### Gun Safety is Our Primary Objective

**The 1<sup>st</sup> Law of Gun Safety** – Treat all firearms as if they were loaded.

**The 2<sup>nd</sup> Law of Gun Safety** – Never point a firearm at anything you are not willing to destroy.

**The 3<sup>rd</sup> Law of Gun Safety** – Keep your finger off the trigger until your sights are on the target.

**The 4<sup>th</sup> Law of Gun Safety** – Always be sure of your target and what is around and beyond it.

Parker County Sportsman Club, established in 1956, is a non-profit organization managed by member-elected officers and board of directors. In order to protect our operational and well-maintained club environment, it is every member's responsibility to follow good safety practices, abide by range rules, and lend a hand where they are able. Be the example of a safe, friendly, and helpful member!

## Membership

- 1) **Family Membership:** Memberships include the entire family (the member, their spouse, and dependent children under the age of 18).
  - a. The member must wear the club-issued badge at all times while on club property.
  - b. Only two members of the family are allowed to shoot at a time, as the member is responsible for spouse and dependent(s).
  - c. All family members (excluding a member holding a Spouse Badge) are required to sign the Hold Harmless Agreement/Club Liability Waiver(s). The sponsoring member is required to sign the witness section of that same form.
- 2) **Guest Badge:** To allow one or more guests to shoot, a sponsoring member with a guest badge is required.
  - a. The guest must wear the guest badge at all times while on club property.
  - b. Only one guest or family member may shoot at a time.
  - c. The guest(s) or family member must shoot on the lane adjacent to the member.
  - d. All guests and family members (including a spouse without a spouse membership), must sign a Hold Harmless Agreement/Club Liability Waiver at the sign-in house each time the guest or family members arrive at the club whether or not they plan to shoot. The member is required to sign the witness section of each form.
  - e. In case of a crowded range, the member and guest(s) will shoot on the same lane.

## Arrival and Departure

- 1) **Arrival:**
  - a. Lock the gate behind your vehicle and move forward to the sign-in house.
  - b. Raise red flag indicating the range is in use.
  - c. If utilizing the sporting clays/archery ranges, also raise the orange flag indicating those ranges are in use.
  - d. Complete all information on the log at the sign-in house (name, member number, date, time of arrival, license plate, etc.).
  - e. All family members (excluding a member holding a Spouse Badge) and guest(s) are required to sign the Hold Harmless Agreement/Club Liability Waiver(s). The sponsoring member is required to sign the witness section of that same form.
  - f. If utilizing the sporting clays or archery ranges, you must also sign into the separate logbooks for those ranges.
- 2) **Departure:**
  - a. If departing from the sporting clays or archery ranges, sign out of the appropriate logbook and pay the fee for the clays used.
    - a.i. Lower the orange flag if you are the last person to leave the sporting clays/archery ranges.
  - b. Sign out of main logbook at the sign-in house. Please complete all information (time of departure, ranges utilized, concerns or comments).
  - c. If you are the last member to depart from the club, lower the flags.
  - d. Lock the gate behind your vehicle after passing through.

