- Competitors set up their target(s) and target frames on the range after registration.
- Match safety briefing begins at 8:45 AM in the clubhouse but may be conducted at the range as the match director specifies.
- The safety briefing identifies and reviews the following:
 - Personnel conducting the match including Range Safety Officers (RSO's),
 - Range specifics for the match,
 - Safety and medical equipment locations and usage,
 - Match course of fire.
- The match begins immediately following the safety briefing.
- Post-match actions – target collection, scoring, and award presentation.

June Urban Rifle Match

21 June 2025

8:00 AM range opens / set up / registration

8:45 AM safety meeting – match starts after meeting

Range C: 250 yards / 150 yards / 10 yards

Rifles / Equipment: 3-gun competition with

- (1) Scoped rifle with bipod or PCSC-supplied Caldwell bag and rear bag, no mono-pods
- (2) Carbine or AR-type rifle with open sights or red dots
- (3) Semi-auto pistol

Course of fire:

Stage 1 – 250 yards, prone with scoped rifle, B-27 target, 10 rounds (with magazine change, no sighters) / 5 minutes

Stage 2 – 150 yards, kneeling or seated with carbine or AR-type rifle, B-27 target, 20 rounds (with magazine change 10 / 10) / 3 minutes

Stage 3 – 10 yards, standing with pistol, IDPA target, 10 rounds (5 rounds using both hands / magazine change / 5 rounds with strong hand only) / 45 seconds

Cost: \$10 per rifle

Rules: Open to PCSC members and guests only.

Open sights or optics (4.5X magnification maximum)

No Bags or bipods

Course of fire: B-27 target, 30 rounds total, no sighters

250 yards, prone, 10 rounds in 90 seconds with 1 reload

200 yards, sitting or kneeling, 10 rounds in 90 seconds with 1 reload

150 yards, offhand, 10 rounds in 90 seconds with 1 reload

Cost: \$10 per rifle

November Precision Rifle Match: Modern and Vintage Sniper Rifles

15 November 2025

8:00 AM range opens / set up / registration

8:45 AM safety meeting – match starts after meeting

Range C: 200 yards / 250 yards / 270 yards (Berm)

Rifles / Equipment:

Vintage and Modern Rifle Divisions

**Bolt action or semi-auto rifle – .223 through .30
calibers allowed**

Optics required / no open sights

No restriction on optics for Modern rifles

Max power 4.5x for Vintage rifles

Bags or bipods / rear bag or monopod allowed

Spotters allowed



Course of fire: Prone, 20 rounds / 20 minutes (no sighters)

200 yards / 5 rounds / B-29 target

270 yards / 10 rounds / B-29 target

250 yards / 5 rounds / B-29 target

Cost: \$10 per rifle

Rules: Open to PCSC members and guests only.

Service Rifle Match

Pre-Match Safety Rules

- No concealed handguns allowed during the match. Please leave them in your car.
- As soon as a rifle is removed from a vehicle, gun case, or container, it must have the action open, magazine removed (if removable), and an Empty Chamber Indicator (ECI) inserted in the chamber. It is recommended to carry your rifles in a case to the staging area.
- Place rifles on storage racks with the action open and ECI inserted.
- While at the staging area or while moving to the firing line, rifles shall be carried with the ECI in place, the magazine removed, and muzzle pointed down range or up.
- DO NOT REMOVE THE ECI unless you are on the firing line with the range hot and receive direction by the Match Director.
- DO NOT SWEEP OTHER COMPETITORS OR OBSERVERS WITH THE FIREARM MUZZLE.
- Eye and ear protection must be worn when near the range.
- Be aware of the range flag (range HOT / range COLD), people down range, and improper handling of firearms.
- NO HANDLING OF FIREARMS WHILE ANYONE IS DOWN RANGE.
- Positions on the firing line (either before the match or during the match) are not assigned, and positions are taken on a first come / first served basis. If many competitors (and / or multiple rifles per competitor) are competing, then multiple relays will be fired allowing everyone the opportunity to compete.
- Specific match safety rules will be covered during the Match Safety Briefing prior to the match.
