The January 1975 VCE newsletter has the first published membership roster. There was a roster given to the members at the October meeting but a copy of that one hasn't been found. In September, 1974 there were 28 members according to the September newsletter. The first item in the January 1975 issue states there were 34 members. 

Tech Tip Dual Master Cylinder Conversion

The Corvair Dual Master Cylinder (MC) system has that small steel 'block' just outside the MC, for the purpose (only) of turning on a light if and when one of the lines fails. AS I understand it, there is a diaphragm inside that 'block' that moves to one side or the other, to allow an electrical connection when this happens. This means that the foot pedal then cannot move far enough to provide adequate braking on the remaining working system. So, it seems to me the answer is to remove that 'block' and plumb straight into the usual dual lines. And, yes, there is a kit available to do just that. There is even a dual MC with outlets on the other side to make the job easier. On our Corvairs, if a rear line goes out, the front tires will lock up pretty easily;

if a front line goes out, the car will stop reasonably well. Just the reverse is true on a front engine car. The dual master set up requires that the brake shoes be adjusted properly for the system to work in failure mode. If your pedal travel is considerable when everything is working, you'll never get enough fluid displacement to create stopping pressure in the failure mode without, as you found out, rapid pumping of the pedal. All that any "conversion kit" has will be the dual master cylinder, outlet port adapters, one or more brake lines, and a plug for the main distribution tee. Basically you remove the rear line out



of the distribution tee, plug the tee, then using a union and the new brake line, connect the rear line to one of the dual master cylinder outlet ports. The other outlet port is connected in the same way the original brake line to the master was; just that now it only works the front wheels. The only additional line involved is the one that runs from the end of the rear brake line to the new master cylinder.

When I disconnected the rear brake line from the firewall fitting and put an inverted flair plug in its place, I installed another 1/4 inch inverted flair tee fitting onto the rear brake line, right up against the original fitting, that I had just disconnected. I installed another inverted flair plug into the bottom hole. I drilled a 1/2 inch hole, 7/8 inches in back of the existing line and in line with it from front to back. Then I purchased two 1/4 x 12 inch brake lines and bent them to go from the existing and new fitting hole, going under the master cylinder and up to the ports with the adapters that are called out in the tech articles. This was a very easy job and could be reversed for any nut that wants to run with a single master cylinder. There was no trying to bend the rear brake line while laying on your back under the dash or trying to cut and double flair the line. This project used all standard fittings and lines that are available at any automotive parts store.





Russell Nobel reports that the 40th anniversary shirts should be available for pick-up at the March meeting.










CONVENTION COUNTDOWN 49 DAYS TO GO

Tech Tip Late Model Alternator Upgrade by John Cleveland

There is an excellent article in the Corvair Technical Guide, Vol. 1 by Bob Helt describing in detail how to do this. I used it as a reference using a remanufactured internally regulated alternator. I also added the front bearing replacement in the reused front drive housing of my 37 amp alternator since it was making a lot of noise on cold mornings. You'll see in the picture below that it wasn't going to last much longer.



Here's the parts you'll need:

- The old alternator
- A new alternator, AC Delco 10-S1. When the kid at the parts store gives you a blank stare and asks you what kind of car, tell him a 1975 Chevy Nova with a 350 4 barrel. This will be a 67 amp alternator.
- An alternator cable extension which has the correct plug-in for the new alternator.
- A new bearing for the front drive housing of your old alternator. While you've got it off you may as well replace it. You probably don't know how old that alternator is and it's just a few bucks. The Timken bearing number is 203F.
- A piece of steel strap 1" wide, 1/8" thick and 14-16" long.

Mechanical

Start by disconnecting the positive battery terminal and removing the old alter-



nator. Take the pulley and fan off the old alternator. The '65 shop manual describes how to do this, or you can look at the picture at right. Insert an allen wrench in the end of the shaft and loosen the nut with a box end wrench. I had to use a long pipe nipple on the allen wrench as a 'cheater' to get the nut to break loose.

<u>Remove the bolts holding the front</u> <u>housing.</u>



Separate the front housing from the alternator body. Pay attention to the order of removal, nut, pulley, fan and spacer. There is also a spacer behind the bearing. They might have to be reused to get the old front housing to fit correctly on the new alternator. <u>Remove the backing plate holding the bearing</u>.