## General Rules

- 1) **Shooting Hours:**
  - a. Legal sunrise to legal sunset.
  - b. Board approval may be given for special events such as night shoots.
- 2) **Alcohol and Illegal Drugs:**
  - a. Members and their guests are prohibited from using or being present on club facilities when under the influence of alcohol or drugs.
  - b. Alcohol and drugs are prohibited on club property.
- 3) **Minors (17 years old and under):**
  - a. Minors must always be accompanied and supervised by the member.
  - b. No “horse play” is allowed while on club property.
- 4) **Keep the Range Clean:**
  - a. Place used targets, brass, and any trash in the provided bins.
  - b. Leave club property cleaner than when you arrived.
  - c. A dumpster is available near entrance for extra trash.
  - d. Keep any misfired (struck primer) cartridges and deactivate them at home.
- 5) **Willful Destruction of Club Property:**
  - a. Do not shoot at target frames, frame holders, or non-approved targets.
  - b. Do not dig into berms.
  - c. Do not use any other method that may cause destruction of club property.
  - d. Do not shoot the baffles.
- 6) **Restroom:**
  - a. Keep doors closed to prevent wildlife from entering the restrooms.
  - b. Report water leaks as soon as possible by calling the club office at 817.271.0467.
- 7) **Wildlife and Domestic Animals:**
  - a. It is prohibited to shoot, trap, bait, or otherwise disturb wildlife without written authorization from the Parker County Sportsman Club (PCSC) Board of Directors.
  - b. If domestic animals come onto the property and near a range firing area, halt firing activities until the animals are removed from the property.
- 8) **For Profit Use:**
  - a. Members who wish to use the club property for personal profit or special events must have approval from the Board of Directors. Supply proof of necessary liability insurance, and provide compensation as determined by the Board of Directors.
  - b. During on-site training classes, the club member instructor is the sole club sponsoring host required.
- 9) **Matches and Events:**
  - a. Matches and events for members and their guests are allowed with approval of the Board of Directors.
  - b. PCSC matches and events are posted on the club's website ([www.parkersportsman.com](http://www.parkersportsman.com)) and in the monthly newsletter.
  - c. Range(s) being used in a match or special event is closed to regular shooting until the match or special event has concluded.
  - d. Range flag control and usage is under the active control of the match director or special event director and may deviate as needed from standard rules and controls stated herein for the duration of the match or event.

- e. Other deviations from these standard rules may occur as authorized by the Board of Directors for the match or event, such as target types, target locations, participants' movement and shooting locations upon the range during the match or event.

**10) Understanding of Club Rules:**

- a. It is the member's responsibility to understand and abide by the rules herein.
- b. Bring a copy or have electronic access to rule book while on club property.
- c. The rule book may be revised from time to time. The version in effect is the version on the club website. Download a new copy as the annual update becomes available on the website.

**11) Safety/Rule Violations:**

- a. Members observing other members committing unsafe actions, violations of rules, theft, or abuse of club property should engage with the other member(s) at that time to assist in resolving any issues. When that is not possible, then the observing member is to report the incident to the club by either calling the club's office at 817.271.0467, or emailing to [membership@parkersportsman.com](mailto:membership@parkersportsman.com), or by using the club's safety incident reporting system.
- b. Information recommended for this report includes a description of the actions observed, identification of those committing the actions via pictures or video, or description of vehicle(s) and license plate(s) of those observed. Please be as thorough with your information as possible to help club leadership address the issue. As a self-policing club, it is your duty to report violations.
- C.** Safety or rule violations will be reviewed by the Board of Directors, assisted by the Safety Committee when requested, who will then determine if repercussions are required for the involved members.

## **Shooting Rules**

**1) Protective Glasses/Ear Protections:**

- a. All participants must wear appropriate eye and ear protection while near the firing line and live fire is taking place. This applies to both shooters and spectators.

**2) Automatic Firearms:**

- a. No automatic firearms are allowed to be used on club property.
- b. No simulated automatic firearms devices are allowed for use.
  - b.i. This includes, but is not limited to crank fires, hell fires, bump stocks, slide fires, binary triggers, etc.
- c. Shooters must manage their shooting speed to ensure all projectiles impact the back berm.

**3) Approved and Prohibited Ammunition:**

- a. Each range may have individual ammunition limitations (see each range section herein).
- b. No .50 BMG is allowed.
- c. No tracer, incendiary, armor piercing, steel core, or steel jacketed ammunition is allowed. Note: steel jacketed ammunition is typically older Eastern European ammunition with a copper coating over steel jacketing on the bullet.
- d. No Bottleneck calibers Greater Than .338 and Less Than .50

See Appendix A for approved and non-approved calibers between .338 and .50

Club members wishing to use rifle calibers not listed in or approved in Appendix A must meet with the board of directors for approval prior to usage of that firearm on club property.

- e. Pistol cartridges (straight wall) up to and including .50 are allowed. Anything greater than .50 is prohibited. Pistol cartridges on Range G up to and including .45 auto are allowed. Anything greater than .45 auto is prohibited.

