Enrollment Requirements

- Hold a current FAA Medical Certificate
- Be at least 18 years of age
- Hold a U.S. Commercial Pilot Certificate – Airplane Single Engine Land or Airline Transport Pilot Certificate
- Hold an Instrument Rating for appropriate category and class
- Be able to read, write, speak and understand English Language

FAR Part 141 MINIMUM Training Requirements

- 25 hours of Dual Flight Training
- 40 hours of Ground Training

Expect Additional Flying

- 5 hours of Solo Flight Training
- Spin Training
- 5 hours of pre-post briefing

Duration of Training – 2 to 3 months

Graduation Requirements

- Meet the minimum course requirements
- Pass the FAA Knowledge Test (Written Test)
- Pass the FAA Practical Test (Flight Check)
- Should be able to teach ground & flight lessons within or better than FAA standards

Cost of Flight & Ground Training – BASED ON AVERAGE COURSE HOURS

- Cessna 172R/S rate is \$175/hour (with fuel)
- Simulator rate is \$75/hour (if required)
- Flight Instructor rate is \$75/hour (for Flight & Ground Instruction)
- Cost should be calculated based on Average Course Completion hours
- Pay AS-YOU-GO

Other Estimated Additional Expenses

- Books \$200
- FAA Written Test fee (FOI) \$160 (*Paid directly to testing agency*)
- FAA Written Test fee (CFI) \$160 (*Paid directly to testing agency*)
- FAA Flight Check fee \$800 (*Paid directly to the FAA Examiner*)
