





I hadn't driven the car more than 50 miles after I bought it before I gave it to him to do his magic. ## **EMILY'S PICS**

During our January meeting we discussed the possibility of making a club jigsaw puzzle to add to the 'activity property' like John's Corn Hole Game. Because of copyright laws and limitations, we decided to plan for a photo shoot of club members cars and create our own poster that would also be good for the making of our puzzle. Emily provided some of her creations to the newsletter as examples and can be seen throughout this and upcoming issues of the Oil Drop.



# Part 2 on how to rust proof your late model Corvair (cont. from Oil Drop Vol. 35 #12)

Now that that the front kick plate is removed we can clean it out. There is not room enough to stick your head in and look at all the crud, (#1) but my camera can take pictures. One of the things I do on my cars is to drill a 1/2inch hole on the bottom of the door opening. As you can see it is very inconspicuous (#2), but is an effective way to check later for leaves and other crud in the bottom. It is also a great way to flush it out using a hose in the front opening forward of the window. As you can see, (#3) shows the location of the drill bit in the bottom. (#4 &5) shows the bottom door hinge reinforcement plate and the leaves and crud between it and the body. It can

be cleaned out using a small screw drive about 6 inches long. The opening gets smaller but with persistence it can be cleaned out. It opens in to rocker panel, the panel that runs the length of the car. I also use a concentrated spray of water to clean every thing out. the large opening goes in to the rocker panel, so make sure the front of the car is higher. After I'm finished with the water I use a high pressure air hose to help get rid of most of the water. After a week of letting every thing dry I use POR-15, or if it isn't too badly rusted I use a anti-rust enamel. I used white as it shows easily where I missed painting.





# Part 2 on how to rust proof your late model Corvair (cont.)

Now that we have cleaned it out and painted, we can take some more picture to see how good a job we did. Again I inserted the drill bit so you can see the orientation of the 'drain hole' in the picture on the right. This rust proofing can be done without really doing anything to the outward appearance of the car. The small hole can be touched up with some touch up paint after the inside of the kick plate opening is painted. Any paint that comes out the hole by the door can easily be cleaned up with some paint thinner, preferably mineral spirits, it won't hurt the original paint. This series of rustproofing will be continued in future issues of the OIL **Richard Stolzman** DROP.



#### I MET THE MAN WHO PAINTED YOUR CAR! (Prez Sez)

It's always interesting to see who you meet in a parking lot that wants to tell you about their Corvair experience. Since I drive my car almost every day and in several states, I have had hundreds of such encounters. Some very interesting and some not so much. could decipher the tag correctly and told me my car was originally white with a black interior. I told him that was correct. Then he told me his story.

He had worked at Willow Run starting in 1964 and was moved to the Corvair section in mid '65 right after the body style change. He worked at various positions in the paint department, finally settling in at priming cars in early '66. He stayed there until the end of the run in 1969 and was transferred to another line. He admitted he hadn't primed every Corvair that came down the line, but laughingly he said it seemed like he primed most of them. Most times he did the initial spray and some time he was further down the line doing touchup before the car went to paint. He worked at GM for thirty five years and retired. He and his wife moved back to Alabama to be near family.

In most of these encounters I never get a name and never offer mine, it's just a visit between two people who have a common bond, the Corvair of their past brought to the present by my Monza. Sometimes the conversations are ridiculous, sometimes funny and sometimes very educational. In all cases the stories I hear and the conversations are warm and friendly.

This is a good opportunity to inform people familiar with our cars that the Corvair is still out there and available; that there is a club close by where they can get support, friendship and a good meal once a month. Remember this the next time you come out of the store and someone wants to talk about their Corvair experience.

# Part 3 on how to rust proof your late model Corvair (cont. from Oil Drop Vol. 36 #2)

In this issue, Richard has ADDITIONAL PICTURES FOR PART 1 & 2.

These are three additional pictures that should have been in parts 1 and 2. First one is a picture of front panel with AC installed in part 1, showing that panel can be removed and installed with AC installed. Second picture is the drilling of the hole at the bottom door opening with door installed, notice protective metal plate.

