Deaf Culture is the shared language, values, beliefs, traditions, and way of life of Deaf people who use sign language. It is centered on visual communication, history, art, humour, and pride in Deaf identity. Deaf Culture is passed down through generations and views being Deaf as a unique and positive experience, not a disability.

The Deaf Community is the network of people who support and participate in Deaf Culture. It includes Deaf, DeafBlind, hard of hearing, and hearing people who use sign language and engage in Deaf life, such as family members, interpreters, teachers, and allies. The community brings people together through schools, organizations, events, and social connections that strengthen belonging and cultural identity.

The Edmonton Association of the Deaf (EAD) is proud to be the home of the Deaf Community, a welcoming space where Deaf, DeafBlind, hard of hearing, and hearing allies come together to celebrate language, culture, and unity.
