She was instrumental in developing new processes and policies for this non-profit and streamlined the accounting procedures for the book sales. Marilyn was given the Best Friend Award for 2021 posthumously for her dedication to the Friends.

How did Marilyn achieve these accomplishments? She had a strong will to succeed at whatever she tackled. She was her high school valedictorian in 1968, graduated in accounting with Honors from Texas Tech University in 1971, had an illustrious career as a Certified Public Accountant for national firms such as Arthur Andersen & Company, First International Bancshares,



the Air Force Medical Service Corps, proudly serving her country in uniform. Retiring to Temple, their favorite of all their home towns, Marilyn and husband Richard found the Temple library, with Richard working part time in the Circulation Department.

Marilyn is survived by her husband of 48+ years, a brother, two children, and five grandchildren. Please remember that she is also survived by many friends. and especially the Friends of the Temple Public Library. We miss her so much.

Those with memberships normally renewing Mid-Winter 2021, will now have until Mid-Winter 2022.

The support of our members is essential to us, and we hope we can count on you again. Those with expiring memberships should have already received an email or mail renewal notice. Renewals may be made by mail prior to or in person at the Aug. 31 preview sale.

If you have not been a member before, you can pick up a membership application at the library's circulation desk, print a form online or become a member at the sale on Aug. 31. Memberships start at \$10 per individual and \$20 per family. All money derived from memberships goes to support the Temple Public Library and its programs.

The Temple Public Library has established a memorial collection in the memory of Pruitt Davis. Books related to the art of writing will be included in the collection and a memorial plate naming Pruitt will be affixed to the cover plate of each volume.

Pruitt was a dedicated member of the Friends of The Temple Public Library. He worked tirelessly with the weekly book sorting team. This team sorts, catalogs, and packs all the books destined for the Friends Book Sales. Pruitt was extremely instrumental in advancing the idea of more detailed sorting and categorizing prior to the sale thus helping customers more easily find specific items.

The "Sorting/Packing Team" misses Pruitt and all of us are grateful for his ideas and hard work. In addition to volunteering at the library, Pruitt volunteered with the Alzheimer's group at St. Francis Episcopal, and taught a writing class at the Sammons Community Center... That writing class created an anthology last year just about the time Pruitt passed away. Class members wrote tributes to Pruitt and included them in the anthology. Leslie Little the Adult Services Librarian has a copy of that anthology, called "Writing Together."

The Pruitt Davis Memorial Collection will be funded by donations through the Friends of the Temple Public Library.

A New Look at the Library

On June 4, the Temple Public Library launched their new logo with a Brand Launch Party. This event was held during the First Friday celebration downtown and was an opportunity to showcase all of the exciting things happening at the library, especially the Summer Reading Program that is sponsored by the Friends of the Temple Public Library. This event took place from 4 PM to 6 PM at the library and included music, raffles, giveaways, new Library cards, snow cones, and Summer Reading sign-ups. At the event, the 271 members of the public attended, with 197 upgrading their Library card to the new logo and 29 opening their first Library card account.

In attendance were several members of the Friends of the Temple Public Library, City Council representatives, the Mayor, representatives from the City Manager's Office, and reporters from the Temple Daily Telegram who wrote an excellent article on new branding.

The library's new logo is three lines of text in blue, chartreuse, and pink, colors that pop and hopefully inspire excitement in the minds of those who see it. As part of the rebranding, these colors were incorporated in the building with a change in signage, juvenile bookshelves wrapped in blue, the teen bookshelves wrapped in chartreuse, and the book drops, parking garage sign, cloud above circulation, and exterior windows wrapped with all three colors.

Along with the brand launch, the city also invested in cleaning up the exterior of the library which included power washing the sidewalks (Transform Temple), power washing the building (Building and Facilities), and sprucing up the planters around the building (Library staff, Parks and Rec, and Transform Temple). This reinvestment has made the building a more exciting and attractive part of downtown life and provides a welcoming atmosphere for residents of all ages to explore, create, and connect.