Flushing out the rocker panel in picture #4







Now that we have cleaned it out and painted, we can take some more pictures to see how good a job we did. Again I inserted the drill bit so you can see the orientation of the 'drain hole' in the picture on the right. This rust proofing can be done without really doing anything to the outward appearance of the car. The small hole can be touched up with some touch up paint after the inside of the kick plate opening is painted. Any paint that comes out the hole by the door can easily be cleaned up with some paint thinner, preferably mineral spirits, it won't hurt the original paint. This series of rustproofing will be continued in future issues of the OIL DROP. Richard Stolzman





# Part 4 on how to rust proof your late model Corvair (cont. from Oil Drop Vol. 36 #5

Now that we have the removed front vent panel, cleaned it out, reinstalled it, painted the area behind it, flushed out the rocker panel, we need to prevent the influx of leaves again. This part 4 will remove the front panel below the window, install a gutter guard panel to prevent the influx of leaves and reinstall it. So far we have did the rust proofing without altering the appearance of the Corvair.









We now will remove the front panel below the front windshield. There are 5 hex headed screws that hold it in place. With the trunk open we can use a 1/4 socket to remove the five screws that hold it in place. First the windshield wiper arms must be removed. With padding between the screwdriver and the panel we can remove

the windshield wiper arm. After the screws are removed the panel can be moved forward to release the five tabs that go in slots in the panel. Then by lifting up and over the



gutter guard in half, lay it on the panel which is upside down, and take heat gun and heat it till it forms to the panel. Now the openings for the windshield wiper shafts can be cut out of the gutter guard. Now with some weather strip glue on the panel, press it down on the panel. After about 15 minutes we can rein-

can be removed by moving it toward the windshield. Now we can cut the



stall the panel on the car. The middle screw must be put back in, preferably with some caulking around the screw hole as it has a entry for water into the trunk. Now the rocker panel and in between will be kept free of leaves so the air flow will dry the rocker panel out. Chevrolet in their advertisements advertised a flow through to keep the rocker panels dry. I will try to find it in my literature.

#### **Bv-Laws**

John Cleveland received several responses. Those are appreciated. The members present discussed the changes and decided by general consensus which to include and remove from the By-Laws. The officers will incorporate the changes into the revised draft of the By-Laws, which will be distributed by email for a vote.

#### **Discussion Summary**

Change of purpose: There was a question about including Corvair-powered planes, tanks, airplanes, bicycles. The suggestion was to add "Corvair trucks and related vehicles." Accepted.

Change to article 1 section to remove "and authorized" by the IRS. The text will still recognize the non-profit status. Accepted. Article 2, Section 2: The fee from COR-SA never materialized. It was suggested to remove the CORSA reference. Russell

Noble moved to strike that sentence and that was agreed to.

John Cleveland added a sentence to add that dues cover a member and family. Accepted.

It was decided to pro-rate dues on a quarterly basis.

Section G: The date of joining was defined to be the date dues were paid. Section 3, Non-Payment of Dues: There was a request to add that the Board must accept the explanation and promise to pay for a member delinquent in dues to avoid suspension. Accepted. Section B: Change the heading to

"Suspension." Accepted. There was a discussion of what percentage of Board Members would be required to suspend or expel a member and if there should be an avenue of appeal of a suspended or expelled member. It was agreed to set a 2/3rds vote of the board of Directors for suspension or expulsion with no option for appeal to the general membership.

The proposed section on conflict of interest on discipline was accepted as proposed.

The clarification of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice Presidents role was read and approved. The clarification of the Treasurer's and Secretary's role and who keeps the roster was clarified. Accepted.

Article IV, section 3, It currently reads that we cannot expend more than  $\frac{1}{2}$  of the club's fees on hand. It was agreed to remove section A on major expenditures, and change Section B (now A) as follows:

Expenditures: Any expenditure that would require more than 50% of the club's current balance to be spent requires a majority vote of the membership in a regular meeting provided a 30-day notice is given prior to the vote.

Article 4, Fiscal Responsibility: Under 2, B, "Checks can be issued to the Treasurer or his designee." Agreed. Article 5, Voting: Section 3b allowing proxy voting was removed. Agreed. Article VIII was changed to read bylaws could be changed by 2/3rds of the eligible members present with 30 days' notice.

