TRESPASSING



Trespassing is one of the most common juvenile offenses. While some believe the crime applies only to hopping a fence or violating a clear boundary, it can encompass more ambiguous conduct as well.

Returning to a Store After Being Banned



OHIO LEGAL CODE PREVENTS

(1) Knowingly entering the land or premises of another without permission

(2) Violating lawful restrictions to certain persons, purposes, or hours.

DISORDERLY CONDUCT

- Behavior that disturbs the peace or endangers community safety.
- Over <u>24,000 Teens</u> were arrested in 2020 for Disorderly Conduct

THINK BEFORE YOU REACT

FIGHTING

A small suffle that lasts for just a few minutes can have serious legal consequences.



Arguing with, threatening, or failing to comply to an officer may be enough to warrant arrest
