



Red Neck Hot Tub (1/24 scale) Mike McFadden

Always on the lookout for RED NECK themes I came across the hot tub idea.

The idea is to create a party hot tub on the cheap. What better way to utilize the truck on blocks already in the front yard. Just head to Home Depot or the auto parts store, pick up a waterproof tarp and off you go. It has been funny, several folks have come up upon seeing the hot tub and said- 'you know, we did that when back at college'.

I ended up using multiple Ford 1970's pickup models. Mobius, AMT, others. I wanted a cab that gave me a detailed interior and had a decent front windshield as glasswork will always get your build. I detailed the cab- pedals, added holes and springs in the car seats, added new side panel gas cap, curtains (very important for Changin' privacy), hood, clothes hanger antenna, Changin' room sign.

I shortened the rear chassis about 7 mm to shorten the length for the hot tub itself. As the front disc brake areas would be visible, I detailed the right and left (thanks Dan Baker). Most of the shortened chassis was then done from the box.


The tub itself turned out to be more work than I'd thought. The mimic the blue tarp lining I used Keadatite 2-part putty used by figure painters for capes, etc. To have something to attach the tarp to I added 22 wire hooks into holes drilled into the bed. The water was done with a professional grade (not that model RR stuff) 2-part clear resin. It was built up in layers, lighting the dirty water effect as it comes to the top.

I wanted to show a many times redone truck. I painted the cab, then a front panel a different color with the hood white. I used the hairspray method to create the chipped paint. I painted the truck bed in camos (of course!).

I went to the decal folder for various oddball decals; however, bought a Hooters decal set as that was a requirement.

I added a diving platform on the top of the cab, what could be better than diving into a 3' deep tub?! To further the idea, I added a 3-D life vest. Not as many aftermarket items as I would have liked did find an auto shop details set. Added a Coke machine repurposed to dispense moonshine, trash can, scratched a barn/doors, chairs, beer cooler/bottles. The barn and roof were scratched from wood

SEPTEMBER: A totally 3-d printed figure, plane, vehicle or ship alone or as part of a diorama. Can be Sci-Fi or any genre.

OCTOBER: A helicopter from any country or time frame in any scale.

NOVEMBER: A 1/35 OR LARGER scale figure, bust or statue of a "famous" person. Can be a historical, scientist, musician, actor/ actress, etc. Male or female that is easily recognizable by most people.

DECEMBER: NO CONTEST, Holiday White Elephant



Remember, no one person (or a small handful) can make our club events happen. It takes ALL of us. Networking comes in many forms and can be as simple or involved as you would like.

Here are some ideas:

Volunteering - A well-run organization is only as good as its support. While monetary donations in the form of raffle items, tickets, trophy sponsorships,etc. are very much appreciated, the club also needs volunteers to man booths, set up and run Modelzona, represent the organization in other venues and help organize events behind the scenes. Please don't feel that the sub-committees are full. If you aren't sure how you can help, reach out to one of the active members. We'll be happy to steer you in the right direction. Or if you have an idea for other events, bring it up for discussion.

Interest Lists - Lyn Gorton has set up a list of members who are interested in sharing their personal information and specific modeling interests. If you have individual modeling questions, comments or would just like to reach out to communicate with other members with similar interests, this is a great resource.

Networking List - Unlike the Interest List, this newly suggested list is designed as a reference for non-modeling skill sets or resources. With a membership of over 100, there is so much untapped potential. Sometimes the club or a member might have a need for additional skills or services which would benefit the club. In this case, OOTB (Out Of the Box) means something else, think Outside the Box. For example, one new member has mentioned skill with silk-screening which is a great thing for the club to know. Another example is that Laurie Rice-Henthorn creates handmade cards, and likes to write and socialize.

Please note: Members sharing their offers of resources have the choice of sharing with the Social Committee only, or sharing with the entire club member list.

Build 'n Bull Sessions - Come spend a few hours working on your current projects and enjoying the company of your fellow modelers. Sessions are in the smaller room at the south end of the American Legion #1 building. You need not be a member of IPMS Phoenix to attend. For more information, check out the chapter website at https://ipms-phoenix.com.

Presenting - Each of us has specific interests and skill sets to offer. This does not mean that only the people with mega modeling skills can have something of interest to share. While those are always welcome, we have also had some very interesting presentations on a wide variety of personal experiences from members or their connections to others. Previous topics have included military, firefighting, aeronautics, and much more. Kevin Henthorn will be happy to hear from you.

Group Builds - If you are interested in working on a group build project (or just want to know more about them), Dekker Zimmerman is a great resource. He has organized various Craig Hewitt chapter group builds for several years, many of which have won awards at IPMS National Conventions.

Suggestion Box - Some members have no problem voicing their opinions and ideas in a large group setting, while others don't feel comfortable with this at all. Email is another good way to let your voice be heard, but it also comes with a return address. To improve on the participation of those wanting to remain anonymous, <u>Laurie Rice-Henthorn</u> has created a Suggestion Box, which she will bring to meetings. This is also a good way to share Networking List entries.

With all of these options, there are plenty of opportunities to get involved. Your club experience is only as good as you make it. And if you don't actively contribute or offer constructive suggestions, you can't complain that it's not what you expect.