#### **New Business**

There was no new business.

### Part 5 on how to rust proof your late model Corvair (cont. from Oil Drop Vol. 36 # 6

Now that we are finished with part 4 of rust proofing your Corvair, I want to add some additional information. Chevrolet advertised that the late model Corvair had a flow through rocker panel so the air pressure in front of the front window would flow through the rocker panel and dry them out. Now that we removed all the crud and fixed it so no more leaves would clog up the air flow,



let us measure the air pressure in the rocker panel. I took a manometer and taped the end of the hose into the outlet, (the square hole in the back with the rubber flap covering it) From the pictures you can see the hose taped to the car leading to the rear square hole. The picture I took of the manometer was at about 40 mph, where the pressure had pegged it at over 1/2 inch of water pressure, which equals around .02 pounds of pressure. The pressure pegged the manometer at over .5 inches of water with the front vent door closed. With the door open and air flowing into the car the pressure was reduced to .3 inches of water. From the looks of it the pressure was not proportional to the speed, as the speed of the car doubled it increased the pressure 4 times as much. I will try to get a gauge that measures in the 2 to 3 pound range and try it again.

Ok, lets continue on with doing things to rust proof your Corvair with out messing with the appearance. As you can see from the



first picture what the doors of my convertible looked like from being

stored outside and the front lower then the rear. GM has a drain in

the doors but even under the best conditions it lets a 1/4 inch of water sit in the bottom of the doors. Imagine what happens if it sits either up hill or down hill for many years. There will be around 2 inches of water sitting either in the front or rear of the door.








and making the holes in the bottom of the door. Once we have the slot cut out, put a hose into the out side

with the window rolled up and then take a small wire and poke it up into the slot and move it all around to clean out the bottom of the door. The pictures should show you what we want to accomplish. Some of the pictures show GM's original drain slot and the new slot we have added. You can touch up the slot with some touch up paint with a Q-tip or a small paint brush with similar color paint. The slot is in a inconspicuous spot so you could leave it as it is. The pictures are from 2 different cars. Notice that one show the water pouring out of the slot.

Combined with the normal accumulation of dirt it will cause the door to rust through. As you can see from the pictures we will drill 3 to 5 1/4 in holes in the lower part of the door front and rear. Then we will take a dremmel tool and cut out the metal to make 1/4 by 3/4 in slot. This can be done with the door on the car as the pictures show. You will be surprised how much fine dirt will come out of the slot while you are drilling















#### **Choo Choo Show**





### Part 6 on how to rust proof your late model Corvair (cont. from Oil Drop Vol. 36 # 7

 $\mathbf{O}_{k}$ , here is some more info on rocker panel pressure. I got a gauge that will measure up to 60 inches of water, that's just over 2 lbs. I installed the gauge hose in the square hole that has

the rubber flap installed over it to keep water out. I of course had to duct tape it in place.

I went on the freeway and went at the wrong time, it was quitting time and it was jammed, so I could only do the speed limit of 70 mph. The gauge showed about 4 inches of water, which converts to around .3 lbs of pressure with the front vent door closed, with it open it was about 1 1/2 inches of water. I will try it next around 80 or 90 mph to see what the pressure is.





ontinuing on I have taken the door panel off of my 67 and have some pictures of the substitute door panel lining that I made out of heavy plastic. By now most original door panel linings made out of waxed paper are beginning to fail, the symptoms will be that the door panel itself will start to curl at the bottom or worse yet the screws will pull through the vinyl. I made mine out of heavy plastic and used caulking to make a bead around the edge like Chevrolet did.

This is picture of 67 front door with wire to show where slot is in front of door.

New plastic door liner and old wax coated paper, Chevrolet original, as you can see original is about gone, could probably save if you sprayed it real heavy with spray paint and reinstalled it.

#### **Prez Sez!**

#### CHECK THE OIL!!!

A couple of weeks ago I was headed down to Tuscaloosa for work. On the way out of the driveway I dropped my registration for the Great Plains Roundup in the mail box. I have wanted to attend this for several years and finally got the chance.

