**United States Coinage**

**Colonials**

1. United States Colonial Fugio Cent, 1787 4 Cinq, Pointed Rays. NGC MS62BN with nice color with a hint of mellowed red in devices on a desirable, problem free flan – attributes beyond the technical grade. A prized uncirculated example of this popular one year type coin designed by Benjamin Franklin as our first widely circulating Cent.

**Half Cents**

2. 1794 Liberty Cap. Bold medium brown VF, some old scattered marks obverse and tiny pin scs reverse, but still a sharp and pleasing middle grade type coin.
3. 1802/0, Reverse of 1802. C-2. Key date example. NCS VF details, corroded yet sharp date & portrait with mostly brown overall color and appealing for this rare year, typical weakness at center of reverse.
4. 1828. NGC AU58 and attractive for the type. Sharply appointed and virtually new.

**Large Cents**

5. 1793 Chain Cent. S-3. ANACS VG-8 Details, corroded, damage – largely dark brown with bold portrait and a very strong Chain reverse, old marks at date.
6. 1793 Vine & Bars Wreath Cent. SEGS VF25, areas of darker patina with some roughness and lighter high points, a few old marks.
7. 1802. SEGS MS62 Brown.
8. 1857 Large date. N-1. Final year key date of the type and denomination. NGC MS63BN.
9. Vintage Album Collection of Large Cents & Lincoln Cents. Features an entirely unattributed collection of Large Cents – Liberty Cap 1794, full date plus 1795 & 1796 with nearly full dates, all respectable AG-Good/Fair-AG, the 1795 with bold reverse detail along with all different date Draped Bust(9) no 1799 or 1804; Classic Head(7) a few in decent collector grades; Coronet(22) and Braided Hair(18) including the 1857, VG-Fine, old marks and trace verdigris. Balance of set AG to VF, cpl holed, some damaged or edge marks, dark/patina, several with trace of old tape residue(likely removable), typical surfaces but a varied and representative run featuring some overdates and varieties. Also, Lincoln Cent Set, 1909 to 1940, missing only the 1909-S VDB and 1922 Plain - includes 1909-S and 1914-D, avg nice problem free sharp VG-Fine to Fine; 1911-S, 1922-D, 1924-D, 1931-S and other slightly better dates avg VF to sharp VF-EF. Balance of set avg circ to Unc, a few slightly better grade examples here and there. Both sets in old blue Whitman bookshelf albums and otherwise complete. A neat and original, early collector grouping worthy of inspection with many useful examples throughout. 59 Large Cents & 89 Small Cents.

**Small Cents**

10. 1877. Key date. Snow-1. PCGS VF35, nearly EF. The ever-popular rarity of the popular Indian Head Cent series.
11. 1914-D. Key date Denver Mint Lincoln Cent issue. PCGS AU50. Quite tough at the grade level, elusive this sharp.

12. 1955/55 Double Die Obverse. The most notable and famous key error Cent in the Lincoln series. NGC MS62BN CAC. Handsome, original, lustrous and desirable.

### **Three Cents Nickel**

13. 1888. NGC PF66CAM. A very pretty coin, rotated within the holder yet a bold contrast Gem.

### **Half Dimes**

14. 1803 Small 8 Draped Bust, Heraldic Eagle. SEGS AU55, vibrant iridescent blue and violet toning, a few fine old adjustment marks/faint toned in hairline scs reverse, yet exemplary eye appeal.
15. 1829. LM-1 and LM-3. Avg VF to Choice VF, the second with areas of deep slate toning. 2 coins.
16. 1829. LM-3. Choice EF-AU and very attractive when viewed at certain angles; reflective from an old cleaning, now retoning lightly in golden shades.
17. 1829. LM-6.3 and LM-7.1, R5 and R4 respectively. Avg VF to Choice VF, some lt old marks but sharply defined. 2 coins.
18. 1829. LM-10, R5. Nicely toned AU, attractive and colorful.
19. 1829. LM-10, R5. PCGS VF30 with original gray surfaces.
20. 1829. LM-10, R5. Choice VF-EF, retoning from an early cleaning, a few contact marks. Ex: Glenn Peterson.