The picture above might be kind of small, but the bearings were so worn they were oval instead of round. Note what the back of the bearing looks like so the new one goes in the same way. From the front of the housing insert a



socket that will just fit though the center hole and use a hammer to tap out the old bearing.



Clean up the housing and prep it for the new bearing. A light coat of grease around the wall where the bearing will go in will help installation.



I used a 2" square X 4" long piece of oak against the new bearing and tapped on that with a hammer. Once started it went right in. Make sure you get it started straight. A socket of the same diameter as the outside of the bearing would also work. Don't beat on it too hard. Follow the same procedure you used with the old alternator and take the pulley, fan and front housing off the new one. Again note the order, nut, pulley, fan, spacer.

Put the old front housing on the new alternator.

Pay attention to the relationship between the housing mounting holes (at bottom) and the wiring plug-in on the back. When looking at the alternator from the pulley end the wiring terminals should be on the right. Install the fan and pulley.

Rotate the alternator by hand and feel the rotation. This is where you may have to try the different spacers to get the smoothest feel. There will be some in and out play until you tighten the nut on the end of the shaft. Also one of the nuts might fit better than the other. I found using the new nut provided threads all the way through. The old nut was thicker. When it all looks and feels good torque the pulley nut per the Shop Manual. Mount the alternator in the car with the two bottom bolts. Don't put the top brace on.

Electrical

Now it's time to wire the new cable extension to the existing wiring. I cut the old plug-in off about an inch after the wire came out of the harness. This left enough on the old plug that it could be reused. Since my old alternator was still good I'm keeping it as a spare, along with the old plug and voltage regulator. In the picture terminal 1 is the bottom and terminal 2 is at the top.

Terminal 1 will connect to the blue wire going to the regulator. Terminal 2 will connect to the white or white/black (²65) wire going to the regulator. I soldered the connections and used heat shrink tube for the connection. THIS IS NOT A PLACE FOR CRIMP CONNECTIONS!

The connection to the battery goes on the stud similar to the old alternator. Here's a picture of the connection that went to the voltage regulator.



Since the new alternator is internally regulated, you can't use the old regulator. I used spade connector jumpers between the outside terminals and a jumper between the inside terminals. This was later sealed with liquid tape and tied down to the wiring harness below the old voltage regulator. I also removed the voltage regulator. A permanent connection could be made by cutting the wires from the bottom of the connector and soldering them together. The last step is to make a new top bracket with the steel strap.

The new alternator is about $\frac{1}{2}$ " to $\frac{3}{4}$ " taller than the old one and there was no way I could get my old top brace to fit. Yours might work but for me it was off to the home center to get some 1" wide steel. The 1/8" thickness is thin enough I could shape the bends in my vice with a hammer. It didn't turn out half bad.



The whole job, including the trip to the home center and making the bracket, took about 3 hours. Cost was around \$75.

Tools were a set of wrenches, a large allen wrench, torque wrench, which you could probably do without, ratchet and sockets, hammer, hack saw, soldering iron, and crimp tool.

Consumables were flat black spray paint (for the new alternator and bracket), a couple squirts of PB Blaster, a little grease to help the bearing get started, solder, heat shrink tubing and some male crimp connectors. There was also a few beers in there,optional, of course.

Directions:

The park is only six miles northeast of Guntersville on Highway 227. Guntersville may be entered via highways 431, 79 and 69. Should you choose to use an internet mapping service and it tells you to take Martling as your route into the park, we encourage you to stay on the main roads of Highways 431 and 227 instead. The roads through Martling can be confusing and cause you to become lost if you are not familiar with this community.

From outside Alabama:

Atlanta - Take Interstate 20 towards Alabama. Take the Oxford, Alabama exit at Highway 431. Follow Hwy. 31 North through Anniston, Gadsden, & Albertville, into Guntersville. Follow Alabama Highway 227 South into Guntersville State Park.

Atlanta - Take GA. Highway 20 towards Rome. Follow Hwy. 20 into Alabama where it becomes Alabama Highway 9. Follow Hwy. 9 to the intersection of Hwy. 9/AL. Hwy. 35. Corvair Grand Sport



Bill Cunningham's V-8 powered Corvair is unbelievable at any speed by MATTHEW USHER photos by PATRICK MULLIGAN This is a reprint of the article originaly published in the Mar 2000 issue of Scale Auto Enthusiast—ed.