By the time I was down near Tuscaloosa the car was making a noise. I thought at first it was missing but when I got to the job site the engine sounded strong. My drive home after work began on a rural two lane road at lower speeds and I got a good chance to hear the noise, a tap, tap, tap that increased and decreased with changes in speed. It also was stronger when the car was pulling than when it wasn't. It disappeared completely when the clutch was in. This wasn't going to be good.

Fast forward to this last weekend when I pulled the engine/ drivetrain (Thanks Russ, for your lift and advice!). When the differential top cover was removed two things were discovered. #1: There was hardly any lube in the differential. #2: There were several teeth broke off the pinion gear, probably from heat stress due to lack of lubricant. Now for some history. I have owned my car for about 8 years, and one thing I have always done, until last year, was to check the differential and transmission levels at least every six months. About a year ago, when it was time to check them, I didn't do it. The reasoning? They have always been full. The spot on my driveway and my parking space at work isn't any larger or wetter.....THESE ARE NOT GOOD REASONS (see the beginning of this article for why). The manual transmission and differential share a passage that allows lubricant to flow between them. This is designed so the differential will empty first, then the transmission, which protects the transmission. I would guess because the differential is cheaper and easier to repair than a transmission, but that's just my guess. There was only about  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch of lubricant in the differential, along with the broken teeth and other bits of metal.

Bottom line: The repair is going to cost a couple of hundred dollars. It's that low because I have another differential with a good ring and pinion that can be rebuilt. The cost would more than double if I had to go out and get another ring and pinion. All because I didn't take the time to jack up the car (15 minutes) and check the oil (5 minutes). I'm telling this story because stupid comes in all shapes and sizes. An onset of stupid can affect anyone, at any time and in an infinite number of ways. This was absolutely avoidable and I don't want to see it happen to anyone else.

Take care and keep that Corvair out there. Check the oil first! .

### Part 7 on how to rust proof your late model Corvair (cont. from Oil Drop Vol. 36 # 8

his session we will look at the rear fender well, it applies to both sides. I've seen a few Corvairs with the lower area below the rear fender rusted through. Looking at the rubber plug, you will see a slot below it to let out any water that accumulates in this area. Normally water sitting in this area is caused by a rear tail light gasket shrunken from age, letting water from a heavy rain into rust out the area, with the accumulated dirt holding the moisture to cause it to rust. The slot can be so small or non existing that any amount of dirt will clog it up. Also when this area is inspected you will probably find 40 years of dirt. First the insulation has to be pulled out and folded back under to free up this gap so it can be washed out with a nozzle on the end of a hose. First the rubber plug needs to be removed. You might have to aid the water with a piece of wire or a screwdriver to help remove the dirt. The pictures show the area with the rubber plug removed and it washed out. The ink pen is for reference to the rubber plug area. Finally



the picture shows it painted with white rust enamel paint. White is used so the area would show up well in the pictures. I used a long brush and used enough paint so it flowed out of the hole where the rubber plug goes. Finally the picture shows a slot cut in the rubber plug to aid in the water if any accumulated to run out. The slot in my 65 4 door was almost not present. It was just an indention in the metal.





You will see that the color I decided on was a copy of my Dodge Daytona tow truck, 'GoMango', paint code PPE and white. (Hence the 'Mango Monza nickname)


Once it was running again we found that the push rod tube seals were leaking pretty bad but while letting it run at idle the A/C belt slipped off and jammed between the pulleys. Russ came to the rescue again and installed new Viton seals for me while I was on the road with work. While reassembling and set up for static valve lash timing, we discovered that the harmonic balancer had suffered catastrophic failure. (Probably a result of the belt jam) The balancer was replaced and now that we could turn the engine, I commenced with the valve lash procedure under Russ's watchful eye. After a little priming, she started up with no leaks but quite noisy with lifter clatter.


As some learned at last month's meeting, it takes quite a bit of periodically running at idle to get the lifters pumped up.

I am happy to report that the little 110hp starts right up and sounds very good.

With the onset of winter weather project time, I plan to get her finished and ready for Corvair Lovers Holiday 2016.

# ader to open law museum

#### The Associated Press

HARTFORD, Conn. - Ralph Nader is the first to say his new museum is not quite like any other.

