

As part of our Lost Letters project with Surrey History Centre, It's Not Your Birthday But... are inviting you to 'borrow' words from old letters and reimagine them with your own thoughts, stories or creative responses.

Breathe new life into words taken from letters written in 1917 and the 1940's. Think about how these borrowed words may provide inspiration, or be used to explore our own experiences.

The words we have borrowed were found in two separate sets of letters in the archive. The first were written by Captain George Alexander Birnie in 1917, and the second were written by Frank Baker to his wife Isabel in the 1940's. Below is a photo of Captain Birnie, who was serving in the 8th East Surreys in WW1 in France:




Respond to the borrowed words below and reinvent them. Use them in your own way in a story, poem or letter or as inspiration for a piece of art.

Some of the words below were borrowed from letters by Captain George Alexander Birnie of Victoria, Australia. He enlisted in the Royal Army Medical Corps in 1914 before sailing to England to fight in France. During his service, Captain Birnie was wounded in a bloody battle at Passchendale Ridge, where '750 men went over the top' and less than 50 returned. In October 1917, he wrote home to his parents to tell them of his experiences.
