Enrollment Requirements

- Hold a current FAA Medical Certificate
 - Hold a U.S. Private Pilot Certificate
 - Be able to read, write, speak and understand English Language

FAR Part 141 MINIMUM Training Requirements

- 35 hours of Dual Flight Training
 - 30 hours required for Ground Training
-

AVERAGE COURSE COMPLETION HOURS – FULL TIME STUDENT

- 50 hours of Dual Flight Training
 - 2 hours of Solo for FAA Check ride flight
 - 40 hours of ground/pre post training & briefing
 - Duration of training – 2 to 3 months
-

Graduation Requirements

- Meet the minimum course requirements
 - Pass the FAA Knowledge Test (Written Test)
 - Pass the FAA Practical Test (Flight Check)
-

Cost of Flight & Ground Training – BASED ON AVERAGE COURSE HOURS

- Cessna 172R/S rate is \$175/hour (with fuel)
 - Simulator rate is \$75/hour (if required)
 - Flight Instructor rate is \$75/hour (for Flight & Ground Instruction)
 - Cost should be calculated based on Average Course Completion hours
 - Pay AS-YOU-GO

- Instrument Pilot Kit (Supplies) \$200
 - FAA Written Test fee \$160 *(Paid directly to testing agency)*
 - FAA Flight Check fee \$800 *(Paid directly to the FAA Examiner)*