See Appndix A for non-approved calibers for Range G.

**4) Courtesy:**

- a. Do not handle other people's firearms or equipment without permission.
- b. Treat others with respect and patience.
- c. Cease fire should be called at 20-minute intervals so shooters can change targets, unless otherwise agreed upon by all shooters on the range.
- d. Shoot in your designated lane. Do not shoot diagonally across lanes.
- e. If using a drone on club property, be courteous with its usage near others.

**5) Sighting in Firearms:**

Sighting in is defined as the process of adjusting a firearm's sights or optics so that the bullet point of impact matches the shooter's point of aim at a specific distance. This should be done when shooting a new firearm, when using new optics, or when the point of impact is in question.

- a. Use Range A for initial sighting in of rifles.
- b. Use Range F for initial sighting in of pistols.
- c. Pistol caliber carbines - .44 magnum or larger, sight in on Ranges A and then on Range B prior to use on Range C.

**6) Shooting at Steel Targets:**

- a. No steel target can be used until a safe point of impact on the backstop can be built. The rules will be updated and published at that time.

**7) Black Powder and common substitutes like Pyrodex and Triple Seven:**

- a. Keep all powder containers capped when not in use.
- b. Leave percussion caps off until ready to shoot. Do not load a frizzen pan until ready to shoot.
- c. Absolutely NO SMOKING in proximity of loading area.
- d. Shooting black powder or common substitutes during a burn ban is permitted provided that shooters follow these rules.
  - d.i. No use of dry patches during a burn ban
  - d.ii. Club provided fire fighting equipment at the range is confirmed to be in place and at the ready.
  - d.iii. After shooting, the shooter shall scan the area and extinguish any embers.
- e. Exercise common sense and avoid shooting if conditions, such as extended drought, increase the risk of fire.
- f. Muzzleloading rifles shooting black powder or common substitutes may be used up to and including .54 caliber projectiles.

**8) Air Guns:**

- a. Muzzles must be pointed downrange when loading projectiles.
- b. High-pressure air tanks must have current certification and be restrained to the bench or ground.
- c. Rifles must be on racks when the range is declared cold.

**9) Target Frames/Target Placement:**

- a. PCSC provides target frames to be used in designated target frame holders.
  - a.i. Paper targets and balloons should be positioned in the center of the target frame and attached to the backer to prevent destruction of the framing.
- b. Personal target frames are prohibited.
- c. Do not use any other target frame holders without Board of Directors' approval.
- d. Target types allowed on each range are listed in the table below.
- e. Appropriate target types (reference Table of Approved Targets) may be placed on the range's back berm. When placing targets on the back berm, the targets must be positioned between 3 feet and 7 feet as measured from the ground level in front of the back berm.
  - e.i. Do not dig into or otherwise change any berm.
- f. Place targets and review shooting angles to ensure all projectiles impact the back berm.
  - a.i. Bullets striking the ground in front of the back berm could skip over the berm. Projectiles leaving the range are your responsibility.
  - a.ii. Shooting targets placed on or near the ground or timber crossties is prohibited.
- g. Mounting targets on any baffle on any range is STRICTLY FORBIDDEN.

### HOT/COLD Range Procedures

**1) Cold Range – Yellow Flag:**

- a. To establish a cold range, all firearms must be unloaded with actions open or secured in a case. Empty chamber indicators (ECI) are highly recommended to be placed in the open actions.
  - a.i. Place double action revolvers with the cylinder rotated open.
  - a.ii. Place single action revolvers either with cylinder removed or secured in a case.

- a.iii. Place muzzleloaders on half cock and ensure no percussion caps are in place.
- b. Place the yellow flag in the flag holder in front of the firing line benches.
- c. Declare the range cold to anyone else present at that range.
- d. No handling of any firearms, cased or uncased, is allowed at this time.
- e. The range is now safe to go downrange.
- f. Everyone at the benches must remain behind the red line after the range is declared cold.  
Do not approach the bench for any reason.
- g. Do not load or unload firearms from your vehicle while the range is cold.
- h. Range Specific:
  - h.i. Ranges A and Range F – If the firing line is moved forward, the Yellow Flag must be in place to indicate to new arrivals at the range that people are downrange.
  - h.ii. Chronograph Setup (Ranges A, B, C, and F) – wireless video cameras and drones may be used on Ranges B and C. No one is allowed downrange, and everyone must remain behind the red line until chronograph, wireless video camera, or drone setup is complete. Upon completion, announce to everyone that the setup is complete, and range can go hot or remain cold.

