Bishops (Episcopacy)

We are an Episcopal Church. We are governed by Bishops who serve as our Chief Pastors. As a form of respect for the office we rise when they enter an assembly or when they are formally introduced. When Bishops are listed on a program they are to be listed in descending order. The most junior Bishop is listed first and the most senior Bishop is listed last.

Definitions

The African Methodist Episcopal

Zion Church is a worldwide religious organization composed of member churches which are collectivley referred to as the Connection. The Church is governed by a General Conference which meets every four years and is composed of delegates from twelve districts.

The General Conference is

composed of an equal number of lay and clergy delegates elected by their respective Annual Conferences. The primary responsibility of the General Conference is to enact legislation that establishes the conditions for membership, defines the powers and duties of the Conferences, establishes the powers and duties of the Bishop, provides for a judicial system within the church, establishes the budget for the denomination, provides for the election of Bishop and governing the local church and the general agencies with a unitary authority.

Protocol - "forms of ceremony and etiquette observed by diplomates and heads of state." "Code of correct conduct". It is the method of officially ranking or receiving officials.

Polity – "A form of government of a nation, state, church or organization"

Addressing the Conference/Assembly

The leaders are acknowledged beginning with the highest-ranking leader present *(in instances where the Presiding Prelate is expected, recognition of the office "in absentia" is appropriate)* and continuing in descending order of rank to the lowest ranking leader present. The rest of those present are addressed with a general greeting.

"The issue of protocol at connectional, annual and district conferences is very sensitive. A suggested protocol begins , General Officers, y Supervisors, ers, etc.

(FYI Justices are elected by the General Conference but are not salaried as Bishops and General Officers; but serve pro bono.)

Once the conference has been addressed (the first time), protocol has been established, it is NOT NECESSARY to address the conference AFTER protocol has been established (and confirmed by the chair).

The Proper Uses of a Divided Chancel

The Pulpit is to be used exclusively for:

- Reading from the Holy Gospel
- Preaching of the Word

The Lectern should be used for:

- Reading of the Old Testament Lesson
- Reading of the Epistles
- Reading of Notices and Announcements
- Call to Worship and Invocation
- Responsive Reading
- Lay Persons and Local Preachers will also speak from the lectern

The Procession:

In the Local Church

- ✤ Acolytes
- Crucifer
- Ushers
- Choir(s)
- Lay Participants
- Clergy Associates
- Pastor

In Annual Conference

Clergy from lesser rank to the greater rank (example -local preachers in the conference, deacons, elders, presiding elders, bishops)

In Connectional Meetings

Acolytes -Choirs-Lay Participants-General Officers (opt.) -Chief of Protocol (crucifer)-Retired Bishops -Active Bishops in descending order - Justices

Definitions (cont.)

Anglican Order Postures of Worship

Stand for praise (Canticles, hymn, creed); kneel for prayer; sit for instruction (lessons, sermon).

Laity – Collective name for the people; members of the church apart from the ordained clergy.

Apostolic Succession – The spiritual authority conferred by the laying on of hands in ordination upon the ministry of the church through a lineal succession of bishops from the apostles.

Chief Liturgist- plans worship service.
