstorm hit, and Kovacs lost control of his Chevrolet Corvair station wagon while turning fast, and crashed into a power pole at the corner of Beverly Glen and Santa Monica Boulevards," stated a page one report in all major U.S. newspapers at the time. Ironically, his daughter – Mia Susan Kovacs – died at the age of 23 on May 8, 1982, when she too was fatally injured after her car ran off the shoulder of a road and crashed in Los Angeles. Miss Kovacs was thrown through the sunroof of her car, a friend of the family said.

At the time of Kovacs death, his close friend and fellow comedian Lucille "Lucy" Ball said, "We lost a real genius."

Jan. 13, 1962 -- the fact that "Kovacs may have lost control of his car while trying to light a cigar," fascinated his fans since Kovacs was as famous for always smoking a cigar as Jack Benny was for playing his violin. For instance, Hollywood newspapers pointed to a photographer who managed to arrive at Kovacs car crash scene. In turn, image



of Kovacs in death appeared in newspapers across the U.S., with "an unlit cigar laying on the pavement inches from his outstretched arm."

As an example of his fame, Kovacs pallbearers were Lemmon, Frank Sinatra, Dean Martin, Billy Wilder (director of "Some Like it Hot"), Mervyn Leroy and Joe Mikolas. Also on hand to comfort Edie Adams and other family members of Kovacs -- who were Hungarian Americans who immigrated to the U.S. "to make a better life for Ernie" -- were the who's who of Hollywood: George Burns, Groucho Marx, Edward G. Robinson, Kirk Douglas, Jack Benny, James Stewart, Charlton Heston, Buster Keaton and Milton Berle.

At the same time, Kovacs had left instructions – in the event of his death – to keep things simple. Thus, when the pastor paid tribute to Kovacs during the funeral, he summed up his life in two sentences: "I was born in Trenton, N.J. in 1919 to a Hungarian couple. I've been smoking cigars ever since."

The Evolution of 'Shorty'

1961 Corvair 'Loadside' or 'What Was He Thinking?'

Let me start right off by saying that the 'harm' done to one of only 369 Corvair 95 Loadsides was performed by the first owner (who shall remain nameless) of this rare vehicle. During the 1990's, collectability of the Corvair 95 truck was not as popular as it is today



and probably didn't even enter the mind of the person wielding the cutting torch. A few 'Crampsides" have fell victim to this procedure by removing the 45 and 5/8inch ramp on the passenger side, the same amount from the bed and driver's side and then putting the whole thing back together. Certainly OK in some circles, especially since the 'Rampys' were more plentiful by 80%. But why would someone want to do that to a Loadside? Well, actually, they didn't! Only 25 inches was removed all around




the bed and then welded back together. And it wasn't because there was so much rust in the bed that surgery was required. This truck lived in Vegas and is very solid and rust free. Did I forget to mention that after all the cutting was done that the power plant was removed and a OLDS 215 V8 was stuffed in the original engine compartment. My only thought is that this truck was being built as a "Wheelie Machine". That never happened because the madness stopped right there. The project was abandoned and never moved under V8 power.

Let's move forward to May of 2003 where two very good friends from the Vegas Vairs Corvair Club got wind of this lonely 'little' truck. Russ Thuleen and Rudy Scheindt thought that the vehicle deserved to be rescued and made arrangements to buy it. Rudy likes to put V8's in Corvairs and Russ likes his trucks. The deal was done and Rudy kept the very desirable aluminum V8 with conversion pieces and Russ was satisfied with the very solid (albeit shortened) body. A couple of years have now passed and Rudy has moved back to Grantsville Utah and Russ has moved to Chelsea Alabama. True to form, the V8 remains with Rudy to this day and Russ towed the little truck to Alabama where he would get to it someday.




About six months ago that day arrived. Another trade was done and Shorty now has a brand new 'X' block replacement motor back where it belongs and is now moving under it's own power and into Russ's well equipped shop. As was mentioned before the body of the little truck is very solid with virtually no rust. A trip to the media blaster resulted in a 'bare metal' blank canvas from which to work. Many hours were spent getting the body as straight and smooth as possible. Some finish work was needed on the

piece. Color schemes were discussed, de-



bated, and experimented with on the computer. Three each, Red, White and Blue vertical stripes, were always in the back of Russ's mind with the intent of making the truck appear even shorter than it is. However the final decision to go with the 'Ole Glory' theme was solidified when he got the seats back from Bobby of Hills Upholstery Shop in Sylacauga, Al.

