Bus Trip to Remember Me Rose Garden September 18

Come along with us for a scenic bus trip along the Old Lincoln Highway.

The first stop will be at the Remember Me Rose garden in Shanksville. It is a living tribute to the 40 occupants of Flight 93 that crashed in a nearby field on September 11, 2001. There you will see a large compass design spanning a distance of 280 feet with a 30 foot fountain. Encircling the fountain are 40 rocks engraved with each of the names of the Flight 93 heros. Over 400 pink 'Julie Andrews' roses and hundreds of perennials fill the compass. It was constructed to be visible to planes flying overhead at more than 30,000 feet. We will have a guide here to tell us about the history and development of the garden.

Next we will travel to the Jean Bonnet Tavern near Bedford for lunch on your own. This landmark tavern from the 1760's also features an adjacent herb garden and a gift shop known as the Cabin Shoppe.

After lunch we will head to the Flight 93 National Memorial, where we will have a self-guided, interactive tour at the visitors center. We will pass by the 93 foot Tower of Voices, that contains one chime for each occupant of Flight 93. It is the only one of its kind in the world.

This tour will be on Wednesday September 18. The bus leaves GGC at 8:30 AM and will be back by 4:00 PM. Price is \$65.00/members or \$75.00/non-members. Call the office for reservations. 724 837-0245.