The American Museum of Tort Law, which opens today, has been developed by the consumer advocate and former presidential candidate as a kind of ode to the power of the law to achieve triumphs over corporate America.

The museum inside a former bank building in Nader's western Connecticut hometown of Winsted tells the story of landmark cases through exhibits and graphic-novel type illustrations.

There's a Chevrolet Corvair - the car featured in his 1965 book on the auto industry's safety record, "Unsafe at Any Speed" - and even a room for children, dedicated to all manner of dangerous toys.

Nader hopes high school students will re-enact famous legal cases and the museum, which so far has raised \$2 million, is pursuing more to support other programs including touring exhibitions around the country.

Nader, 81, spoke in an interview

of his longtime vision, its exhibits and why he thinks it appeals to a wide audience:

**Question:** Why was it important to build the museum?

Answer: There's only one law museum in the Western Hemisphere, Nader said, and the American Museum of Tort Law is it.

"It's an amazing commentary isn't it? There's supposed to be rule of law? I don't know where the lawyers have been or the judges, but this is a first," he said. "But more important, it relates to almost everybody's daily experience. Who hasn't been in a motor vehicle and watched a crash or been in a crash? Who hasn't taken drugs, medicines? Who hasn't been treated by a doctor or a hospital? Who hasn't had their property damaged wrongfully?"

Question: What exhibits are most meaningful for you?

Answer: "There's a Corvair in the museum itself with the story of GM and its detectives following me because I was criticizing the Corvair,"

about the museum as a fulfillment he said. "There are historical cases that students read in law school that broke new ground in the 1800s and 1900s and expanded, for example, the right to claim pain and suffering, compensation for punitive damages."

Nader said some exhibits include questions intended to make people think about how they would have handled certain cases.


"It's encouraging people to think about these cases because the whole system rests on public understanding and usage, and there's very little understanding of jury service duty. A lot of people want to get out of it. It's a great innovation in the world," he said.

Question: What kind of audience do you expect?


Answer: "Anybody who's interested," he said. "There's even a dangerous toy room. It's for kids because kids have been burned, they've been exploding chemistry sets, they've had little things that they've swallowed. The little eves of a doll fall out for example. It's serious actually."







#### From the Prez

It was my intent this month to write the definitive article about late model front suspension removal and rebuild. I started off with good intent, taking pictures and notes to assist with the article, but a couple of hours after the removal Russ and I were fighting almost every part we tried to remove and it became clear that it was going to be more of a job than I had expected. There will be some articles to follow in the next couple of months, but they will be more geared to what to expect and some lessons learned. I try to never forget they are old cars and every job can become an adventure; I just don't realize how big an adventure you can get yourself (and friends) in to. The car finally came off the lift after 6 days and was slowly driven home since only an eyeball alignment was done. The alignment came the next day from Estes Tire in Hoover. They did a great job, front and rear for just under \$90 and provided a printout of before and after settings for my records.

Next to alignment shops. The mechanics we are using to align our cars are getting fewer all the time. Like everything else, they are getting older and retiring. I've been using the NAPA shop on Hwy 280 for the last 2 or 3 years. When I took the convertible there last spring the 'seasoned' alignment guy was going to teach his replacement about Corvair alignment. When they saw what shape my front suspension was in, they refused to do the work (I don't blame them!). Now the gentleman who did the work retired to the parts department and at the end of this month will retire from that. Denise told me she had heard Estes did alignments on old cars, so I thought it would be a good test to take them one that was totally out of whack and see what they could do. While I was checking my car in a guy came in with a 68 Chevy pickup and we struck up a conversation. He told me he had used Estes for years and they did all his tire/ suspension work and that he was very pleased with their service. I felt a lot better about what to expect.

If there are any of you that use other shops for Corvair service work and are satisfied with their service, please share them with the other club members. I think it would be a good idea to get a list together for the club of shops that are familiar with Corvair so we all have proven places to take our cars.

We have two new members in the last couple of months, Dick Stumb, from Chelsea has expressed interest in joining. He contacted member Russell Noble by email and Russ, Billy and I visited him and his wife and checked out his early model yellow convertible. He hopes to make the Christmas party and join up.
