



Family Musical Coming to The Strand

Plattsburgh, NY – Artistry Community Theatre and the Strand Center for the Arts are ecstatic to present the classic, family musical, Fiddler on the Roof, this Spring at the historic Strand Theater located at 25 Brinkerhoff Street. Performances will be held on Friday, April 4 at 7pm, Saturday, April 5 at 7pm, and Sunday, April 6 at 2pm. Set in the little village of Anatevka, the story centers on Tevye, a poor milkman, and his five daughters. With the help of a colorful and tight-knit Jewish community, Tevye tries to protect his daughters and instill them with traditional values in the face of changing social mores and the growing anti-Semitism of Czarist Russia. Rich in historical and ethnic detail, Fiddler on the Roof's universal theme of tradition cuts across barriers of race, class, nationality and religion, leaving audiences crying tears of laughter, joy, and sadness. With iconic and beloved songs such as "Sunrise, Sunset," "If I Were a Rich Man" and "Matchmaker, Matchmaker," Fiddler on the Roof is the perfect mix of audience-pleasing humor and heart.

"Fiddler on the Roof is the quintessential musical," remarked Jason Borrie, who plays the lead role of Tevye, the dairyman. "The thread of themes in Fiddler on the Roof are universal, relevant, and eternal. Family, faith, modernization and progress, uncontrollable outside influences of daily life, and the strength of community are the guiding elements for all characters in this masterful piece of theatre from the golden age of Broadway." The role of a father is equally linked to his long marriage to his wife, Golde, played by Nora Mockus. The two work in tandem throughout the story as they both confront the same struggles with their family and community." Jason added, "Working with Nora is a joy and privilege. She is extremely talented and makes the development of these characters so much more in-depth." Jason considers the role of Tevye to be one the undeniable greats in the musical theatre canon. "I am truly humbled and honored to have the opportunity to play this amazing role. I am extremely grateful for the privilege to perform with such a talented cast and production team as we work on bringing this show to life. To play Tevye is a dream come true. I hope audiences will love and appreciate this show as much as I do."

Nora Mockus, who plays Tevye's wife, Golde, said, "I'm excited to be playing the role of Golde opposite Jason Borrie!" She continued, "Golde and Tevye have been married for twenty-five years and are the mother of their five daughters. She is sharp-tongued and a resilient woman who copes with hardship through strength and a dry sense of humor. Most wives and mothers will connect with Golde at least one point in the show." She concluded, "I'm truly honored to be a part of this show with its talented cast, directors, and musicians. I hope people come out to support local theater in our community."
