New Ballot Law: Postmarks No Longer Count

Utah law now requires that mail-in ballots be received by your county clerk by 8:00 p.m. on Election Day (November 4, 2025).

This is a change from previous years—postmarks will no longer count.

What This Means for You

- 1. Mail ballots must be received—not just postmarked—by 8:00 p.m. on Election Day.
- 2. If mailing, ensure it arrives at the Cache County Clerk's office by 8:00 p.m.
- 3. Drop boxes are available until 8:00 p.m. on Election Day—the most reliable option.

How to Return Your Ballot

By Mail: Ensure your ballot is in the mail early enough to reach the Cache County Clerk's office by 8:00 p.m. on November 4. The U.S. Postal Service recommends mailing ballots at least one week before Election Day to account for potential delays.

In Person: Drop off your ballot at an official drop box location before 8:00 p.m. on Election Day. This is often the most reliable option.

The Official Drop Box in Richmond is located at:

90 S 100 W Richmond, in front of the city building
