



CRISIS RELIEF FUND - MOAA

One of our former members, CPT Lauren Byrd, from five years ago, recently rejoined MOAA National, and our Chapter. She was medically discharged due to injuries. She took up Kayaking, and recently placed 8th in International Competition, and has made the USA Team for Open Water Kayaking. While she and her finance were kayaking in Kentucky, they offered to deliver emergency supplies and wound up delivering Insulin to an isolated former E-4, who mobile home suffered damage from Hurriane Helene. They met with former SPC Gunter, and took some pictures, and we submitted an emergency request to the MOAA Crisis Relief Fund, and we received very quickly approval for a \$1,000 grant for this former service member. This is an example of teamwork and helping former service members in crisis.
