Dear Friends,

This month begins my sabbatical. A sabbatical is a time of reflection and renewal for clergy. Under the policies of our diocese, every clergyperson earns two weeks of sabbatical per year and may take that time beginning in the fifth year of their ministry at a church. Since I have been serving Advent for five years, through times of crisis and the pandemic, I desire some time to reflect and consider where we are heading for the future. I will take six of the ten weeks I have earned this year and will be gone from May 8 through June 19.

During the first three weeks, Brenda and I will travel to sacred places in Scotland. After some time at home, I will spend a week on retreat at a monastery in Michigan, engaging in prayer and seeking God's will for my ministry at Advent. I have chosen this monastic location in part because they offer all nine of the daily offices. I find this repeating cycle of prayer and silence brings clarity to me. I trust in the Holy Spirit to lead us according to God's will, and I hope to bring wisdom and insight back to our church so we can work together to follow the Spirit's lead.

While I am away, your Wardens will be in charge of the church. (Lew Price is your Senior Warden and Noel Smith Wong is your Junior Warden.) At their recent day-long retreat, the vestry created a survey of parishioners to learn about your dreams and visions for Church of the Advent. Please, do participate in the survey and give your answers prayerful thought. Things are going well at our church in many areas, but there are always things we can address, and we want to discern together where we are heading as disciples of Jesus Christ in the future. My sabbatical gives us all a time of reflection and visioning for the future.

My absence also gives you the chance to enjoy some variety in preacher and celebrant! Fr. Glenn Matis and Fr. John Mitchell will supply for the Sundays that I am gone. The Thursday noon Eucharist will be covered by Fr. Doug Eberly and Mother Caroline Carson (Rector of Holy Innocents, Beach Haven). If there are any pastoral emergencies, Mother Allison Burns-LaGreca (Rector of St. Mary's, Stone Harbor) and Deacon Jane Carol Wilson will be on call. Please reach out to Kathe Christensen in the office, or to one of the wardens if you need a clergy person for support. I know that Church of the Advent will be in very capable hands while I am on sabbatical.

May God bless all of us as we move forward together to love God, each other, and the people of Cape May.