34. 1831. LM-5. Choice EF-AU, color and iridescence in devices, primarily obverse. Quite nice.
35. 1831. LM-6. Choice gunmetal blue toned EF, small area of darker color above cap obverse.
36. 1832. LM-1, R4. Sharp EF-AU, very ltly wiped long ago, retoning with trace of color at borders, luster remains. A difficult variety in better grades.
37. 1832. LM-5. Lustrous white to pale gold Choice AU, a few faint trace hairlines yet great eye appeal and flash.
38. 1832. LM-6, R4. PCGS XF45 steel gray color.
39. 1832 Variety Triad. Features LM-7, R2, Fine/VF; LM-11.1, R5, toned Good-VG/Fine, patina reverse and LM-14, R4, VG/Good, lt marks, tiny indent reverse. 3 coins.
40. 1832. LM-8.4, R3 and LM-12, R2. Virtually EF and VF, some faint hairlines and tiny marks. 2 coins.
41. 1832 Variety Trio. Includes LM-12, R2, gunmetal toned EF; LM-13, R3, ltly clnd VF-EF and LM-14, R4, VF, a few small marks. 3 coins.

59. 1839-O. V-2b. AU-Unc detail with an ever so slight bend, highly lustrous though a tad bright from a lt wipe, extensive die cracks reverse and scarce. Also, 1840, V-6, bisecting die crack obverse, EF, old cleaning now retoning, some scattered tiny indents reverse. Interesting pair. 2 coins.
60. 1839-O. No Drapery. V-5, R2. PCGS AU50. *Ex Brian Greer*
61. 1840, Choice EF and 1843, V-4 shattered reverse die, sharp iron gray toned EF-AU. Nice pairing. *Ex: Brian Greer.* 2 coins.
62. 1841. Attractive AU with cobalt blue obverse toning and original golden hues, neat die clash reverse. Pretty coin.
63. 1842. V-1a shattered die reverse. PCGS AU53 with lovely jewel tone colors obv. *Ex: Brian Greer.*
64. 1843. Die crack bisecting the reverse. Ltly toned AU, luster.
65. 1843. Shattered reverse die. Wholesome totally original steel gray Choice EF. Unlisted in Valentine. Neat coin.
66. 1847. Deeply toned Choice EF-AU.
67. 1848. Large Date. V-1. PCGS XF45, strong originality. *Ex: Brian Greer.*
68. 1849, aEF; 1851, V-1A reverse crack at UN, Choice VF and 1857-O, V-4? Die crack between ME reverse, VF-EF, retoned nicely in blue and violet. 3 coins.
69. 1850. V-1 retained cud reverse. Well struck and lustrous AU. *Ex: Don Tarney.*
70. 1850-O. V-2 reverse cud. Sharply defined Choice EF. *Ex: Brian Greer.*
71. 1855 Arrows. V-4(?) with bisecting die cracks reverse. Intricate golden-gray toned AU-Unc, nice luster. *Ex: Brian Greer.*

- 72. 1857. V-7 or apparently so. Ltly toned AU.
- 73. 1857-O. Deep original toned EF-AU with select surfaces.
- 74. 1858-O. V-3 or seemingly so. EF-AU, likely ltly clnd long ago, now retoning in shades of gold.

