



Our Mission:

Connecting through charitable targeted and universal support, seamless collaboration with local services and a family-centred approach we aim to educate, create opportunity and share skills that empower families to raise resilient, self-assured children with better health and social outcomes.



Over the past 12 months The Parenting Network (TPN) has expanded it's services, going from 6 to 8 core programmes. 2023/24 will see the launch of Get Set Go, a school readiness programme and Embrace, a support group for young people affected by ACE's - both programmes developed in response to the needs to our communities.

Portsmouth Bump & Baby launched in 2023, developing out of our former provision of Baby Massage. TPN is now the main provider in Portsmouth of free antenatal, baby massage and starting solids workshops.

Dadzclub has also grown extensively, launching across 3 new Family Hubs in Southampton and 2 new sites on the IOW.



Dadzclub Expansion

This year we have been delighted to see the expansion of Dadzclub across three localities, with sites now running in Portsmouth, Southampton and Isle of Wight. All of the Dadzclub programmes are now run as commissioned services through the local authorities.

Dadzclub now delivers weekly groups in the following Family Hubs:

Buckland, Portsmouth; Blackberry, Southampton; Clovelly, Southampton; Pickles Coppice, Southampton; Cowes, Isle of Wight; Ryde, Isle of Wight.

International Men's Day 2022

In November 2022, we were delighted to deliver Portsmouth's International Men's Day event at The Guildhall. The event supported the themes of International Men's Day: Making a positive difference to the wellbeing and lives of men and boys; Promoting a positive conversation about men, manhood and masculinity & Raising awareness and/or funds for charities supporting men and boys' wellbeing.

Highlights of 2022/23

Victorious Festival, August 2023

Our first year of delivering activities in the Kids Arena was a huge success!

TPN wanted to create an activity that would add value to families visiting the festival, while also reflecting the values of the organisation. Our 'Safety bracelets' provided a fun, creative activity for families to do together, but with parents phone numbers on each bracelet, had an added safety element to protect and safeguard children. Parents were really appreciative of this extra level of care, and it also became a valuable moment to have further discussions with children about safety at large public events.



We look forward to developing our partnership with Victorious Festival over the coming year to support more families in 2024!



Over **800** families took part with TPN over the Victorious weekend.



The Portsmouth Baby Bank exists to provide basic essentials to families most in need in our city. The Baby Bank can ensure that no child goes without milk (formula), clothing, nappies and toiletries. We also provide equipment to ensure babies and young children are living in a safe environment which is age appropriate for their needs.

Over the past year our number of referrals has increased dramatically, demonstrating the need locally, particularly in response to the cost of living crisis.

We know that providing support and intervention at an early stage leads to the most effective outcomes. These interventions work to reduce poverty in some of the most

deprived areas of the city (our most local schools have 59% children eligible for free school meals). For the parents the Baby Bank exists to reduce the stress and poor mental health that goes with struggling to raise a family in challenging circumstances.



In a recent survey, August 2023, referring professionals stated that the Baby Bank supported the following outcomes for their clients:



56.3% of all Baby Bank referrals this year have been from families in the Charles Dickens Ward, the ward with the highest rate of deprivation in Portsmouth, where records show 42.9% of people are income deprived.



The Baby Bank offers beautiful good quality second hand and new items without explanation or judgement - requests are quickly dealt with and the staff running the service are kind and helpful - Thank you!



The Portsmouth Baby Bank provide an outstanding service in the city. With the Portsmouth Baby Bank vulnerable families are given the opportunity to make sure their babies and children have access to basic products, clothing or toys. For many families it is very difficult to afford this, which can impact on their stress levels and mental health.

We have a wide range of partner organisations referring to the Baby Bank, with NHS Solent and Portsmouth City Council (Social & Housing) statutory services making up a large proportion of these referrals.

Portsmouth Bump & Baby has gone from strength to strength over the past 12 months. The project has grown from just fortnightly baby massage sessions, to weekly massage short courses, starting solids workshops and birth preparation workshops. All the sessions have been fully booked, and are generally well attended, with some families accessing multiple groups. The feedback from families attending has

been incredibly positive, particularly with regards to having groups that are in person, and free to access. We are starting to see the impact the continuity we provide is having, with families returning for baby massage having attended a birth workshop, or moving on to Families group when their baby has outgrown baby massage.

Sadzclub

Dadzclub has gone through an extensive expansion over the past year, is now proud to be a commissioned service in Portsmouth, Southampton & IOW.

Weekly groups

Dadzclub offers weekly stay and play groups to encourage family bonding and provide peer support opportunities.

Online Support Network

The closed Dadzclub social media group provides a platform for Dads to talk and share experiences outside of group. We often see this platform used for Dads to reach out for support and guidance from peers and it has become an important tool for social connection. The group currently has 988 members.

DadzChat

Dadzclub has continued to deliver monthly workshops in partnership with Talking Change, to support Dad's mental health. The sessions are informal and encourage Dad's to come together over a cup of tea, to discuss issues and challenges. Through this we are providing direct access to mental health support without barriers, and reducing the stigma of reaching out for help.

Having the opportunity to attend Saturday morning sessions with other dads is great for me as both a coordinator and a dad, because I get to connect with other men who are pursuing the goal of improving their relationships with their kids, as well as connect with other like-minded people too. Having only opened on the Isle of Wight in an official capacity for a month, we've already met new people who are expressing their excitement about the idea of the dad-specific sessions and can't wait for more dads to join.

Personally, as Senior Coordinator for Dadzclub, I am really excited about helping motivated and proactive men the opportunity to grow within themselves, and that goes for both coordinators and attendees alike. Being involved in developing training opportunities for coordinators can only help the Dadzclub team become a more impactful force in the community, with the payoff already being seen with feedback from dads who are thanking us for listening and providing the sessions.

