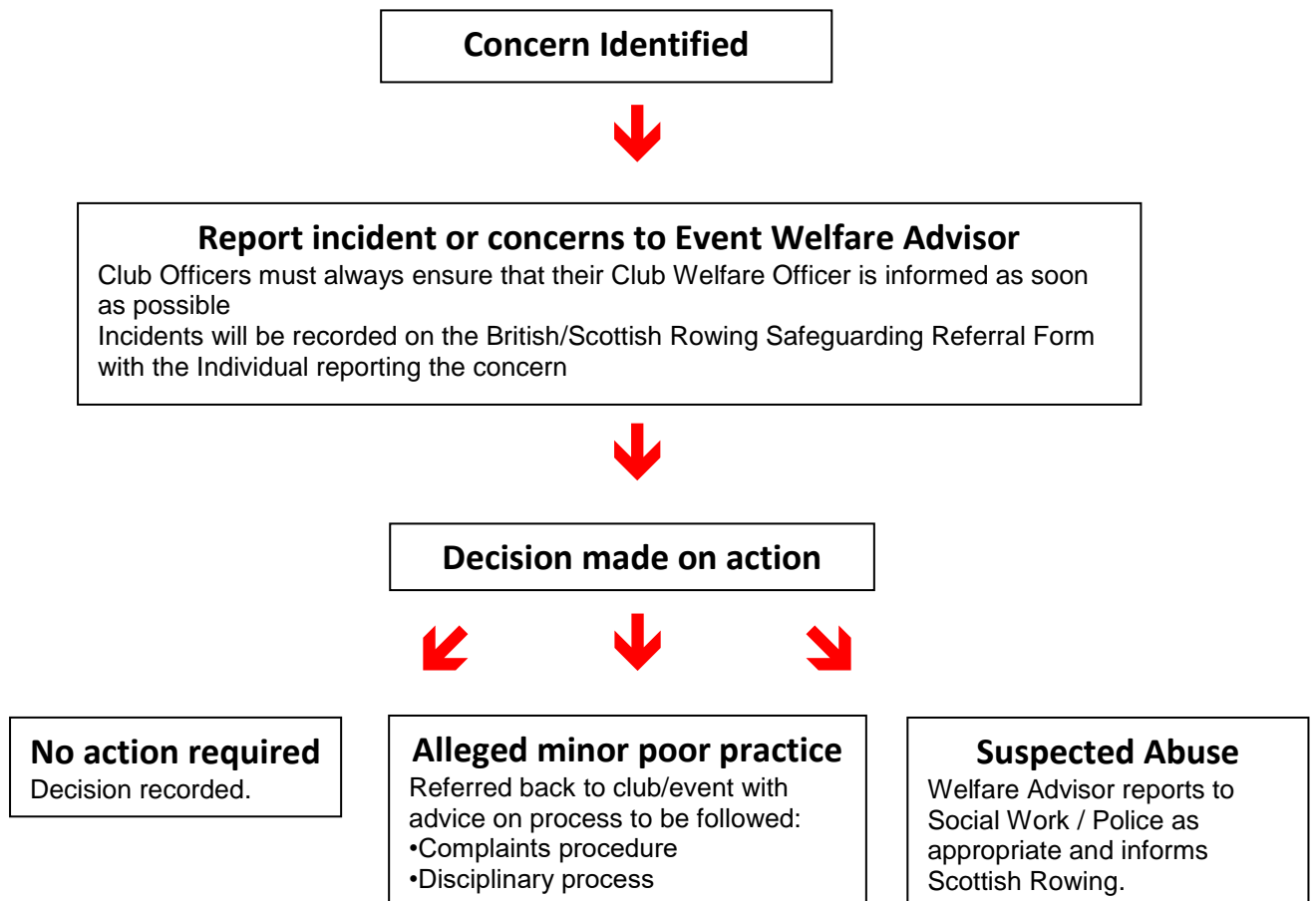
SAFEGUARDING AND PROTECTING CHILDREN POLICY

The Organising Committee of the Scottish Junior Sculling Head believe that the welfare and wellbeing of all children is paramount. All children, regardless of age, gender, ethnicity, religion or ability, have equal rights to safety and protection. All suspicions, concerns and allegations of harm will be taken seriously and responded to swiftly and appropriately. A welfare advisor for the competition will be appointed and will act as the point of contact for any concerns or allegations. Their contact number will be posted in the boating area throughout the duration of the competition. If anybody has a concern relating to these matters and is unable to contact the welfare advisor then speak to the nearest race official who will ensure contact is made without delay.

Missing Persons

Each coach is responsible for the welfare, safety and appropriate supervision of his/her crew and is expected to know the whereabouts of his/her crew at all times during the Regatta.

The Scottish Junior Sculling Head expects clubs and schools to have their own up-to-date Safeguarding policies, and that the coaches and those responsible for the junior members are aware of these policies and actively implement them throughout the Regatta.

Should anyone go missing or get lost during the event the incident should be reported to officials in the Registration Tent. Any young person missing for over 20 minutes will be reported to the police.

Photography and publicity

The Committee recognises that at a sports event such as the Scottish Junior Sculling Head many parents and other supporters will wish to take photographs and all participants should be aware of this. The Committee may make appropriate use of photographs of crews and races in publicity on its website.