BILL CUNNINGHAM'S love of Chevrolet's Corvair goes back a longtime-his first car was a white 1965 coupe, powered by a 95horse-power six-cylinder engine. Years later, the car would serve as the inspiration for Bill's unbelievable V-8 powered Corvair Grand Sport model. Based on AMT/Ertl's 1/25 scale Prestige kit, the model has the V-8 engine from Accurate Miniatures' Corvette Grand Sport mounted amidships, where it's mated to the transaxle and rear suspension from Tamiya's Porsche 962. "If I were to build a 1:1 custom Corvair, I would probably make it just like this model, "Bill says. "I strived to make sure that the design was practical and realistic. A car such as this could actually be built and driven." "In the late '70s, there was a little-known aftermarket conversion kit offered by Crown Manufacturing that allowed the midships installation of a



The complexity of installing the Grand Sport V-8 is particularly evident in the underside view. Bill made the partial belly pan from nickel-silver sheet, the same material from which he photoetched many of the model's detail parts.

Chevy V-8 in the Corvair," Bill explains. "I used that concept of reversing the transaxle and mounting the engine where the rear seat should be. "The car's overall look is a carefully designed combination of 1970s and '90s technology, subtly capturing the flavor of both eras. Bill wanted the model's viewers to see hints of the Corvette Grand Sports or Can-Am Chaparrals in the model. Bill spent more than a year reworking and detailing every aspect of the model to suit his design philosophy. The doors are hinged and fit with magnetic catches. Likewise, Bill opened the engine compartment and installed self-erecting hood supports. All of the interior body panels were made from styrene sheet and hand fit to accommodate the engine and modified bodywork. Externally, the standard wheel arches were radiused


and flared to handle the model's custom-made two-piece turnedaluminum wheels and Aoshima tires. Although there are a few aftermarket parts in the model, Bill produced many of the machined-aluminum and photoetched-metal detail parts himself. The Grand Sport 377 cid V -8, already a well-detailed assembly right out of the box, benefits from complete wiring and fuel-system plumbing, plus custom photoetched carburetor flanges and throttle linkages. Upfront, complete brake plumbing leads to machinedaluminum and photoetchedmetal disc brake assemblies. Bill sprayed the body with water-based Createx Pearl White acrylic paint mixed 1:1 with Future floor shine. He applied the color with a Testors Aztek airbrush and polished it to a high shine with Micro-Mesh polishing cloths. Testors Model Master acrylics were Then used to paint the rest of the model. Bill's imaginative engineering and clean building style make the finished model a standout on contest tables. The hybrid Chevrolet took top honors in the Custom category at the 1999 International Plastic Modelers' Society Nationals in Orlando, Fl., and also claimed a secondplace trophy in the Custom class at the 17th Greater Salt Lake International Model Car Championship. Several elements came together to create this exceptional model: Bill's love of the Corvair, understanding of automotive design and engineering, and refined building skills have resulted in a model that is unbelievable at any speed ... even sitting still.



Willow Run assembly plant demolition proceeding (From 'Hemmings')



While the effort to save a portion of the Willow Run assembly plant has come down to its final week, demolition crews have already torn down about half of the former Kaiser-Frazer and GM structure outside of Ypsilanti, Michigan, to make way for an autonomous vehicle research facility.

"Every single day big chunks are coming down," Said Dennis Norton, director of the Michigan Aerospace Foundation and original founder of the Yankee Air Museum, which has so far raised \$6.8 million of the \$8 million necessary to purchase a fraction of the plant. "Now that the weather has warmed up, the demolition crews are going to move rapidly."

Bulldozers arrived on the site to begin tearing down the 5-millionsquare-foot facility last fall after the RACER development trust which took possession of the plant after GM shut down operations there in late 2010 – reached a deal last September with Walbridge Development to build a shared research and development center and test track for connected vehicles. According to Bill Callen, speaking for RACER Trust, demolition slowed down during the long and hard Michigan winter, but is now about 50 percent complete. "The demolition contractors know that the museum has an interest in that portion of the plant, so they've

segregated that and are demolishing the rest," Callen said.

Yankee Air Museum officials launched a campaign last year to raise \$8 million to buy about 155,000 square feet of the plant, a portion that includes the end of the assembly line and the bay doors through which every completed B-24 bomber rolled out of the plant during World War II. Former GM chairman Bob Lutz stepped in to help the campaign, as did retired astronaut Jack Lousma, and RACER Trust worked with museum officials to push the deadline back multiple times last year. The current deadline of May 1 is the last that RACER has offered, but Norton said he is confident the museum will raise the final \$1.2 million by then.

