



Translation Policy

Confirmation of Translation Rights

Translators are expected to ensure that the translation rights for the original work have been obtained prior to the submission of the translated work.

Supporting Documentation

When submitting a translation (manuscript), translators are encouraged to include a letter from the rights holder confirming the availability of the translation rights. While the letter does not have a standard format, it should typically include:

- The name of the original author.
- The titles of the original work and the translation.
- A clear statement of the specific rights available (e.g., English translation rights).

This letter may be bilingual, and translators may draft it themselves if the original author is not proficient in English.

Submission Guidelines

To facilitate the submission process, translators should follow the Indus Auguries guidelines, which will include a provision for attaching the rights confirmation letter. This ensures that the magazine can verify the availability of translation rights when considering the submission for acceptance.
