- b. All burials will require a standard vault of steel, concrete or fiber glass. The type of vault must be approved by the Superintenden
- c. Multiple burial lots may contain a burial with a standard vault and cremation vaults.
- d. A maximum of six cremation burials, (if space is available), may be placed over an existing interment. The number of burials per lot is at the discretion of the Superintendent.
- e All gravestones set at ground level will not to exceed the width of the lot including the cement border, including multiple burial lots. A minimum fee will be set by the Board.
- f. Normally no interment will be made on Saturday or a holiday, however, the family responsible may request that this be done on any of these days with the understanding that there is an added charge involved.
- g. No grave will be graded or mounded and the top of each grave will be level with the surrounding lots when fully settled.
- h. No person will open or close a grave, set any marker or vault or receive any other service until they have paid in cash a fee fixed by the Board to the Superintendent or other authorized employee.
- i. Lot holders are not permitted to allow any interment to be made in their lot for remuneration.
- j. Graveside services are limited to one (1) hour as the grave needs to be filled in for safety and liability issues.
- **4. FEES AND CHARGES.** The Board will establish fees for all services such as burial rights, opening and closing of graves and additional fees for services provided at other than normal times as stipulated in these rules and regulations. A schedule of fees is available in the office of the Superintendent.
 - a. The Board will also establish the fees for the deposit into the endowment care fund (perpetual care) in accordance with Section 8738 of the Health and Safety Code.
- **5. LEGAL PROVISIONS.** In addition to the provisions established by law for the operation of the District's cemetery the following rules apply:
 - a. Burial shall be limited in accordance with Section 8961 of the California Health and Safety code.
 - b. Each purchaser of burial rights will be issued a certificate of purchase. The interest acquired by the purchaser will not be an interest in real property, but will simply be the revocable right granted to the certificate holder to use his lot for burial purposes. An assignment may be made of burial rights by the purchasers to immediate family members during their lifetime, or by will, or acquired by inheritance. If the transfer or assignment is to a local resident, they may exercise their burial rights.