The embroidery work with the eagle superimposed over the flag clinched the body color scheme for the body of the truck.



Once inside the spray booth, the whole truck was painted white. Russ and Mark spent all afternoon hand laying the masking for the red stripes which were sprayed and allowed to dry. The doors, bumpers and trim pieces were previously painted and back at the shop awaiting reassembly. The now red and white striped bed was masked so that the entire cab area could be sprayed blue. By this time, school had started and Mark needed to get back to his students so Shorty's paint patiently cured until 3 coats of clear could be applied.

I have never seen Russ more excited than when he got the

call from Mark that Shorty was ready for pick up! Once again Mark had proved his mastery of the



paint gun and provided "Mr. Russ" with another Corvair with top notch looks and eye appeal. The picture to the left is of two very happy men and an awesome looking paint job.

The enjoyable and most rewarding task at hand is to now put the truck back together. Hanging the doors is certainly a two man job and it was an honor to be able to help Russ with that job. But don't get me wrong...it was a nerve





racking experience for both of us because of the risk of damage to that gorgeous paint job. All went well due to Russ's careful and well thought out preplanning for door alignment.

As of this writing, Russ is methodically putting all the bits and pieces back together and working toward his goal of having Shorty ready for the parade into the Georgia State Fair Grounds the first Saturday of October. I can honestly tell you that he is smiling and enjoying each and every step as he checks off the days to that goal.

So now I hope that you can forgive the fact that a rare truck was put to the knife, and many will still say; "What was he thinking?". Sure, it was done but now the Corvair world has 'Shorty' and we can enjoy the little truck for what he is. A patriotic, eye-catching part of one mans dream to make people smile.

And by the way.....the stars WILL come out.....but that's a different story.



Russell Noble discussed t-shirts for the membership and will follow-up with those interested via email at a later date.





This from Al Birks:

I thought the members might be interested in this e-mail by one of my (past) club members from Virginia, Richard L. Widman. He has had some interesting experience, some of which our club members might also have observed. He is commenting to another member, who has had problems in getting his '60 Vair running.

"I've never been a fan of mechanical fuel pumps, as those are what I used to change regularly on my Studebakers back in the 50's, and read too many Corvair complaints about the mechanical pumps. So I put in the Airtex electric at the tank. But since you've replaced yours, hopefully with a good one, lets hope that functions well.

Carburetor settings are tricky with duals. I learned that back in 66 when I tuned my Bugeye Sprite. At that time I had not heard of the balancers o figured out how to make them, and did it with a hose to my ear. My hearing was better and I think I did well since it got 54 mpg when I finished (I used to drive it from Silver Spring to Long Island and back on \$2.00 in gas). So always start with balancing the carbs. From memory (It's been about 3 years or so since I touched it), after making sure there was no play in the crossover (I made nylon bushings to eliminate that), You make sure both cabs are reacting at the same time, by bending the throttle rods until they are both touching and the movement is synchronized. At this point you can turn the screws to fine tune this to synch them completely. I originally used my ear, but maybe my hearing isn't what it was 45 years ago, since the little sync tool I made showed I was way off. That tool was a 15 minute project with bottles and hoses I had lying around. Actually you've got a great club there and I'm sure someone has a sync tool. It would probably be a cool idea to use it at a club meeting and re-check every member's car. Synching is probably the single most important step.

Remember that the idle mixture screws only affect idle. So you only need to set them (both same distances to start) for a smooth idle once warmed up and choke off, collar open)

And check the cooling fan collar. It should open completely when the engine is hot and close completely when cold (there is a distance in the manual). It will over heat if not opening all the way, and the little nut is easy to turn.

This becomes a good time to set the timing (assuming you have set the points). I put in a pertronix, so once set, it is basically forever. I recently bought a new timing gun, but haven't used it. I've set timing by ear since 1968 when I was traveling daily through the mountains and had to set it to the best point for the actual altitude, that could vary from 4000 ft to 16,000 feet several times in a day. You want it as advanced as possible without pinging, and with smooth idling. When I first set up my Corvair I had it running nicely at the office at 6300 ft above sea level, but it pinged at home at 5700 ft, so I had to set it back a touch for home. When I brought it here to Santa Cruz, I set it back further (after marking the previous point for when I take it back to Tarija). In the DC area you can safely set it to the book with a timing light and have most of the available power.

