
At this time of collective challenge, kindness is everywhere, and we know that kind acts are contagious too. We want to collect your stories to create an Anthology of Kindness that records acts of human generosity and create more ripples of kindness.

Records from the archives show details from Merton Parish Distribution Ledger that document the giving of coal in winter. Also, South Wimbledon Holy Trinity letters detail the offering of assistance to those in need in the Winter of 1886 - 1887. Both the ledger and letter serve as records of people asking for help, as well as the help that was offered to them:









"Sir, At a vestry meeting held yesterday, I was ordered to inform you that a Gentleman had offered to give medical assistance to all our paupers both in and out of the Parish..."

Kindness Anthology




On a piece of paper share with us an act of kindness that you have witnessed or received at this time, no matter how small this act may seem.

Once you have written this down, why not create an image to go with your act of kindness. You may want to draw, paint, collage or colour.


Here are some examples:
