

Crazy Hope Community Center - Update

Over the past several months, much has been going on behind the scenes. Most recently, Community Connections Darlington has acquired the deed to the Crazy Hope Community Center and has thus taken complete ownership of the building.



Community Connections has also been working with both our architect and engineer to update our design and structural plans in order to prepare for future renovations. This is a necessary step so that we can provide these plans to contractors as we request quotes and hire contractors for the work to be done in each of the remaining phases. While a more detailed report will be available in the near future, listed below is our most recent updated plan with phase two emphasized.

Phase 2 : Main Interior Space, Conference Room, Office, Bathrooms, & Storage - IN PROGRESS

- served over 7,000 meals

- provided Thanksgiving dinner plates at the soup kitchen in addition to the East McIver community, and the Washington Street, Indian Creek, Bowmen Manor, and Pine Village apartment complexes in Darlington

Team Member Highlight - Trinity Methodist Church of Darlington

physical need for a hot meal. The TMCD Soup Kitchen ministry members along with help from other church members provide and serve a warm filing meal on their assigned Saturday morning.
