

- Match safety briefing typically begins at 8:45 a.m. in the clubhouse, but may be conducted at the range as the match director specifies
 - Safety briefing identifies and reviews
 - The match personnel conducting the match
 - The range particulars for the specific match
 - The safety and medical equipment locations and usage
 - The match course of fire
 - The post-match actions target collection, scoring, and award presentation
- Match begins immediately following safety briefing