"I'm about 95 percent sure we'll sign the purchase agreement by May 1," Norton said. "That \$8 million will take care of building two new walls to close up the section and to put in utilities like heat and a fire suppression system. It'll be an almost new building when we're done with it."

Built on land owned by Henry Ford to crank out B-24 Liberator bombers in 1941, the Albert Kahn-designed plant became the largest single industrial building under one roof. Once it ramped up to full production in late 1943, the so-called "Grand Canyon of the mechanized world" would produce a bomber per hour, along with a number of wood-bodied gliders. After the war, Ford declined its option to buy the massive plant from the federal government, so the government – through the Reconstruction Finance Corporation and the War Assets Administration – ended up leasing, and eventually selling, Willow Run to the newly formed Kaiser-Frazer. Kaiser-Frazer converted Willow Run to automotive production and built cars there from June 1946 to July 1953 before selling the plant to General Motors for \$26 million. GM used the plant to build Hydra-Matic transmissions and other powertrain components until December 2010, when it shed the property as part of its bankruptcy.

RACER, which obtained the 332-acre plant not long after, attempted to sell portions of the property to other industrial companies, but pointed to the massive plant as an impediment to finding new tenants and thus decided to tear it down last year. Not long after, RACER signed a contract with Walbridge to sell the property after demolition is complete. Callen said that the demolition was slated to take a full year, but Norton said he believes that demolition will be complete by about mid-July.





Directions:





Tech Tip '65 Ignition switch failure troubleshoot and fix!


VCE President, Richard Stolzman was experiencing a problem in the drivability of his car!

This is the follow up on the back firing and miss on my 65 convertible. As you can see the contacts of both the fixed switch contacts and the moveable contacts are eroded or worn. I think the brass contact with both sides of the bubble eroded and were not making contact because of the high point sitting on the Bakelite between the fixed contacts. What was happening was turning it clock wise caused it to make contact and the missing and back firing to disappear. I'll take some pictures of my fix next month. This will be in case you don't have another ignition switch handy.





Richard also passed this along;






Tech Tip Trivia Can you identify these parts? (Continued from last issue)





Well here are the pictures of where the two pieces of metal look like after they are painted the correct color (which is the color of the body of the car. The car they go on are from the look of it is the early production 65 Air Conditioned car. The assembly manual that I have for the 65 and 67 do not show two pieces of metal, and according to Russ Thuleen his air condition car did not have the two pieces of metal but as in the assembly manual on page UPC 64 sheet A3 item (#8 baffle upper) one piece of metal to keep the water from entering the evaporator when outside air was selected on AC cars. Here are some pictures of the metal pieces and where they are mounted.



Part 1 on how to rust proof your late model Corvair

The first thing to do is remove the (outlet assembly), or the (panel, shroud plastic) that's what GM calls the plastic assembly that holds the vent door in the front and on each side of the front doors, or the fresh air vent. It needs to be removed so all the leaves and other stuff that has turned into sludge from exposure to water, It will hold water and then rust through in front of the front doors. There are 4 sheet metal screws that hold it in. remove these four screws and the panel will with a little effort pull out. The carpet should be behind it. Then you will see that GM used a liberal amount of soft caulking to seal against the entry of water into the car. You can reuse the caulking with a little effort, it should be still soft, except for a little dust or lint on it, you can wash the dirt or lint off with soapy water. then scrape it off the body and

panel assembly and knead it together in a big ball so it can be reused. Clarks sells a 3M Strip-caulk pn C3201, or you can go on line under amazon.com or Google.com and search on 3M Stripcaulk, and find it. If you decide to reuse your old caulking it needs to be kneaded in to a ball, then rolled in to strips about 3/8 in in diameter, then put on the body or the plastic kick piece and then the panel needs to be inserted into the hole after the crud is cleaned out. The sheet metal screws have a small head on them so a large washer needs to be put between the head of the screw and then they need to be slowly screwed in to let the caulking spread out to seal the opening. You might have to use a longer screw at first to reach the metal of the body. You should do this when it is warmer or use a heat gun on the metal to warm it up and then insert the panel. Once the panel is in

place you can assist the spreading out of the caulking by pushing on the panel with your foot. Make sure you use some padding so you don't scratch or mar the panel. Next month we will look in the opening and see the crud and remove it.




