SUNDAY'S READINGS: THE LITURGY FOR SUNDAY, MARCH 25, 2018

Matthew 11:1-11

When they were approaching Jerusalem, at Bethphage and Bethany, near the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two of his disciples and said to them, "Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately as you enter it, you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden; untie it and bring it. If anyone says to you, 'Why are you doing this?' just say this, 'The Lord needs it and will send it back here immediately."" They went away and found a colt tied near a door, outside in the street. As they were untying it, some of the bystanders said to them, "What are you doing, untying the colt?" They told them what Jesus had said; and they allowed them to take it. Then they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their cloaks on it; and he sat on it. Many people spread their cloaks on the road, and others spread leafy branches that they had cut in the fields. Then those who went ahead and those who followed were shouting,

"Hosanna! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessed is the coming kingdom of our ancestor David! Hosanna in the highest heaven!"

Then he entered Jerusalem and went into the temple; and when he had looked around at everything, as it was already late, he went out to Bethany with the twelve.

Isaiah 50:4-9a

The Lord GOD has given me the tongue of a teacher, that I may know how to sustain the weary with a word. Morning by morning he wakens-wakens my ear to listen as those who are taught. The Lord GOD has opened my ear, and I was not rebellious, I did not turn backward. I gave my back to those who struck me, and my cheeks to those who pulled out the beard; I did not hide my face from insult and spitting. The Lord GOD helps me; therefore I have not been disgraced; therefore I have set my face like flint, and I know that I shall not be put to shame; he who vindicates me is near. Who will contend with me? Let us stand up together. Who are my adversaries? Let them confront me. It is the Lord GOD who helps me; who will declare me guilty?

Psalm 31:9-16

Have mercy on me, O Lord, for I am in trouble; * my eye is consumed with sorrow, and also my throat and my belly.

For my life is wasted with grief, and my years with sighing; * my strength fails me because of affliction, and my bones are consumed.

I have become a reproach to all my enemies and even to my neighbors,

a dismay to those of my acquaintance; \ast when they see me in the street they avoid me.

I am forgotten like a dead man, out of mind; * I am as useless as a broken pot.

For I have heard the whispering of the crowd; fear is all around; * they put their heads together against me; they plot to take my life.

But as for me, I have trusted in you, O Lord. * I have said, "You are my God.

My times are in your hand; * rescue me from the hand of my enemies, and from those who persecute me.

Make your face to shine upon your servant, * and in your loving-kindness save me."

St. Paul's Episcopal Church Vestry Meeting Minutes February 18, 2018

Members Present: Rose Andrews, Carol M. Canter, Misty Hartzog, Connie McNeill, Laura Welborn, Franz Yale, Tim Day, Ruth Harris, Jim Lyall, Tana Myers, Rev. Ann Dieterle

Others Present: Joe Richardson, Bill Harris

Rev. Ann called the meeting to order at 11:42am with prayer. A moment of silence was observed for the meditation.

December/January Meeting Minutes: Rose Andrews made a motion that was seconded by Laura Welborn to approve the corrected December and January meeting minutes. The motion passed.

Financial Report: Joe Richardson advised that pledge income for December was above budget. For the year 2017, total income was below budget; however, total expenses were also below budget giving a net income of \$38,680. Total income for January was above budget and included prepaid pledges of \$42,942. Expenses for January were above budget due to several factors including continuing education, youth ministry, insurance and electricity. Net income for January was \$21,716. Rose Andrews made a motion that was seconded by Franz Yale to approve the December 2017 and January 2018 financial reports. The motion passed. After a discussion of grantable monies, Connie McNeill made a motion that was seconded by Carol Canter to use any grantable monies that are available from The Peden Fund for construction projects. The motion passed. Joe attended the recent Vestry Leadership Day in Asheville. Bishop Jose' spoke and it was a very good experience.

Jr. Warden: Joe Fesperman submitted a written report. The bath room/wet bar area off the commons should be completed by the end of February. Construction has begun on the west side cemetery wall enhancement. The cost is approximately \$100,000 and is being funded by the generosity of Bob and Betty Strickland.

Sr. Warden: Connie McNeill welcomed the new vestry members. Rev. Ann will do a new vestry member orientation.

Vestry Liaison: Misty Hartzog advised that work on the blessing box is almost complete and planning is underway for vacation bible school which will be the second week of July. Joe Fesperman's written report for outreach outlined a new "Family to Family Grocery Relief Ministry" with more details to follow and the raised bed garden project. Carol Canter advised that crisis assistance had helped 46 neighbors for an average of \$100 this year. They feed 50 to 80 people lunch each Thursday. She attended an active shooter program the Wilkesboro Police Department held and would like to have one at St. Paul's.

Old Business: Rev. Ann advised that the organist search is ongoing.

Deacon's Report: Rev. Dn. Susan Whittington submitted a written report. She continues to work with others to nudge the shelter for homeless forward. She has taken people to visit Hospitality House in Boone and has received a single financial commitment for \$150,000 as a challenge grant and 3 gifts of \$10,000 each as matching grants. The facility would be an extension of Hospitality House. The need is great as 43% of the unsheltered people in NC live in the 7 county region served by Hospitality House. The current shelter in N. Wilkesboro is limited to a capacity of 10 individuals per night.

Rectors Report: Rev. Ann advised that St. Paul's Cares has been delayed due to a server change. She is working on a communications team to meet in March to look at redoing the web site and how communications go out to the parish. Plans are being worked on for an Easter Sunrise Service with other churches to be at the Wilkesboro open air market site. More details will follow. The vestry retreat will be March 3rd from 9 to 3 and there will be a March vestry meeting on March 18th.

The meeting closed with The Lord's Prayer at 1:06p.m.