2) **Hot Range – Red Flag:**

- a. Ensure no one is downrange.
- b. Place the red flag in the flag holder in front of the firing line benches.
- c. Declare the range hot to anyone else present at that range and remind everyone to have eye and ear protection in place.
- d. This is the only time you may handle firearms.
- e. You may move firearms to or from your vehicle while the range is hot.
- f.** As a courtesy for the next member, if you are the last person leaving a range, make sure the red flag is posted so the next member may immediately unload their firearms from the vehicle upon arrival at the range.

## Range Specific Rules

1) **Range A (25 and 50 Yards):**

- a. **Approved Firearms:**
  - a.i. Handguns
  - a.ii. Rifles
  - a.iii. Shotguns
  - a.iv. Hunter/silhouette handguns
  - a.v. Pistol caliber carbines
  - a.vi. Pre-charged pneumatic air guns
  - a.vii. Black powder guns
- b. **Approved Ammunition: See Appendix A**
  - b.i. Rimfire
  - b.ii. Centerfire
  - b.iii. Shot (at targets placed on back berm only)
  - b.iv. Slugs (at targets on the back berm or on target frames)
- c. **Shooting From the Bench:**
  - c.i. When firing from the bench, place the muzzle over the yellow stripe on the front of the bench.

**d. Shooting From the Holster:**

- d.i. You must move the firing line forward so that you do not draw from the holster while standing on concrete.
- d.ii. When drawing from the holster, do not sweep the muzzle on any body part of yourself or others.
  - d.ii.1. No shoulder holsters, cross drawing, or small of the back holsters are allowed.

**e. Moving the Firing Line Forward:**

- e.i. The firing line may be moved forward of the concrete if all shooters agree, but only for 20-minute intervals.
- e.ii. When transporting firearms forward of the bench, handguns must be secured in a holster that fully encloses the trigger guard or unloaded with the chamber open and magazine removed, and empty chamber indicator (ECI) inserted.
- e.iii. If the firing line is moved forward, the yellow flag should be in place to indicate to any new arrival not to handle firearms as shooters are downrange.
- e.iv. Shot shells shall be fired in front of benches at approved targets on the berm.
- e.v. When using targets on target frames with the firing line moved forward, the center positions on the 50-yard line shall be used.

**f. Sighting In Firearms:**

- f.i. Range A is the designated range to sight in rifles and hunter/silhouette pistols.

**g. Shooting Personal Steel Targets:**

- g.i. Use of personal steel targets is prohibited on Range A.

**2) Range B (50 and 100 Yards):**

**a. Approved Firearms:**

- a.i. Rifles
- a.ii. Shotguns
- a.iii. Pistol caliber carbines
- a.iv. Hunter/silhouette pistols (6-inch barrel or longer, magnum or bottleneck cartridges only)
- a.v. Pre-charged pneumatic air guns
- a.vi. Black powder guns

**b. Approved Ammunition: See Appendix A**

- b.i. Rimfire
- b.ii. Centerfire
- b.iii. Slugs

**c. Shooting From the Bench:**

- c.i. When firing from the bench, place the muzzle over the yellow stripe on the front of the bench.

**d. Shooting From the Holster:**

- d.i. Shooting from the holster is prohibited on Range B.

**e. Moving the Firing Line Forward:**

- e.i. Moving the Firing Line forward is prohibited on Range B.

**f. Sighting In Firearms:**

- f.i. It is required that all rifles and hunter/silhouette pistols be sighted in on Range A before shooting on Range B.

g. **Shooting Personal Steel Plates:**

- g.i. No steel target can be used until a safe point of impact on the back berm can be built. The rules will be updated and published at that time.

