This IEW writing course continues to develop students' writing skills using IEW's stylistic techniques and the nine units of structure. While learning more advanced writing techniques, students learn about key events and famous people of the Middle Ages. Inspired by the captivating tales of the Vikings, Charlemagne, castles, knighthood, and a variety of geniuses of the Renaissance, writers create imaginative texts of their own! After much practice with stylistic techniques, students learn to write two 5 paragraph essays based on their research and to join them together into a well-organized 12 paragraph essay!
