






### New Hampshire 2012 – 2017

Average of <u>over 800 children</u> annually with an elevated blood lead level greater than 5  $\mu$ g/dL.

Fewer than 17% of children under 6 years in NH have had a blood lead level test.






























### Lead Exposure's Negative Impact On Specific Abilities

- These effect persist, from childhood through adulthood













































## Disclosure of Information on Lead-Based Paint and/or Lead-Based Paint Hazards Lead Warning Statement

Every purchaser of any interest in residential real property on which a residential dwelling was built prior to 1978 is notified that such property may present exposure to lead from lead-based paint that may place young children at risk of developing lead poisoning. Lead poisoning in young children may produce permanent neurological damage, including learning disabilities, reduced intelligence quotient, behavioral problems, and impaired memory. Lead poisoning also poses a particular risk to pregnant women. The seller of any interest in residential real property is required to provide the buyer with any information on lead-based paint hazards from risk assessments or inspections in the seller's possession and notify the buyer of any known lead-based paint hazards. A risk assessment or inspection for possible lead-based paint hazards is recommended prior to purchase.






### Real Estate Disclosure Rule Requirements Recap

- Pamphlet on identifying and controlling lead-based paint hazards titled <u>Protect Your Family From Lead In Your Home</u>
- Any known information concerning the presence of lead-based paint or lead-based paint hazards in the home or building.
- A "Lead Warning Statement" and confirmation that the seller has complied with all notification requirements.
- A 10-day period to conduct a paint inspection or risk assessment for leadbased paint or lead-based paint hazards.

### Ways to Keep Your Home Lead Safe

- Keep the paint in your home in good condition.
- Keep your home clean.
- Use cold tap water for drinking and cooking.
- Identify potential sources of lead in and around your home.

# Renovation, Repair, and Painting (RRP) Rule Recap

- Firms are required to be certified with EPA.
- Firm's employees must be trained in the use of lead-safe work practices by taking an 8 hour training course in order to become a "certified renovator".
- Firm's employees must implement and follow the lead-safe work practices that minimize occupants' exposure to lead hazards
- Firms must comply with EPA's Pre-Renovation Lead Information Rule: Renovate Right pamphlet
