With modest prices on thousands of books and other media in almost 100 categories, this event is a standout in Central Texas, drawing customers from all over the state and beyond.

The Heart of the Booksale—Donated Books: Over 90% of books and media available for sale come directly from private donations, and we are grateful for the generosity of our community. Your gifts support literacy throughout the Temple area and provide the library with funding for special projects and programs. While we prefer gently used materials, we gladly accept all book and media donations in virtually any condition. Don't worry, we will sort them and dispose of any that are too badly damaged to include in the sale. Just bring your donations to the Circulation Desk and we will do the rest. If items are usable but not in good selling condition, we make many items available for free between our semiannual sales events. (Check the table in the ground-floor foyer for giveaways.)

Members and Volunteers Get First Choice: The first day of the sale is dedicated to members of the Friends of the Temple Public Library. Your membership directly supports the library's mission and, as a thank you, we invite you to join us on Monday, February 26, before the sale is open to the general public. Individual and family memberships are available at the sale preview.

Games, Media, Textbooks, Medical Reference, and More: In addition to books, we accept and offer games, computer programs, CDs, audiobooks, puzzles, and other materials supporting literacy at every sale. You can even donate electronics!

Featured Category: Military History: We've received several generous community donations from military history buffs. If you're interested in the heritage of the US armed forces, the history of conflict from ancient times through the present, or biographies and memoirs of notable military leaders, you won't want to miss the Mid-Winter sale this February and March.

**Super Low Prices:** With an average price of just over \$1.00, you cannot beat the sale prices. Throughout decades of sales, we have rarely raised prices because we want every book to find a home. Children's books range from \$0.50-\$1.00; most adult paperbacks are \$1.00 and hardbacks \$2.00. Saturday is bag day: just \$5.00 for all the books you can fit in a large paper grocery bag. Bibles are always free.

**Teachers and Educators Get 20% Off:** We thank our community educators with a 20% discount every day of the sale except during the Monday Member Preview. This is a great opportunity to stock up on your favorite children's books, classroom giveaways, and reading program incentives at the lowest prices you can find anywhere. Yes, homeschool teachers, educational aides, and other instructional staff are eliqible for the discount – just let us know at check-out.

Special Pricing for Sets, Selected "Picks," and Vintage Books: If you wish you still had the set of encyclopedias that was on your bookshelf at home when you were a kid, be sure to check out the sets area at the sale. We might just have what you need.

the cold weather blankets much of the country — even Central Texas — we look forward to staying warm inside and reading a book! Snug by a fireplace, under a quilt or throw, kept company by a beloved cat or dog, we can let our minds escape to other climates and other worlds revealed through bargains we've found at the twice-a-year Friends of the Temple Public Library used book sales. If you need to replenish your to-be-read stack, you don't have to wait much longer. The Mid-Winter 2024 Used Book Sale, featuring thousands of bargains for \$2 or less, begins with a members' preview from 10 a.m. to 7 p.m. on Monday, February 26.

As a Friend, you are invited to preview and purchase books and other offerings <u>before the public</u>. If you are not a member but would like to come to the preview, you may join at the door! Individual memberships are \$10; Household memberships are \$20; Patron memberships are \$100; Benefactor memberships are \$250; and Lifetime Memberships

are \$1,000. Business memberships range from \$500 to \$1,500. Cash, checks, and credit/debit cards are accepted.

The event draws repeat customers from near and far — booklovers looking for bargains, collectors hunting for hard-to-find titles, and Friends members excited to see one another again. The sale is open to the public February 28 through March 2.

The Friends of the Temple Public Library, a 501 (c) 3 charitable organization formed in 1965, has labored for seven decades to extend the library's capacity through volunteers, program support and outreach, awareness building, and fundraising. The Friends give \$35,000 to \$55,000 annually to fulfill the Librarian's Wish List, which includes needs not funded by the City of Temple. Friends' contributions have included building renovations, two bookmobiles, furniture and equipment, and services and programs, such as the children's summer reading program. Currently, the Friends have 252 members, including 16 patrons and 10 Lifetime Members.

The Friends accept donations of gently used books, CDs, and DVDs all year at the library's Circulation Desk. Volunteers working year-round prepare donations for used book sales in February/March and August/September. At each sale, more than 45,000 books are pre-sorted into over 90 categories and displayed in the McLane Room of Temple Public Library's third floor. Proceeds from each sale usually range upwards of \$25,000 and are earmarked by the Friends for library projects and needs.

In addition to sorting books and volunteering at book sales, Friends members volunteer at the library, help with children's programs, and serve on Friends' committees and the board. If you would like to join this vibrant group and work to build a better Temple Public Library and a better community, we welcome you. We need energetic members who are enthusiastic about books, reading, the library, ideas, and people.
