- 25 hours of Dual Flight Training in Single Engine Airplane
- 40 hours of Ground and Pre-Post Training and Briefing
- Duration of Training 2 to 3 Months (Full Time Student)
- Expect ADDITIONAL FLYING
 - o 5 hours of Solo Flight Training
 - o 2 hours of Spin Training
 - o 5 hours of Pre-Post Briefing

Part 61 training is about the same hours and duration

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- Meet the minimum course requirements
- Pass the FAA Knowledge Test (Written Test)
- Pass the FAA Practical Test (Oral & Flight Check)

Should be able to teach ground and flight lessons within or better than FAA standards
