

Members I spoke to who had been at the Red Jacket in the past expressed their gratitude to be back and new members seem to love the place.

First let me start by congratulating Kim Donahue, Postmaster Haverhill, on her re-election to the position of Sec/Treasury for the next two years. Overseeing the finances of the MA Chapter is a very important, time consuming and misconstrued position on the E-Board and she has been doing an outstanding job since she took over in the spring of 2023.

Second, I would like to congratulate Keith Miller, Postmaster Gloucester, for his election to the position of Editor. I'm confident that he will bring new ideas and a different prospective to this position.

I also want to thank Deanna White, Postmaster Nutting Lake, for serving as Editor since 2022. This was Deanna's second time in this position as she also served as Editor with NAPUS from 2013-2015 as well as held the position of Vice-President/Membership Chair for MA NAPUS.

John Douds, UPMA Nat'l VP Atlantic Region represented the national office and provided remarks to the group. He also presented the 3 proposed national bylaw changes and conducted the written ballot elections for National President and Nat'l VP Atlantic Region. Tony Leonardi is running unopposed for UPMA National President and there were two candidates for the Nat'l VP Atlantic Region position, Morty Bennett, VA UPMA President, and Stephanie Thompson, PA UPMA President. The results of all voting, including the proposed bylaws, will be cast at the national convention in Orlando FL in August.

The convention was not all business. There were a lot of fun times and many laughs. We had a BBQ with car races, the auction, music entertainment, and a laptop hooked up to a large screen so that we could enjoy two big TV events without sound, the Kentucky Derby and game 7 of the Bruins round 1 stanley cup quest vs. the Toronto Maple Leafs.



The MA scholarship fund is the beneficiary of \$2515 which consisted of auction proceeds of \$2106 and direct donations from some members of \$409. PAC money was also raised through the race cars for \$200, direct donations from some members of \$417, and \$710 from the 50/50 raffle for a total of \$1337. Retired Postmaster Jean Burchill walked away \$710 richer from the 50/50. Congratulations Jean!

The Retirees held a business meeting of their own where Lorna Edie was re-elected as the Sec/Treasurer for the MA Chapter. She went over the treasurer report which included income and expenses from November 1, 2023 – April 30, 2024.

I reminded everyone that there is still time for children, grandchildren, etc to apply for the National UPMA scholarship. The deadline is July 15, 2024 and information is on the national website.

We discussed the two candidates running for two national retired positions that had contacted me. Anita Pfiefer is a candidate for national Retired Treasurer and Patti Bascom is a candidate for national Retired Secretary.

I discussed information regarding the mandatory Postal Service Health Benefit program that will become effective January 2025 with plan choices to be made during open season in 2024. 












2024 Scholarship Winners



As I enter my second year as yourRegional Vice President, I would like to thank you all for the trust and support you have given me in my first year in office and tell you how deeply touched I was to receive the Leader of the Year from UPMA. We continue to have many challenges which we will face together this year.

The Postal Service Health Benefits Plan (PSHB) takes effect on January 1, 2025, and will be administered by OPM. You will be required to enroll in the new program and select a health insurance plan during the 2024 open season November 11 through December 11, 2024. UPMA has posted a lot of information on this topic, and I highly recommend viewing one of the ZOOMs prior to September so you will know which plan will be best for your family.

We received some interesting news on May 24 which affects all postmasters and supervisors in our Cape and Islands area. The Postmaster General in a letter to the Chairman of the Homeland Security and Government Affairs Committee announced that he was pausing the Delivering for America program rollout on September 30, 2024. The Wareham Sorting and Delivering Center was scheduled to open in January 2025 and is not listed in the letter to be completed prior to this pause. Boston is listed #1 on the list of 28 S&DC to be completed and I believe that is actually Braintree which opened on June 1, 2024. As many of you are aware UPMA visited Washington DC in March and met with members of Congress and shared our concerns with the Wareham S&DC and the impact it would have on mail delivery and staffing due to traffic concerns and future bridge construction.

Our newest member of our postal family arrived in April. Please welcome Evie Catherine Phelan! Congratulations to Mike and Sarah Phelan on a beautiful baby girl. Mike is the Mashpee Supervisor of Customer service and I'm happy he is back to work.




My Postal Town

I love the city and people of the town I am the Postmaster of. My city is Gloucester, Massachusetts. I became the Postmaster of Gloucester on July 6th, 2019. Gloucester is a fishermen's community, located on "the other cape", Cape Ann, which is about 30 miles north of Boston. Gloucester's

inner harbor is literally about 100 yards from the main post office on Dale Ave. Just a minute walk from our office and you'll have a fantastic view of all the harbor's activity. The view never gets old! As for our postal services, we have our main office as well as 3 outlying retail stations. We are a Level 21 office of 26 routes.

Gloucester was settled in 1623 and incorporated as a city in 1873. This past year Gloucester celebrated its 400th anniversary. Gloucester is also the nation's oldest fishing port and remains even now one of its busiest. On any given day hundreds of thousands of pounds of fresh fish and lobster are unloaded at its docks to be shipped countrywide.

The summer months in Gloucester are packed with things to do. Whether it's attending an outdoor concert, checking out the wonderful Cape Ann Museum, taking in a trip on a whale watch boat, or just hanging at one of her many pristine beaches, there are always things to enjoy about this vibrant city!



Gloucester's summer schedule is highlighted by 3 main Festivals. They are the Schooner Festival, which happens in early September, the Waterfront Festival (mid-August), and the nearly 100-year-old St. Peter's Fiesta, which runs for 5 days in late June. The Fiesta is an Italian-American festival, honoring the fishing community's patron saint, St. Peter, and draws tens of thousands of spectators from all around the country. One of the main attractions of this festival is the Greasy Pole contest. Check it out on YouTube! Bragging rights goes yearly to those skilled (brave?) enough to navigate a heavily greased 45-foot-long pole extended off a platform 200+ feet off Pavilion beach. It's "much watch" for sure!

There is so much more to see and do in this beautiful and picturesque fishing community. Make sure you check out our famous Man at The Wheel statue located on Stacey Boulevard which honors the more than 5000 men and women lost at sea over the last 4 centuries. This small city has everything a person could want, from its working waterfront, to its thousands of acres of woods and parks waiting to be explored, and of course its many restaurants known for their seafood!

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