The fast idle is the last thing you set. Once it is running and idle mixtures set, and choke set (clean that out if you haven't), you turn that in to where it will run fast enough at idle when cold so as to not die. I'm sure there is an rpm, but I'm old school.

On oil leaks, a good pressure washer is the best start. Then I'd let it sit and see if it leaks and from where. Once it is running the possibilities increase and the wind brings all oil to the back in that little catchall. I have had a perfectly dry garage for at least a year now, but even with all the new gaskets I used originally, I had leaks. From what I read, the frequent culprits are oil cooler seals and push rod tubes. I had no problems with these.

My problems were in 4 places.

- -- An oil pump cover bolt that sheared (not enough to leave the open hole, but enough to not put pressure on the plate. The oil migrated to the little catch-all. Had to drop the rear, pull the remaining part of the bolt, and put in a new one.
- -- Valve covers. If you still have the original 60's, scrap them. Get a set of the stronger ones that use only 4 bolts and the spreaders. Make sure they are straight. After experiments with all the recommendations (dry, silicon, contact cement, etc.) I made my gaskets (can't buy them off the shelf here) out of 5 mm cork/rubber instead of the standard 3 mm, and installed them with gasket shellac on both sides of both surfaces, using bolts that are \(^1/4\)" longer than stock. I put all bolts in with the local version thread lock, and not too hard.
- -- Oil pan. My oil pan looked like a piece of shriveled bacon. I straightened it and flattened the area around the holes, added the 5 mm gaskets, gasket shellac, and longer bolts. Making sure to put the gasket shellac closely around the bolt holes. I put all bolts in with the local version thread lock, and not too hard.
- -- the oil seal on the shifter entrance to the transmission. Although my transmission was rebuilt in Kansas, it had been on the shelf for an unknown number of years. I pulled out the little seal, took it next door to the bearing store. He measured it and sold me a new one for a couple of bucks.

There is a lot more experience in the club, and I might have missed a couple of points. Other than solving the leaks, for the 3 years or so I've been driving it all I've done is fabricate the gas sender and replace the gauge with several donors until I found a NOS gauge at California Corvairs. With that I'm set. Last night the Governor dropped by our club meeting and fell in love with my car, so I guess it still steals the show."



Pineapple Casserole (Serves 4)

1 (20 ounce) can of pineapple chunks (in its own juice)

3 tablespoons flour

1 cup shredded cheddar cheese

A welcome to Richard Stolzmann and his wife. They are our latest members. They are presently building a house in Springville; must be nice. That runs our membership up to 29.


BANQUET PLANS UNDERWAY

IDLER ARM LUBRICATION Procedure and Pictures by: Richard Stolzman

Adding a zerk fitting to your stock idler arm is easier then you think. First punch two places on the arm then driil a hole suitable for a 1/4 by 28 zerk fitting. use a bottoming tap and tap the hole to receive the zerk fitting. Insert the zerk fitting and depending on the condition of the arm and the ball joint. you might have to use a lot of pressure to get the grease in the joint, One arm I estimate over 200 lbs of grease pressure to get the grease coming out of the arm. Then the arm locked up, so I had to put it in a vise and use a large wrench to get it to turn and break the internal pressure locking it up. This will add additional years to your stock idler arm.



ADDING A ZERK FITTING TO YOUR STEERING BOX Procedure and Pictures by: Richard Stolzman

As you can see in the pictures, I first removed the lower plug in the housing. I then drilled it out and then tapped it to accept a 1/4 x 28 zerk fitting. There are various sizes you can buy but this size was in abundance in the zerk fitting kit I bought at Harbor Freight. As you can see in the pictures I ran a thin wire along the shaft seal to let the air, water and pressure out as I put grease in the housing. Don't ask how I know to let the pressure out with the wire. The pressure will blow out the shaft seal! I used regular wheel bearing grease and as you can see in the pictures some of the non red grease was contaminated with water. It took lots of grease to force the old grease and water out of the steering box. I'm assuming that the steering box is not too worn and that you can adjust the pittman arm slop out.