It's clear to me how much this dad-specific service is not only needed to support the dads around us but also has the potential to be a truly empowering service to be able to help dads improve in more ways than just being "better dads"

Feedback from our Dads...

Dadzclub has 100% improved me as a father, both me and my son look forward to Dadzclub in equal measure.

Dadzclub plays an important role within the city to help Dads socialise with other Dads and their children. Being a father can sometimes be isolating and the group helps to make this easier.

Having now been along to a meeting in the evening for myself and another one in the day with my son, I have found them very welcoming. As a single Dad I have struggled to find groups like this with my son as they tend to be focused on Mums midweek. My son will be 3 in August and it had taken me this long to find something like this as not much exists for new Dads.

Dadzclub is an amazing, diverse space for father figures to meet and share experiences, or just shoot the breeze over a coffee. Matt will always go above and beyond to make Dadzclub sessions as inclusive as possible for a large range of children.

Dadzclub gave me the confidence to take care of our son on my own. Knowing I was going somewhere with other dad's took the pressure off myself. Dadzclub is open and friendly and promotes dad's talking to one another. I've been to groups with all women and no one talked to me at all. I felt quite intimidated.

Mischief Makers has continued over the past year putting on a series of special interactive cultural events for families.

At Christmas, two Mischief Makers workshops provided families with free 'Santa's Snowglobe' experiences led by Black Hat Theatre. These sessions were extremely popular and we saw a lot of crossover with our other groups, particularly attracting attendees from our Young Mums' Club groups.

We were then delighted to partner with HAF (Holiday Activities with food) to lead a series of Easter and Summer family workshops. Over Easter, we invited three local street artists to come in and work with families to complete large communal artworks. Over the summer, our extended Families workshops with community picnics were incredibly popular. Families really appreciated having lunch built into these sessions and we have recognised that our Families group has diversified and attracted new families as a result of the HAF sessions.

Young Mums' Club is growing from strength to strength this year. We have seen a significant and sustained rise in our numbers accessing groups which is wonderful! It means we are now having to cap our bookings and run waiting lists for groups, so we are eager and excited to look at how we can expand our offering to ensure all the families that want to engage with our services can.

This time last year our Monday group was averaging 4-5 mums on a good week but now runs with at least 10, which is wonderful. We continue to engage with lots of mums from the local hostels, which is really important work to support them in being the best parents they can be.

Tamsin from Talking Change continues to be an ongoing presence in our groups every few months, which is sending a powerful message of normalising the perinatal mental health pathway and accessing of their support services. It is also really valuable to have the expertise of Sarah Lewis (TPN) in our umbrella, being able to offer our mums targeted antenatal support and accessing her baby massage and weaning workshops.

Case Study

Project Coordinator, Kelly, received an email referral from a Family Nurse requesting to make contact with a mum to discuss YMC and encourage attendance, due to some acknowledged anxiety around attending groups. Kelly established text communication and then spoke on the phone with this mum, which resulted in her successfully attending group the following day. At this particular group the Lead Perinatal Therapist from Talking Change was also present to provide additional mental health support. After an initial chat with Kelly, the mum had a 1-to-1 session with the therapist and fed back that she felt a bit better about accessing support from them too. She has continued to attend YMC since.

87 sessions delivered125 unique families supported1084 adult engagements1349 child engagements

Of the challenges currently faced by our group members, they reported:

- 63% low income
- 58% poor mental health
- 53% low confidence
- 47% low self esteem
- 37% lack of support/family network
- 26% stigma around being a young mum
- 16% homelessness/unstable living situation





I've been coming since my daughter was 4 weeks old, at first I was pretty apprehensive, I wasn't sure if it was something I'd like, but I went anyway and I love it. I've met so many girls my age with babies and it's nice to be able to relate and ask anything that's bothering me. The groups have really brought me out my shell, the staff are friendly and helpful and nothing is ever too much for them. I always leave with a smile on my face and have definitely met some friends for life.



Young Mums' Club is a wonderful way to meet other mums and children. It definitely gets us out the house and it's twice a week which is fantastic. Kelly and Sarah are so lovely and passionate about the club, you feel so welcomed there.

I went to one of the ladies seeking advice on my low mental health and they directed me to support that I could get and continued to checkup on me and support me whilst they knew I was struggling.

- Development & expansion of the Portsmouth Baby Bank.
- The development of our volunteer programme, to support our work and provide skills and training opportunities
- The commencement of new programmes of activities, in particular Get, Set, Go! and Embrace.





New Projects

We are delighted to be adding two new projects to our core programme in 2023/24.



Get Set Go

School readiness is the crucial gauge of a child's preparedness to excel in school, encompassing cognitive, social, and emotional readiness. Our Get Set Go! programme draws on the extensive insights and expertise of the PEEP Learning Together Programme. It comprises five weekly session blocks and ad-hoc groups, designed to empower families in nurturing their children, ensuring they thrive and excel in their school preparations.

Portsmouth currently faces a pressing challenge, as it lags below the national average in terms of school readiness. Moreover, it holds the lowest percentage of children achieving a good level of development in the entire South East region.



Embrace

Embrace is an innovative project rooted in personal experiences of managing the effects of childhood trauma and dysfunction. In collaboration with PARCS, we are committed to offering weekly peer support groups for individuals aged 16-25 who are keen to understand how their early experiences may have influenced them and wish to discover strategies to overcome any associated challenges. Our platform provides a non-judgmental and non-diagnostic space to delve into well-being and foster connections.
