Dear Friends,

On Juneteenth, ten members from Church of the Advent, along with friends from the wider community, participated in the Diocese of New Jersey's "Slavery History Pilgrimage," a journey thoughtfully developed by the diocesan Reparations Commission. This pilgrimage took us to four significant sites in North Jersey, each tied to New Jersey's often-overlooked history of slavery. It was an emotional, eye-opening experience that I'm still processing—one that stirred deep grief, anger, and a renewed sense of purpose.

The stop that impacted me the most was the mass burial site at the former Tinton Plantation. There, an untold number of enslaved people are buried in a mass grave. Standing on that ground, I felt angry that their lives were stripped of dignity not only in their living but even in their death. There were no headstones to honor their memory, no recorded names, only a solemn silence and a sacred presence that demanded reverence. I found myself grieving not just for them, but for the generations who never knew their ancestors, for the stories that have been lost forever.

A shocking part of the pilgrimage was learning about Judge Jacob Van Wickle, a county judge and prominent layman in the Episcopal Church. In the early 1800s, he orchestrated the kidnapping and illegal sale of at least 136 Black people from New Jersey to plantations in the Deep South. These individuals, many of them free or born in freedom, were trafficked into slavery under the guise of the law. What struck me hardest was not only the evil of his actions but the Episcopal Church's silence at the time. Despite widespread public protest, Van Wickle was never held accountable—neither by the courts nor by the Church.

This truth was sobering. It reminded me that the stain of slavery was not confined to the South, nor to just a few individuals. It was woven into the very fabric of our nation, including our religious institutions. As Episcopalians, we must confront this legacy head-on. Our Church was not merely complicit in slavery, but often enabled and benefited from it. Acknowledging this history is not about assigning modern guilt, but about seeking repentance, repair, and justice.

The pilgrimage made clear to me that remembering the past is not enough. We must allow it to shape our actions today. As followers of Christ, we are called to truth, to justice, and to love. We are called to build a future where every person is valued, seen, and free. The road to that future begins with honest remembrance.

I am deeply grateful to Alice Barnes-Vasser for organizing this trip and ensuring we could bear witness together. It was more than a road trip. It was a journey into our shared history, into lament, and hopefully, into transformation. It is possible for you to make this journey on your own and I hope you will consider doing so.