### **Nickels**

- 75. 1868. FS-905, Reverse of 1868. PCGS Genuine, Cleaned VF details. A scarce and sought after Cherry Picker's Guide variety with no broken letters.
- 76. 1876. "The Bleeder" variety FS-401. PCGS MS64 with fabulous luster and strike, no spots, looks Gem! Pop 3 with 2 finer – variety listed on insert with vertical lines into shield. Rare in this grade level and a popular Cherry Picker's Guide variety.
- 77. 1913-D T-1, Unc details; 1916-S, AU details and 1931-S, Unc details – all NGC graded with cleaning noted on the slab inserts yet lustrous and appealing with golden-violet toning, cpl tiny toning spots. 3 coins.
- 78. 1913-S T-1, NGC AU55 and 1921, ANACS EF40. An appealing lightly circulated, straight grade pair. 2 coins.
- 79. 1914-D. NGC Unc details – cleaned. Still lustrous and flashy with pale gold and blue toning developing obverse/reverse. Scarce in higher grades.
- 80. 1915-D, AU55 details – cleaned yet actually quite nice with luster remaining; 1918, AU50 details – whizzed, but sharp and without harsh swirl marks; 1919 EF40 details – scratched and 1935-D, EF40. All in fresh ANACS yellow label slabs. 4 coins.
- 81. 1937. PCGS PR64 CAC and a lovely, delicately toned final year Proof Buffalo Nickel, appearance of a full Gem.
- 82. 1937-D 3 Leg Buffalo, Key variety. SEGS MS64+, dusky deep golden-gunmetal-gray toning with underlying luster. Always a popular and sought after historic error coin.
- 83. Buffalo Nickel Starter Collection Pairing, 1913-1938. Features one set minus the 1918/7-D and 3 Leg, otherwise complete at 64 coins save an added mint mark 1913-S T2 study piece. Avg circ to Unc, some nice VF early first year & sharp later dates along with sporadic soft or weak dates, but no date restoration and overall a pleasing upgradeable set in a deluxe Whitman album. Also, a lesser partial set of 60 coins, minus the keys and a few semi-keys, AG to VF, many partial, weak dates, restored or acid treated throughout, mostly on the early issues – housed in a nice vintage Library of Coins album. Viewing advised. 124 coins.

- 84. 1821 Large Date. JR-7. SEGS MS64+, outstanding strike and flashy luster, strong crossover potential.
- 85. 1837. Capped Bust. JR-2b. Advanced die crack and large retained cud reverse. PCGS AU58, undulating luster with splashes of amber toning. Nice example, looks Unc and very PQ.
- 86. 1839. No Drapery. Stone cold original Choice EF-AU with desirable gunmetal toning.
- 87. 1839-O. No Drapery. PCGS XF45, nice blue-gray toning with glimpses of gold.

88. 1886. PCGS PR65 CAC and difficult to contemplate why this nicely toned Gem did not receive a Cameo designation, pleasing and wholesome.
89. Mercury Dime Nearly Complete Set & More. Features Mercury Dime partial set, 1916-1945(73pcs) minus only the 1916-D, 1921 & 1921-D, no overdates but otherwise complete. Avg VG to AU in Whitman folder. Also, BEP Premium Historical Portfolio Changeover Pair of the two different type \$20 notes from Series 1995 & 1996, Gem CU in deluxe binder plus WWII Victory Commemorative Clad Half Dollar & Medal Set, c.1991-1995, Unc in folder of issue. 74 coins + 2 notes + medal.

90. 1815. B-1. A rare and desirable relic recovered from the Shipwreck of the Steamship Pulaski, sunk June 14, 1838 off the coast of Charlotte, NC – the ship was known as the Titanic of its era. NGC VF details Shipwreck Effect and close to XF. Housed in a custom wooden presentation box with COA booklet. Very seldom offered wreck and denomination, a handsomely detailed first year Capped Bust Quarter.
91. 1819. B-3. Bold Fine-VF, retoning nicely from a lt old cleaning in hues of champagne, gray and gold, cpl tiny rns.
92. 1825/4. NGC VF35 displaying appealing steel grayish-brown toning. A select example of the B-2 variant and looks like a toned XF, great for a type set and a cool early overdate.
93. 1853 Arrows & Rays. Choice EF with natural brownish-gray toning. An interesting retained cud reverse adds to the appeal of this one year type coin.
94. 1854 Arrows. PCGS XF45, sharp for the grade with organic deep gray toning.
95. 1867. Gorgeous multi-color toned PCGS PR66. Terrific eye appeal on this Reconstruction Era low mintage example.
96. 1902. PCGS PR64 with handsome hues of color accenting both sides of this virtual Gem with attributes beyond the grade level.
97. 1914-S. Better date. PCGS F12, pleasing stone gray with slate colored toning in devices.