3) **Range C (200 and 250 Yards):**

a. **Approved Firearms:**

- a.i. Rifles  
a.ii. Hunter/silhouette pistols - 7.5-inch or longer barrel; magnum or bottleneck cartridges only  
a.iii. Pistol caliber carbines - .44 magnum or larger (must sight in on Ranges A and Range B first)  
a.iv. Air guns prohibited  
a.v. Black powder guns

b. **Approved Ammunition: See Appendix A**

- b.i. Centerfire only

c. **Shooting From the Bench:**

- c.i. When firing from the bench, place the muzzle over the yellow stripe on the front of the bench.

d. **Shooting From the Holster:**

- d.i. Shooting from the holster is prohibited on Range C.

e. **Moving the Firing Line Forward:**

- e.i. Moving the Firing Line forward is prohibited on Range C.

f. **Sighting In Firearms:**

- f.i. It is required that all rifles, pistol caliber carbines, and hunter/silhouette pistols be sighted in on Range A and Range B before shooting on Range C.

g. **Shooting Personal Steel Plates:**

- g.i. No steel target can be used until a safe point of impact on the back berm can be built. The rules will be updated and published at that time.

4) **Range D (Shotgun Only - Trap/Skeet/Patterning Boards):**

a. **Approved Firearms:**

- a.i. Shotguns (18-inch barrel or longer, must be fired from the shoulder)

b. **Approved Ammunition:**

- b.i. Shot (#7.5, 8, or 9 shot while shooting clays)

c. **Shooting From the Stations:**

- c.i. Shooters may only load shotguns while standing on shooting stations and ready to shoot.  
c.ii. Only two shells may be loaded at a time while shooting doubles or consecutive singles.  
c.iii. Only one shell may be loaded on skeet station 8.  
c.iv. Only one shell may be loaded when shooting trap.

d. **Patterning Boards:**

- d.i. Located north of Trap/Skeet field 2.  
d.ii. Alert any shooters on field 2 before using patterning boards.  
d.iii. Boards are set at 27 and 40 yards.  
d.iv. No buck shot or slugs permitted.

5) **Range E (Shotgun Only - Manual Traps):**

- a. **Approved Firearms:**
  - a.i. Shotguns (18-inch barrel or longer, must be fired from the shoulder)
- b. **Approved Ammunition:**
  - b.i. Shot (#7.5, 8, or 9 shot while shooting clays)
- c. **Shooting From the Stations:**
  - c.i. Shooter must stand perpendicular to the manual trap.
  - c.ii. Never stand behind the operator with a loaded firearm.
  - c.iii. New shooters should use shooting cage for added muzzle control.
  - c.iv. Do not shoot clays outside of the red safety zone markers.
  - c.v. Only load one shell at a time for singles, or two shells if you are shooting doubles.
  - c.vi. Use caution when operating manual traps to avoid serious injury.
- d. **Personal Clay Throwers:**
  - d.i. Use of personal throwers is permitted.

6) **Range F (Pistol and Pistol Caliber Carbines):**

- a. **Approved Firearms:**
  - a.i. Handguns
  - a.ii. Pistol Caliber Carbines (16.25-inch barrels and less)
  - a.iii. Rifles (.22 LR caliber only)
  - a.iv. Non-pre-charged pneumatic pellet guns (no BBs)
  - a.v. Black powder guns
- b. **Approved and Prohibited Ammunition: See Appendix A**
  - b.i. Rimfire (.22 caliber only) acceptable
  - b.ii. Centerfire (pistol caliber only, e.g., 9 mm, .357 SIG, 5.7 mm) acceptable
  - b.iii. Centerfire and bottleneck rifle cartridges prohibited (e.g., 5.56, .223, 7.62, .300 Blackout, .30 Carbine, etc.)
  - b.iv. All shotgun shells prohibited.
  - b.v. Pellets (up to .25 caliber)
- c. **Shooting From the Bench:**
  - c.i. When firing from the bench, use caution to avoid shooting bench front lip and range cover support beams.
- d. **Shooting From the Holster:**
  - d.i. You must move the firing line forward so that you do not draw from the holster while standing on concrete.
  - d.ii. When drawing from the holster, do not sweep the muzzle on any body part of yourself or others.
    - d.ii.1. No shoulder holsters, cross drawing, or small of the back holsters are allowed.
- e. **Moving the Firing Line Forward:**
  - e.i. The firing line may be moved forward of the concrete if all shooters agree, but only for 20-minute intervals.
  - e.ii. When transporting firearms forward of the bench, handguns must be secured in a holster that fully encloses the trigger guard or unloaded with the chamber open and magazine removed, and empty chamber indicator (ECI) inserted.
  - e.iii. If the firing line is moved forward, the yellow flag should be in place to indicate to any new arrival not to handle firearms as shooters are downrange.

