Dear Friends,

I recently attended the 2025 Annual Convention of the Diocese of New Jersey in Toms River, joined by Deacon Charlene Snyder, Trisha Andrzejczak, Joann Price, and Joel Rutenberg. It was a full and meaningful gathering, and I want to share some of the important highlights with you.

One of the most significant announcements was a **\$1 million gift** to the **Episcopal Diocese of Jerusalem** to support medical care for children in Israel, Palestine, and Gaza. This extraordinary act of generosity reflects our diocese's commitment to compassion and healing in regions deeply affected by conflict.

We were also delighted to celebrate the election of our own **Alice Barnes-Vasser** to the **Cathedral Chapter**. We are proud of her service to the wider church. Three congregations were officially admitted as parish churches of the diocese:

- · St. Peter's, Barnegat Light
- St. Mark and All Saints, Galloway
- St. Peter's Igbo, Hamilton

We welcome them and rejoice in their growth and ministry. Convention delegates also approved two important resolutions:

- The establishment of a Reparations Fund for Historic Black Churches, acknowledging the need for restorative justice within our diocesan history.
- A resolution supporting a **just and lasting peace in Gaza**, calling the church to continued prayer and advocacy for peace.

The diocese also reported on feedback from recent listening sessions, which identified several areas of need and opportunity. These included increased support for Spanish-speaking congregations, the creation of a designated priest to provide pastoral care in the diocese and consideration of calling a **Suffragan or Assisting Bishop** to support Bishop French in the workload of diocesan leadership.

Finally, there was a strong emphasis on the urgent need to strengthen and support our **small and vulnerable congregations**, ensuring that every parish can thrive in its mission and ministry.

Thank you for your prayers and your ongoing commitment to the life of our church and diocese. It is a blessing to serve alongside you. Faithfully,

## **EDUCATION COMMITTEE UPDATE**

The Education Committee recently met to review current and upcoming programs across all ages. Sunday school continues to be a vibrant space for children, even as attendance challenges remain. We are excited to share our Christmas story with the congregation on Sunday, December  $21^{\rm st}$  at the 10:30 AM service.

Our Confirmation Class, now meeting both in person and via Zoom, has 10 participants, including both youth and adults, reflecting the continued interest in faith formation across generations.

Adult programs bring a mix of study and reflection. The Monday night Adult Bible Study is exploring 1 Corinthians. The Women's Bible Study on Wednesdays will pause until January before resuming to continue learning and growing with the women of the Old Testament. Seasonal studies are planned as well: a four-week Advent series begins November 23 with Deacon Charlene teaching about the Lord's Prayer, and a six-week Lenten study on the Nicene Creed will follow in the spring. The committee looks forward to continuing to support the faith and growth of the congregation across all ages.