98. 1805/4. O-101, R3. Deep steel gray and golden toned Unc, some scattered tiny marks, prohibitively difficult to locate at this level of preservation.
99. 1807 Draped Bust. SEGS MS63+, golden-russet to stone gray toning, softly struck obverse.
100. 1807. Draped Bust. O-102. Early PCGS Green insert OGH VF25 displaying deep old-time slate gray and pewter toning obverse; the reverse being light gray and gold with the appearance of a lovely XF.

Stately conjoined busts of Ulysses S. Grant and Robert E. Lee r.; Rx: Shields bearing Union & Confederate flag motifs; torch, sword and olive sprig with multi-line legend below. Unc with a few faint wispy inclusions and and cpl tiny old test marks on the edge, accompanied by its original presentation case. This example was presented to Walter Williams, Centenarian and the storied, possibly dubious forager for Hood's Brigade who died December 19, 1959. Williams, often revered by many as the last surviving Confederate Civil War Veteran, still to this day remains a famous yet undocumented mystery in the annals of history. This medal first reached the numismatic community via the Williams family in the 1976 ANA Sale conducted by Stack's as Lot #3321. The only other medal of its kind currently in public domain appeared in a NASCA sale of 1978, which was the William Lunday medal. The Albert Woolson specimen now resides in the Smithsonian Institution via the Sons of the Union Veterans with the fourth and final medallion being destroyed according to Stack's. A monumental rarity and sure to be the centerpiece of any medallic, exonomia or Civil War collection. An impressive and historic jewel weighing in at over 10 ounces of solid gold. Sure to incite spirited bidding on its way to a new home as one of this original quartet of medals may never surface again in the collector market.

386. **Rare & Unusual Experimental 12-Sided Libertas Americana Design Metallurgical Pattern/Trial Post-War Era 5 Cent Size Example in Cupro-Nickel Clad Steel.** 20.77mm, on a 12-Sided planchet that appears to be round when viewed head-on, made of three bonded/clad layers with a magnetized steel core and two outer cupro-nickel layers. The piece exhibits pronounced, deeply struck/dished fields and weighs in at 4.35 grams with a specific gravity of 7.9. The design depicts a Libertas Americana Portrait remarkably like the John R. Sinnock Assay Medal central design of 1945, though minus the Cap

and Pole. The reverse bears random sample letters and numerals at the center within a wreath; very close in nature to that of the G.M. Roller Die Cents by Frank Gasparro and earlier synonymous designs by Sinnock. This piece and a similar unverified one, along with a smaller and lesser weight Cent size discovery example have been the subject of numerous articles and studies, none with conclusive results since first reported in 1962. One can certainly speculate this design was possibly an expeditionary trial into the realm of the Canadian Five Cent coins of the WWII, Korean and Postwar period possessing similar edge designs and experimental compositions to allow for more economic mass production with metals not as critical to the war efforts. Quite possibly unique or one of only two known in this size and weight. Semi-reflective lustrous AU with the slightest hints of toning, the exposed core at the 12-sided edge displays some deeper colored areas of oxidation and micro traces of rust attesting to its steel content, visible only from the side view. A true enigma, and an important advanced technology prototype for the period. It is likely the dies or even the striking of this piece was possibly executed in part or whole at the U.S. Mint or by subcontracted agency affiliates in the automotive industry. Similar entities were approached during WWII and the Postwar era for affordable, high production run coinage alternatives. A rare, widely storied and well-documented Michigan collector find, detailed in articles by Ken Potter, The Numismatist, Coin World and Numismatic News. As the saying goes, it can now be yours if the price is right! Certainly worthy of a strong bid and further research, a rarity that cannot be acquired elsewhere in the marketplace.