- f. **Sighting In Firearms:**
  - f.i. Range F is the designated range to sight in pistols.
- g. **Shooting Personal Steel Targets:**
  - g.i. Use of personal steel targets is prohibited on Range F.

7) **Range G (Club Provided Steel Plates):**

- a. **Approved Firearms:**
  - a.i. Handguns
  - a.ii. Rifles (.22 caliber only; no other rimfire)
  - a.iii. Pistol Caliber Carbines
    - a.iii.1. Pistol Caliber Carbines with barrels 16-inches or shorter are permitted.
    - a.iii.2. Limited to straight-wall case ammunition including 10mm and .45 ACP (No .44 magnum, .223 Remington/5.56, etc).
- b. **Approved and Prohibited Ammunition: See Appendix A**
  - b.i. Rimfire (.22 caliber only; no other rimfire) acceptable
  - b.ii. Centerfire (pistol only, up to and including .45 auto) acceptable
  - b.iii. Prohibited ammunition and bullet types
    - b.iii.1. All shotgun shells are prohibited.
    - b.iii.2. Armor piercing or solid copper rounds are prohibited.
    - b.iii.3. Bottleneck cartridges are prohibited.
- c. **Shooting From the Stations:**
  - c.i. Unlock and open shooting station window.
  - c.ii. Engage targets, paying attention to steel color for its associated ammunition limitations.
    - c.ii.1. Yellow plates are for .22 rimfire ammunition only.
    - c.ii.2. White plates are open for all firearms and ammunition types in this section.
  - c.iii. Upon completion of the firing session, close shooting station window and lock it.

8) **Archery Range:**

- a. **Approved Firearms:**
  - a.i. Firearms are strictly prohibited.
- b. **Approved Bows:**
  - b.i. Longbows
  - b.ii. Compound bows
  - b.iii. Crossbows
- c. **Approved Arrows:**
  - c.i. Target points only (no broad heads or hunting points)
- d. **Shooting From the Stations:**
  - d.i. Log into the archery logbook in the sign-in house.
  - d.ii. Raise the orange and red flags.
  - d.iii. All bows are to be drawn and pointed downrange directly towards the target.
    - d.iii.1. Sky draws are strictly prohibited.
    - d.iii.2. Make every effort to ensure arrows impact the target/backstop.
    - d.iii.3. Bows are not to be drawn at any time while a person is downrange.
    - d.iii.4. Do not shoot across lanes.

d.iv. Targets are not to be relocated except by authorized personnel, however, the block target may be rotated to change the four faces.

9) **Sporting Clays:**

- a. Log into sporting clay logbook.
- b. Raise orange and red flags.
- c. **Approved Firearms:**
  - c.i. Shotguns (18-inch barrel or longer, must be fired from the shoulder)
- d. **Approved Ammunition:**
  - d.i. Shot (#7.5, 8, or 9 shot)
- e. **Shooting From the Stations:**
  - e.i. Shooters may only load shotguns while standing on shooting stations and ready to shoot.
  - e.ii. Only two shells may be loaded at a time.
  - e.iii. When going downrange to load machines make the station cold by placing the yellow chain across the cage.
- f. Pay fee for the clays at the sign-in building before leaving the property.
